




Travel consultants are certified by the U.S. Travel Association and love helping visitors and sharing their information and knowledge of everything Arkansas.





WHAT'S NEW

IN THE NATURAL STATE



TRUMANN

The **St. Francis Sunken Lands Water Trail** outside Trumann is the newest of the Arkansas Game and Fish Commission's water trails. The "sunken lands" were created during the great New Madrid earthquake in 1811-1812, when the land around the St. Francis River dropped 6-8 feet over an area of about 30 miles and flooded. The adjacent wildlife management area provides habitat for waterfowl and other migratory birds. Beavers, otters, deer and raccoons travel and feed along the river, giving kayakers and canoeists a great opportunity for wildlife watching.





BENTONVILLE

The **Quiver Archery Range** is a 70-meter outdoor range with 20 archery lanes. Professional staff provide individual instruction. Archery lanes can be reserved by the hour, or annual memberships are available for individuals and families.

ROGERS

Rogers is now home to the world's largest Daisy BB gun with the installation of a 25-foot-tall Daisy BB Gun on the sidewalk outside of the **Daisy Airgun Museum**.

HISTORIC HELENA

Delta Dirt Distillery in Historic Helena officially opened its doors in April 2021. The family-owned craft distillery produces handmade and locally inspired vodka (and will eventually produce gin, whiskey and liqueurs). The distillery uses produce and grains grown on the four-generation family farm located in Phillips County. Delta Dirt Distillery plans to "Raise Spirits in the Delta" one bottle at a time. LITTLE ROCK

The Arkansas Museum of Fine Arts, formerly known as the Arkansas Arts Center, has undergone a transformation of the museum building and grounds. See page 20 for more details.

River Mountain Park stands out as being the first professionally built mountain bike trail within the Little Rock city park system. It has around 10 miles of trails that offer a range of terrain, including downhill sections, for various riding levels.

HOT SPRINGS

The Reserve at Hot Springs is a new boutique property in Hot Springs. This historic estate, located at 2330 Central Avenue, has been fully restored with 12 guest rooms and suites. Situated on four acres, The Reserve at Hot Springs features the W.C. Brown House, a former private mansion and now a national heritage landmark. Originally built in the Queen Anne style in 1890 and then later updated with Neoclassical architecture in 1919, the house is complemented by the surrounding Legacy House, Carriage House, Enclave Suite and adjoining conservatory, gardens and additional space for events.

THE ARTS IN



The Arkansas Museum of Fine Arts, formerly known as the Arkansas Arts Center, is slated for an exciting and much anticipated reopening in Little Rock. Work on the museum, which included both a redesign and expansion, began in 2016 and has completely transformed the museum building and grounds.



ARKANSAS

The interesting architecture of the museum, which is free to visit, includes an innovative roof of thin, folded concrete that spans the entire length of the building. The curving indoor space winds through the entire building and connects the museum's main spaces.

The state-of-the-art building, located at **501 East Ninth Street**, includes gallery space to house installations from the museum's 14,000-work collection as well as temporary exhibits. Also at the museum are the Windgate Art School, an on-site theater and lecture hall, outdoor gathering spaces, a restaurant with outdoor dining and more. In addition to outdoor gathering spaces, the museum has created a large elevated indoor space with comfortable chairs, tables, Wi-Fi and a cocktail bar.

The museum's original 1937 limestone façade has been positioned as a beautiful feature of the main north entrance to the building.

More than 11 acres of newly landscaped grounds surround the museum at historic **MacArthur Park**, including new walking trails. These new pathways invite visitors to explore the museum's connection to this historic landmark, which is Little Rock's oldest municipal park. ➡

CRYSTAL BRIDGES MUSEUM OF AMERICAN ART

Art and nature coexist at another art and architectural wonder in Arkansas: Crystal Bridges Museum of American Art in Bentonville. The permanent collection of art found here spans five centuries of American masterworks ranging from the Colonial era to the current day. The permanent collection can be seen year-round, and there are temporary exhibitions throughout the year.

The museum building itself is a work of art, and also of note are the beautiful grounds, which feature sculptures and 3.5 miles of walking trails that link the museum's 120-acre park to downtown Bentonville. Also onsite is a restaurant, museum store, library and a Frank Lloyd Wright house that has been preserved and relocated to the grounds. The museum is planning a major expansion that is slated to boost its size by 50 percent. Plans are to start the project in 2022 with completion by 2024.




ART IN THE OUTDOORS

You don't have to spend the day indoors to enjoy art. Little Rock, North Little Rock, Hot Springs and Fayetteville all have a strong outdoor art scene with many beautiful murals found throughout the cities. The city of Pine Bluff also has more than a dozen murals that depict the history of the city. In downtown Fort Smith, "**The Unexpected**" is an impressive mural project of more than 30 murals showcased on several buildings. For outdoor sculptures, visit the whimsical **Vogel Schwartz Sculpture Garden**, located in Riverfront Park in Little Rock. See sculptures in all shapes and forms, some big, some small, some fanciful and some with a deep message to convey.



THE BUFFALO RIVER:

50 YEARS AS A NATIONAL RIVER

Allowed to remain as Mother Nature intended, the Buffalo National River in northern Arkansas provides a beautiful space for hiking, horseback riding, canoeing, caving, fishing, wildlife watching and much more. **The Buffalo River was designated by Congress as America's first national river 50 years ago.**



Along the river, the National Park Service oversees more than 95,000 acres containing three designated wilderness areas. Tall limestone bluffs in earthy hues of gray, tan and brown are defining features of the Buffalo. Rushing whitewater is interspersed among sections of calmer water as the river winds its way 135 miles through the lush green valley that is home to elk, deer, black bear and other woodland creatures. It is a prime example of one of the last free-flowing streams of the Ozark region.

Over the years, millions of people have taken advantage of this landscape that is still free, wild and natural.

ROCK

To rock climbers, **Sam's Throne** is probably the most well-known chunk of rock in the Ozarks. Another hot spot for climbing in Buffalo River country is on private land owned by **Horseshoe Canyon Ranch**, where you can pay to climb. Plenty of rock in the area is suitable for bouldering.





WILDLIFE

An activity that's easy for the whole family to enjoy is wildlife watching, particularly of elk. A herd of about 600 roam the area. While not confined to the park, the herd is predominately found around the upper Buffalo. The large beasts prefer open areas for grazing with nearby wooded areas for resting. Drivers often stop their cars along roads in and around **Boxley Valley** to view elk in the fields. Morning and evening are the best times to see them. Elk education centers in Jasper and Ponca are great places to learn more.

WATER

While spring is usually the most popular floating season, sections of the river can be floated year-round. The upper Buffalo is best floated in the spring when its rapids are the most exciting. The middle section is great for canoeing in late spring and early summer, while the lower is great to float year-round. With the right gear, winter is a nice time to be on the river as well. Plenty of canoe and kayak outfitters service the river.

TRAILS

Mountain biking and hiking are very popular activities in this river park. More than 100 miles of maintained trails are open year-round. There are more than 75 miles of designated equestrian trails as well as horse camps. Some trails offer views from the top of the limestone bluffs. Other treks snake through the woods past remnants of old homesteads and down old logging roads. ➡

FISH

Anglers will find a wild fish population of more than 60 species, including smallmouth bass, largemouth bass, Ozark bass and goggle-eye.


LODGING

Overnighting along the Buffalo can be unrolling a sleeping bag on a primitive backpacking adventure, pitching a tent at a National Park Service campground or staying in rustic housekeeping cabins constructed in the late 1930s by the Civilian Conservation Corps at **Buffalo Point**. Cabins and resorts just outside the park are popular with visitors as well.

HISTORY

Full of scenic beauty, the Buffalo retains cultural and natural history also. Historic areas such as the **Boxley Valley Historic District**, the **Parker Hickman Homestead** and the **Villines Cabin** can be explored. The Buffalo National River preserves many pioneer homesteads ranging from the 1840s to the 1930s. The ghost town of **Rush** is preserved and interpreted with exhibit panels.

DARK SKY DESIGNATION

The darkest skies in The Natural State can be found at one of Arkansas's greatest natural treasures. The Buffalo National River is now an International Dark Sky Park, a designation made by the non-profit International Dark-Sky Association.

The Association is the recognized authority for night sky protection and works with governments, communities and city planners to help reduce impacts to natural night skies where possible. The park's work to promote the protection of the Buffalo National River's natural nighttime environment as a resource to be enjoyed by visitors is what inspired the designation.

The Buffalo National River is the 26th National Park Service site to receive this designation and the first in Arkansas. 

CELEBRATING 50 YEARS

The Buffalo River was the first in the U.S. to be given a designation as a national river. This interesting piece of real estate was embroiled in a huge controversy between being dammed and being preserved as a free-flowing stream for several decades, beginning in the late 1930s. On March 1, 1972, the national river designation was finally approved by President Nixon.

Anyone who has gazed upon Big Bluff, seen the reflection of Skull Rock on a fall day, hiked the trail to Indian Rockhouse, visited Collier Homestead near Tyler Bend, guided a canoe down the river's many miles, stuck their toes or a fishing line in the water, or had a myriad of other experiences knows the Buffalo River is definitely worthy of the national designation.

Park staff have created several events throughout 2022 to celebrate the 50th year of this national park.





FALLS WORTH FINDING



What is it about waterfalls that pulls people in?

Perhaps it's the wild sounds. The roar, splash and splatter of water rushing over ledges and between rocks. Perhaps too it's the location these wonders are found – on scenic rivers, in box canyons, along trails through forests of thick canopies and rock outcroppings. Because it requires surrounding one's self in nature and provides a sense of adventure, hiking to waterfalls is a popular activity in Arkansas.

RICHLAND CREEK WILDERNESS

One of the best places to find these flowing beauties is the Richland Creek Wilderness Area. Created by the 1984 Arkansas Wilderness Act, it contains 11,822 acres in the middle of the Ozark Mountains. The narrow valleys in the wilderness are bordered by a combination of steep-sided slopes and vertical sandstone and limestone bluffs more than 100 feet high. Located within Ozark-St. Francis National Forest, the wilderness is managed by the U.S. Forest Service and is known for its crystal-clear creeks and waterfalls.

RICHLAND WATERFALLS WELCOME CENTER


More than 30 waterfalls have been catalogued in the Richland Creek watershed. The tallest one is Terry Keefe Falls at about 78 feet high. Six Finger Falls is not high at all, but very impressive. You can find a map of them all, along with restrooms, at the Richland Waterfalls Welcome Center.

The center also has coffee, free Wi-Fi and tables and chairs if you want to rest or take some time to read brochure material and plan a hike. There's a video to watch, a giant wall map, photos, a push pin map to show where you are from and a visitor log book.

While the welcome center is unstaffed, the building serves as the community center for Witts Springs, and locals are in and out of this public building.

The center is open from 8 a.m. until 7 p.m., seven days a week. It's free to enter and use the facilities. Overnight stays are available at a suggested donation of \$15.

SUGGESTED WATERFALL HIKE

From the Richland Waterfalls Welcome Center, take a left onto AR 377 and within about a mile turn right onto Richland Creek Road. Take this road all the way to the bottom to its intersection with Falling Water Road.

Take a left and follow the road over the concrete slab bridge to cross the creek. Parking is possible on the right or left immediately after crossing the creek. A trailhead on the right leads to Horse Tail Falls, Intersection Falls, Six Fingers Falls and Box Canyon Falls (a.k.a. Fuzzy Butt Falls). The hike to Box Canyon is only about a mile. Numerous other falls can be found farther along the trail.

Take a right and find a wide spot to park your car. Walk north along the road past Six Finger Falls, where kayakers sometimes play. Just past Six Finger Falls is a trail to Terry Keefe Falls. It's about a 0.6-mile hike. Back at your car, continue north to drive through the scenic area, reaching Stack Rock, the Stack Rock Homestead, and eventually Richland Valley, the Buffalo National River and the town of Snowball.

RICHLAND CREEK RECREATION AREA


Here you'll find a small picturesque mountain stream with waterfalls, rocks and bluffs and access to the Richland Creek Wilderness Area. It contains 11 family camping units. Because of very rough roads, visitors are not encouraged to take camping trailers to Richland Creek.


If you don't want to camp, numerous cabins for rent can be found in the area.

IF YOU GO

Some things of note when traveling to this wilderness area:

- **Waterfalls are best viewed after ample rainfall.**
- **There are no official trails to any of the waterfalls. There are some existing unofficial trails, and hikers are advised to stay on them.**
- **Please practice "Leave No Trace."**
- **There is poor-to-nonexistent cell phone coverage throughout the area.**

LITTLE MISSOURI FALLS near Mena

From Hot Springs, go west on **U.S. 70** to Glenwood, then onto Salem. At Salem, turn right (west) on **Arkansas 84** to Langley. At Langley, head north on **Arkansas 369** where you'll find signs directing you to the falls.

2

COSSATOT RIVER STATE PARK - NATURAL AREA Umpire

The park extends from the Ouachita National Forest, near the **Arkansas 246** bridge on the north, to the Corps of Engineers property on Gillham Lake, south of **Arkansas 4**.

The falls can be reached via **Weyerhaeuser Road #52200** which runs between **Highways 4 and 246** on the east side of the river. From **Road 52200**, turn west on **52600** which leads to Cossatot Falls.

From **I-30** (Exit 97) near Malvern, go north 12 miles on **Highway 171**, which dead ends at Lake Catherine State Park. Follow signs to the Falls Branch Trail. The waterfall is located approximately 1/4 mile from the trailhead.

DINING ON THE LAKE



Packed coolers or houseboat fridges holding snacks and meals are part of the summertime fun of boating on a lake. But vacation eating adventures come in the form of restaurants on the water too. Arkansas lakes offer plenty of lakeside eateries. When you're running low on supplies, need a treat or just want to experience something new, there are many dining adventures you can have by boat in The Natural State.

LAKE OUACHITA

This lake is the largest in the state and features prime fishing and beautiful scenery. The lake is surrounded by the scenic Ouachita National Forest, and there are privately owned resorts, a state park and Corps of Engineers campgrounds on the lake's shores. If you want to grab a bite while enjoying these waters, you have many options, including **Mountain Harbor Lodge Restaurant at Mountain Harbor Resort & Spa**. The restaurant is open for breakfast, lunch and dinner and has a large range of options on the menu. There is also a floating Subway at the marina that is open seasonally.

LAKE CATHERINE

Lake Catherine is home to **Lake Catherine State Park**, which has the only full-service marina on the small lake. In the summer months, it is open for items such as snacks, drinks and fuel.

LAKE HAMILTON

This lake is a popular residential lake for fishing, boating and many water sports. On the lake's shores are attractions like **Garvan Woodland Gardens**, which you can get to via land or boat. Lake Hamilton is lined with condos, resorts, homes and many restaurants. Among them is **Bubba Brew's** on Lake Hamilton, a local brewery and grill that has an outdoor deck. ➔





LAKE GREESON

Lake Greeson is a beautiful lake that has a wealth of camping areas around its lakeshore, including at **Daisy State Park**. **Self Creek Lodge & Marina** has a spot to relax and enjoy a pizza or snacks from the snack bar. There are tables on the deck and also an indoor sitting area. **Swaha Lodge & Marina** is home to the **Dam Grill**, which is open seasonally with lakeside dining from Memorial Day to Labor Day.

DEGRAY LAKE

DeGray Lake is popular for fishing, kayaking, boating, camping and water sports. Arkansas's only resort state park, **DeGray Lake Resort State Park**, is here, and you can enjoy a bite to eat at the park's lodge restaurant, the **Shoreline Restaurant**. This restaurant serves breakfast, lunch and dinner and has a variety of dishes for all tastes. Snacks can also be found on the lake at a full-service marina at **Iron Mountain Lodge & Marina**.



BULL SHOALS LAKE

Bush's Pizza in Bull Shoals isn't on the water. But, all you have to do is call in an order and they will bring it to your boat. They deliver to all docks and ramps in Bull Shoals, Lakeview and Fairview, including private docks. In addition to their signature crust, they offer a cauliflower crust that's gluten free. The hot subs are the talk of the town, and they also serve calzones, wings and salads.

LAKE NORFORK

Did someone say milkshake? **Jordan Marina** offers pizza, wings and milkshakes. Call in your pizza order while you're out on the water, and they'll have it hot from the oven for you when you hit the dock. They have tables and chairs for guests to use while enjoying the food.

BEAVER LAKE

Located on the north shore of Beaver Lake, **Ventris Trail's End Resort** in Garfield is a great place to stay. It's also a great place to visit by boat when you're hungry. Just tie up to its small dock and walk through the wooded path for sandwiches, salads, burgers, chili dogs, pizzas and plenty of summertime desserts.

THE HUNT FOR ADVENTURE



FISHING

When it comes to fishing in Arkansas, “The Land of Opportunity,” a former state motto, remains an apt description. The state’s more than 600,000 acres of lakes and 90,000 miles of rivers and streams offer anglers numerous chances to land a trophy or catch a limit from a variety of freshwater species.

To augment those opportunities in what is now touted as “The Natural State,” nature gets a helping hand at keeping Arkansas’s waters full of fish. The Arkansas Game and Fish Commission operates one of the largest state-owned, warm-water hatchery systems in the world. In addition, three trout hatcheries are also located within the state.

TROUT

Today, more than 1.5 million trout are stocked annually in Arkansas’s waters. Arkansas’s trout streams and lakes are all located among the **Ozark** and **Ouachita mountains**, which offer four seasons of natural beauty to complement the attraction of the state’s trout species. Stream-side resorts and fishing guide services are common along the **White**, the **North Fork** and the **Little Red**.

While Arkansas’s trout fisheries grab most of the headlines, the state offers a wide range of fishing opportunities, both in species and environmental settings.

HUNTING IN ARKANSAS

The Natural State has opportunities for hunting small and large game in diverse habitats that include the **Delta** in eastern Arkansas and the **Ozark** and **Ouachita mountains** in northern and western Arkansas.

The hunting season kicks off with dove season, followed by archery deer season and then muzzleloading. Most popular is modern gun season on deer, which starts in November. Duck season starts right after that, and it's pretty much full-bore hunting season until February.

Arkansas also has hunting seasons for elk, alligator and bear. Arkansas once was known as The Bear State.

The variety of hunting is what differentiates Arkansas from other states. While some areas of the United States are known for a certain type of hunting, the beauty of Arkansas is that it pretty much has it all. Plus, it's the duck capital of the world. The state is blessed with a good deer population, estimated at about one million. It has a very liberal bag limit – for example, six deer in some zones.

A handful of animals are open season all year long, but most game is only available to hunt in very specific and regulated seasons. Some seasons even vary by zone, so hunters should always review regulations before planning their hunts.

Arkansas has a lot of public hunting land, national forest, wildlife management areas and federal wildlife refuges that provide some very good hunting opportunities. ➔

RIVERS & LAKES

Among Arkansas's big-lake fishing, **Greers Ferry Lake** near **Heber Springs** ranks high. Corps of Engineers dams on the **White, Ouachita, Little Missouri, Caddo and Cossatot rivers** have produced almost a dozen large lakes. One of Arkansas's most popular fishing lakes is the state's largest, the 48,300-acre **Lake Ouachita**.

Millwood Lake, a 29,500-acre reservoir located in southwest Arkansas, has produced many trophy largemouth bass. **Beaver, DeGray** and **Greeson** are other sizable reservoirs where the fishing action draws anglers by the score.

Bass, crappie, bream, walleye and catfish are the main species sought in most of the lakes.

Big-river fishing is available on both the **Arkansas River**, which traverses the state from west to east, creating 50-mile-long **Lake Dardanelle** in the process, and on the **Mississippi River**, which forms the state's eastern border. Both rivers and their backwater areas offer excellent angling for a variety of bass and catfish species as well as crappie.

Tournament fishing is popular on **Beaver Lake, Lake Dardanelle** and the **Arkansas River**. The **Mississippi** is known for its catfish.

LICENSING AND REGULATIONS

The Arkansas Game and Fish Commission (AGFC) prints hard copies of regulation guidebooks that can be picked up at regional AGFC offices and nature centers, as well as some sporting goods stores and outdoor outfitters. **Regulations are also available online at agfc.com.**

Hunters should pick up a guidebook for details on general hunting rules, season dates, tag limits, licenses and where to hunt.

Anglers should check to see what regulations apply to the area they are going to fish since regulations differ across the state regarding size limits and harvest limits for different species. Tackle restrictions also limit anglers to certain types of tackle in certain areas. Throughout the state, there are trout waters with special regulations, such as catch-and-release areas, where anglers are restricted to using artificial tackle with barbless hooking points only (no bait allowed).

MORE THAN FISHING

Anglers know well that going fishing is frequently about more than the fish.

It can be just as much about watching an osprey plunge feet first into the water and soar away with its prey, experiencing a fiery sunset framed by Delta cypress trees, floating on the clear waters of an Ozark Mountain stream beneath a towering, lichen-covered limestone bluff, or enjoying the turning leaves of autumn reflected in the still waters of a quiet cove.





In Southwest Arkansas, a great option is **Hot Springs Treehouses**. They offer seven different treehouses, with several featuring reclaimed wood, antique furniture and salvaged tin as part of the exterior.

Near **Pocahontas, Shady River Getaway** offers guests a relaxing retreat along the scenic Eleven Point River, offering peace and quiet with as much, or as little, activity as you want. More than three miles of mountain and meadow trails are great for walking, and most are suitable for the electric cart that is supplied with each cottage. The Firefly cottage, also known as the “treehouse,” offers relaxation among the oak trees. Watch wildlife from the decks overlooking native habitat. Dine and relax below in the comfortable living/dining/kitchen area. Firefly comes complete with a full kitchen, full bath and gas grill. It has a large soaking tub hidden away in a private nook off the deck.

In **Eureka Springs** is **Treehouse Cottages**, offering seven choices of luxury lodging, including wood-burning fireplaces, Jacuzzi tubs, fully equipped kitchens, satellite television with DVD player and private decks. Three are located within the charming burg, and the other four are within a mile or so of downtown. 




MORE PATHS TO RIDE AND RELAX



While Coler Mountain Bike Preserve in Bentonville is a mountain biker's paradise, anyone who enjoys a stroll in the great outdoors will love it. If you also like camping, coffee and outdoor beer gardens, you're really in for a treat.

Coler Mountain Bike Preserve is a bike park and trail system offering more than 17 miles for every skill level. Just a five-minute bike ride from downtown Bentonville, this recreation outlet also connects to more than 250 miles of natural-surface trails in Northwest Arkansas.

For mountain biking, this unique urban escape is divided into two main areas. Westside is best for beginner and intermediate riders, and Eastside is designed for more advanced or expert bikers. The preserve has flow, cross-country, rock, dual slalom and flyover trails with stone, wood, metal and jump features. The crowning jewel of the preserve is **The Peak One Hub**, which sends riders down one of three trails from the single hub location. Riders choose a trail based on its level of difficulty.

If you don't ride, don't worry. Coler still has much to offer.

Its camping facility has extra special amenities and a whole lot of curb appeal.

It offers 22 campsites – eight small tent platforms, eight large tent platforms, five Class B camper van parking pads and one ADA-accessible site with adjacent parking. Wooden platforms offer dry setups for tents. Eight hammock stands are dispersed throughout the campground. Adding to the fun is a community fire pit that is stocked with wood at 4 p.m. every evening.

Secure restrooms and hot showers with camper-only access are housed in modern structures that blend in with the surroundings. Plus, there's a camper-only parking lot inside a secured gate. The campground also has a bike wash and repair station and a water bottle refill station.

While the campsites are primitive in that there is no water, sewer, electrical hook-ups or Wi-Fi service, the modern bathhouse coupled with a nearby micro-cafe hardly make folks feel like they're roughing it. In fact, this is where the experience becomes idyllic. ➡





A short walk away is **Airship at The Homestead**, a micro-cafe and beverage bar in a spectacular modern building. This coffee purveyor sells amazing locally roasted coffees, tea, delicious kombucha and craft beer. Airship's small food menu includes pastries, tacos, barbecue nachos and vegan options. It has several seating options – a beer garden, rooftop bar and covered, open seating that includes rope swings and a view.

Airship is only accessible by paved trail. Two parking lots are located slightly less than a mile from the cafe, which is wheelchair accessible. **It's open from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. every day.**

Note that in the campground, the only cooking permitted is with portable, propane gas grills; no charcoal or wood burning grills are allowed. And, pets are not allowed due to the proximity of the campsites and for camper and mountain biker safety.

Park at either the Coler Mountain Bike Preserve South Gateway on NW 3rd Street or at the Coler Creek Park North Gateway on Peach Orchard Road. (Enter either name into Google Maps.)

BIKING SHUTTLE SERVICES IN ARKANSAS

Both locals and out-of-towners can benefit from taking a shuttle to mountain biking trails. Parking at some of Arkansas's most popular trailheads can be crowded. Shuttle services take the hassle out of the logistics of loading bikes, transporting them and finding a place to park. That's especially helpful to visitors who don't know the area well.

Some services pick you up at your home or hotel. Others will help transport you between trail systems or pick you up at the bottom of a downhill and take you back to the top so you can do it all over again. Shuttles with trail guide service are available as well.

All of these shuttle options are a great way to maximize your riding time and your experience on the trails. Most can be booked online.

Various bike shops offer bike rentals and shuttles as well.






Cradled by the majesty of the Ozarks and Ouachitas, **FORT SMITH** hugs the banks of the mighty Arkansas River at the state's northwestern edge. It is a city surrounded by nature, with a rich legacy as the gateway to the American West and modern reputation as a destination with incredible public art. Start your adventure by touring **Miss Laura's** – the first former bordello on the National Register of Historic Places – before reliving a history that inspired the iconic tale of *True Grit* at **Fort Smith National Historic Site**. Next, enjoy a birds-eye view of downtown's world-renowned outdoor art from the seat of a 1935 World's Fair Ferris Wheel at **Park at West End**, be among the first to visit the **U.S. Marshals Museum**, explore the majesty of the Ozarks aboard the **A & M Passenger Train**, or hit a jackpot at **Cherokee and Choctaw Casinos**. Across town, **Parrot Island Waterpark** offers waves of summer fun, the **River Valley Nature Center** is open year-round, and Elvis fans can visit **Chaffee Barbershop** where he got his famous Army buzz cut. Plus, an abundance of nearby trails, scenic routes, rivers, and more supply endless outdoor adventures!



GOLDEN ANNIVERSARY FOR

CRATER OF DIAMONDS STATE PARK




Crater of Diamonds State Park is celebrating its 50th anniversary this year as Arkansas's 27th state park.

This landmark destination in Murfreesboro is well-known for the steady number of diamonds that are found by visitors to the park. When a big one is found, it usually makes national and international news.

This state park is the only diamond mine in the United States where the public can search for real diamonds in their original volcanic source. On top of this, visitors can keep any rock, mineral or diamond they find while digging the park's expansive 37-acre plowed field.

At Crater, you can learn about the fascinating geology of the park, which encompasses an eroded diamond-bearing volcanic pipe. You can also learn about the history and stories tied to the discovery of diamonds in the area. Numerous displays around the park help tell this tale, starting with John Wesley Huddleston, who first discovered diamonds in the area on his 160-acre farm in 1906. His neighbor, Millard Mauney, also owned several diamond-bearing acres to the north of Huddleston's property. ➡





History abounds in and around the town of **Murfreesboro**. You can still see the two-story log cabin structure that Mauney called home as you drive towards Crater of Diamonds State Park. Another historical marker on the south central bounds of the diamond field marks the spot where Huddleston found the first diamonds that would change the area forevermore.

Along with diamonds, there are other rocks and minerals found onsite including quartz, jasper, mica and more. The park also has trails you can hike, including the 1.2-mile **Prospector Trail** and the 1.2-mile **Little Missouri River Trail**, half of which is paved and is known as the longest wheelchair-accessible trail in Southwest Arkansas. The park also has camping and RV options, a seasonal water park, interpretive programs, an informative visitor center and more.



While at the park, you can also learn about the people who have found landmark diamonds there. Shirley Strawn, who is from Murfreesboro, found the famous Strawn-Wagner diamond there in 1990. It was later cut and went on to receive a perfect grade rating of “Triple Zero,” the highest rating a diamond can achieve. Other famous finds include the Amarillo Starlight, a 16.37-carat white gem found in 1975 that still holds reign as the biggest diamond found by a park visitor since Crater of Diamonds became a state park. The grounds also still hold title to another legendary find: the largest diamond ever unearthed in the U.S., the 40.23-carat Uncle Sam, found here in the early 1920s. On average, park staff register around one to two diamond finds a day. **Crater of Diamonds State Park is located at 209 State Park Road.**

VISIT MURFREESBORO

After the family has gotten their fill of prospecting, you can head downtown to **Murfreesboro’s Courthouse Square** to shop and grab a bite to eat at spots like the **Hawkins Variety Store**, an old-fashioned store located in a historic structure built in 1909. This variety store has been in business since the early 1940s and is a nice family stop for sandwiches, coffees, ice cream and more.

The **Pike County Courthouse**, which is on the National Register of Historic Places and built in an Art Deco style, can also be seen downtown.

Boating, fishing and camping are also popular at nearby **Lake Greeson**. The lake is around 12 miles long and is known for fishing, boating, scuba diving and water sports, so it can be a destination in itself. Recreation areas are located around the lake.



WINTER

TOLTEC MOUNDS ARCHEOLOGICAL STATE PARK

Arkansas's state parks are a great place to learn about the interesting history and culture of Arkansas. Taking in this history can be done year-round including in winter. Among the many options is Toltec Mounds Archeological State Park near Scott, which makes an intriguing stop to learn about Native American culture and the largest earthen mound complex in the state. This site was used as a ceremonial center for around 400 years from 650 AD to 1050 AD. A focal point of this site, and the most noticeable, are the mounds. One is 49 feet tall, which holds the title as the tallest mound in Arkansas. The mounds are located at precise measurements from each other. In this way, they were used as an earthen calendar since the changing position of the sun on the horizon could be marked by the mounds. This was useful for keeping track of planting and ceremonial schedules. Every year, the park holds solstice and equinox celebrations where you can experience these special events on the park grounds.

SPRING

MILLWOOD STATE PARK

Arkansas is known for its prime fishing and bird watching year-round, but spring brings great migration patterns for birds and a lively spawning season for many species of fish. Many state parks in Arkansas, like Millwood State Park, offer wonderful facilities to capitalize on these activities in the spring season. Millwood State Park is nestled on the southwest shore of Millwood Lake, which is located near the small community of Ashdown. Much of the 29,260-acre lake consists of submerged timber and marshes, creating wonderful fish habitats for large-mouth bass, crappie and flathead catfish. Millwood Lake is known nationwide as a premier fishing destination, and the lake is home to numerous fishing tournaments throughout the year. During the spring months, Millwood is home to some of the best crappie fishing in Arkansas. Millwood Lake and the surrounding area are recognized by the Audubon Society as an important bird area, making it a premier bird-watching destination during the spring and fall migration patterns. ➡





SUMMER

LAKE CHICOT STATE PARK

Many of Arkansas's state parks are located near or on lakes, including Lake Chicot State Park in Lake Village. Lakes are a perfect summer solution, and the largest oxbow lake in North America can be found at this state park. This park offers especially great year-round birding opportunities due to its location in the Mississippi Flyway. The Great River Road All-American Road travels some of the lake's shoreline. Also available in the park are lake and levee tours, a marina with boat rentals, a seasonal swimming pool and more.



FALL

MOUNT NEBO STATE PARK

Many state parks offer epic views, world-class biking and hiking terrain, beautiful cabins to stay in and more. These are great to enjoy year-round, including fall. Among the spots to do so is Mount Nebo State Park near Dardanelle. This state park can be found atop 1,350-foot Mount Nebo. The 1930s-era Civilian Conservation Corps built many of the rustic-style cabins you can stay in while here. Mount Nebo State Park has 14 miles of hiking trails and is home to 25 miles of the Monument Trail system, which has plenty of mountain biking and hiking terrain to take on. The drive up Highway 155 is a beautiful venture, but please note that campers or RVs longer than 24 feet are not recommended.



OUR ENDURING HISTORY

PRESERVING AND LEARNING FROM OUR HERITAGE



History is more than words in a book. You can explore the history of Arkansas and its impact on the world at historic sites and attractions across the state. You'll find sites dedicated to Arkansas's role in the country's enduring vow for freedom for all citizens, as well as sites showcasing the state's involvement in world history.

The African American struggle for equality is detailed at museums and historically significant sites throughout the state. **Freedom Park** in **Helena-West Helena** is situated on the location of a former contraband camp. The park is dedicated to interpreting the African American experience before, during and after the Civil War. It features life-sized figures and sculptures, as well as structures representing a plantation house and a refugee dwelling. Freedom Park is the first location in Arkansas designated as a National Underground Railroad Network to Freedom site.

The **Mosaic Templars Cultural Center** in **Little Rock** is dedicated to preserving, interpreting and celebrating African American history and culture in Arkansas. The museum features permanent and traveling exhibits highlighting fraternal organizations, African American entrepreneurs and integration.

Making national headlines, the “Little Rock Nine” entered Central High School with a military escort ordered by President Dwight Eisenhower. The **Little Rock Central High School National Historic Site** tells the story of the 1957 desegregation crisis and how nine brave students paved the way for those in search of equality and education around the world.

The **Southern Tenant Farmers Museum** in **Tyronza** offers visitors the opportunity to explore the history of the Southern Tenant Farmers Union, a group formed in 1934 that was fully integrated and also included women in important roles. The museum exhibits focus on the story of tenant farming and sharecropping and the movement to remove abuses from the widely used system. The museum is located in the building that housed H.L. Mitchell's dry cleaners and the service station owned by Clay East, two of the original organizers of the Union.

The **MacArthur Museum of Arkansas Military History**, housed in the arsenal where General Douglas MacArthur was born, interprets the state's rich military heritage. The museum preserves the contributions of Arkansas men and women who served in the armed forces. Exhibits feature artifacts, photographs, weapons, documents, uniforms and other military items that vividly portray Arkansas's military history at home and abroad.

Learn more about Arkansas's aviation history at the **Arkansas Air & Military Museum** in **Fayetteville**. With exhibits ranging from the golden age of aviation to the jet age, including Vietnam-era Army helicopters and a Navy carrier fighter, the AAMM is housed in an all-wood hanger that was once an aviator training post during World War II.

The **Wings of Honor Museum** in **Walnut Ridge** interprets the rich history of the WWII Walnut Ridge Army Airfield and traces the history of the Walnut Ridge Army Flying School, one of seven in Arkansas during World War II. ➡

Little Rock, Arkansas's capital city, is home to a variety of museums documenting the history of the state and the life of one of Arkansas's native sons. **Historic Arkansas Museum** offers visitors a glimpse into life during the Territorial period through living history tours and a variety of restored 19th century homes and buildings. The **Old State House Museum**, located in the oldest surviving state capitol west of the Mississippi River, features a variety of permanent and temporary exhibits depicting Arkansas's history as a state. The **William Jefferson Clinton Presidential Center and Park** offers visitors a glance into the life and presidency of one of Arkansas's most famous sons.

The Pfeiffer home and adjacent Hemingway barn studio have been restored and furnished as they were during the Hemingways' visits.



COCKTAIL CULTURE IN ARKANSAS



To say that the distillery industry in The Natural State has taken off is a bit of an understatement. In addition to a bustling craft beer scene, Arkansas is now home to some of the most unique small-batch distilled creations in the country. One of those is the **Delta Dirt Distillery**.

The Williams family knows sweet potatoes. Now, they also know sweet potato vodka. Harvey and Donna Williams, co-founders of Delta Dirt in Historic Helena, are turning a multi-generation family farm into a source for some of the more novel spirits being produced in the region today.

The 86-acre farm, still managed by Harvey's brother and father, supplies the sweet potatoes. Their son, master distiller Thomas Williams, provides the innovation. Thomas went to school to learn the craft and now uses that knowledge day in and day out as he brews up Delta Dirt's signature vodka and works toward unveiling their own gin and bourbon soon.

Small towns can be found across **The Natural State**, and each offers a glimpse into the diverse landscapes and cultures that make up Arkansas.

PARIS, ARKANSAS

The town of **Paris** is set at the base of **Mount Magazine** in the northwest part of the state in Logan County. Paris is probably best known as being the gateway to Mount Magazine, which at 2,753 feet is the highest point in Arkansas and also home to Mount Magazine State Park. While it alone is a wonderful place for recreation, there are numerous other sites to explore while in town.

The historic downtown has plenty to see including antique shops, restaurants, boutiques, many buildings on the National Register of Historic Places and even a 25-foot **Eiffel Tower**.

Subiaco Abbey is located five miles east of Paris on AR 2. The monks of Subiaco Abbey are Benedictines and trace their monastic history back to fifth century Italy. There is a Romanesque-style Abbey Church on site, and handmade peanut brittle and “monk” hot sauce are available for purchase. There is also a craft brewery, **Country Monks Brewing**, on the grounds that is open on Saturdays.





WILSON, ARKANSAS

The Arkansas section of the **Great River Road**, which is part of a National Scenic Byway that runs 3,000 miles from Minnesota to Louisiana, has been designated an "All-American Road" by the Federal Highway Administration. Located on U.S. Highway 61, which is part of this scenic byway, you'll find the town of **Wilson**.

While here, be sure to stop by the **Wilson Café**, where you can enjoy the café's Southern menu, including local produce from the nearby **Wilson Gardens**.

Shopping can also be found at stores located around the quaint, Tudor-inspired town square. Among them is **White's Mercantile**, which is owned by the granddaughter of the legendary performer Hank Williams.

Across the square from the Wilson Café is **Hampson Archeological Museum State Park**. The park has a nationally renowned archeological collection from a Mississippian-era village known as the Upper Nodena Site, a 15-acre palisaded village once located along the Mississippi River in Arkansas from around 1400 to 1650. ➔

NASHVILLE, ARKANSAS

Nashville is a small town in Howard County in Southwest Arkansas. The town stands out for many reasons, including its history. One of the largest dinosaur trackways in the world was discovered a few miles from town. The town was also once a major center for peach trade in the state. Arkansas native and Dillard's founder William Thomas Dillard also opened up the first Dillard's store in town in the 1930s.

The history of the town and county is preserved in many local museums including the 1912 **E.A. Williams Chapel and Museum**. This beautiful museum is located in the historic 1912 Presbyterian Church. The building is on the National Register of Historic Places and stands out for its Victorian Gothic architecture.

If you are on the lookout for more history, you can head to the **Old City Hall**, the **Old Fire Station** and the **Continental Trailways Bus Station**. All are connected to each other in what is known as the Lyons Center Complex and all are under the reins of the Howard County Historical Society. **The museums, which are all free to tour, are open Mon.-Thurs. from 9 a.m.-2 p.m.**, though it is best to always call ahead before making a trip since the staff is volunteer and hours can change. The contact number for the Howard County Historical Society is **870-451-4288**.

Also in town is **Nashville City Park**, which has 128 acres of fun to explore including walking trails and more. Attractions such as Crater of Diamonds State Park in Murfreesboro, Historic Washington State Park in Washington and the President William Jefferson Clinton Birthplace Home National Historic Site in Hope are also within driving distance of town.

EXPERIENCE THE ARKANSAS DELTA ALONG THE GREAT RIVER ROAD



These roads are considered the very best of America's National Scenic Byways. Created in 1938, the Great River Road All-American Road runs 3,000 miles from Minnesota to Louisiana and is the longest such designated roadway and one of the oldest.

The Arkansas section of the Great River Road features a wealth of historic sites, museums and attractions along the route. Visitors to Arkansas's first All-American Road can explore the history and culture of the Arkansas Delta and the entire state itself. From the Native Americans who called the area home to the musical legends who were born or raised in the region, travelers can visit sites to learn more about the mighty river and the lives of those who lived along its shores. 

Along Arkansas's eastern border is one of the state's three national scenic byways, the Great River Road.


In February 2021, the nearly 400-mile route received the Federal Highway Administration's highest designation of All-American Road.

To receive the All-American Road designation, a byway must possess multiple intrinsic qualities that are nationally significant and have one-of-a-kind features that do not exist elsewhere. The road or highway must also be considered a "destination unto itself." That is, the road must provide an exceptional traveling experience that makes a drive along it the primary reason for a trip.




AREA OF TOTAL ECLIPSE

Here's an interesting fact. There are at least two solar eclipses per year somewhere on the Earth, according to Encyclopedia Britannica. **On April 8, 2024, Arkansas gets its chance for full darkness during the Great North American Eclipse.** Back in 2017, many Americans "rediscovered" eclipses, and scores traveled the country to experience one of nature's amazing spectacles.

But be prepared — it's only going to get better! Arkansas is set to have nearly two-thirds of the state in the path of totality. The path will be nearly double in size and the time of darkness nearly twice as long as the 2017 event.

Make plans for your visit to Arkansas as early as possible. Many hotels and lodging properties aren't equipped to take reservations more than a year in advance, but call to see if individual properties have an "eclipse list."

Decide where you want to experience the once-in-a-lifetime event. The path runs diagonally in The Natural State, beginning in the southwest section near Texarkana and ending in the state's northeast corner.





ACCESSIBLE ARKANSAS

Adventures in Arkansas come in all forms for all people. Those with accessibility needs have plenty of options for exploring The Natural State. From hiking trails to one of the best caverns in the United States, you'll find a variety of attractions and sites that are accessible.


Blanchard Springs Caverns, considered to be one of the best "living caves" in the country, has the Dripstone Trail that is wheelchair accessible, provided the individual has some assistance. The half-mile-long trail takes visitors through two enormous rooms featuring glistening formations, stalactites, stalagmites and flowstones. Nearby is the Blanchard Spring Trail, a 0.2-mile trail that features a waterfall and is good for all skill levels. Stroll on the paved trail to where Blanchard Springs gushes as a waterfall from the hillside.

In **Hot Springs National Park**, you'll find the Grand Promenade. Named a National Recreation Trail, the promenade is 1/3-mile long and runs alongside Bathhouse Row. The brick-paved trail features benches, native and ornamental plants, game tables, wildlife and the famous springs that gave the town its name and made it famous. The promenade provides wheelchair accessibility via ramps at its south and north ends.


Near Greers Ferry Lake, the **Buckeye Nature Trail** is a National Recreation Trail that features a 660-foot, smooth-surface path accessible to wheelchairs. Located downstream from the Greers Ferry Dam, the **Mossy Bluff Trail** meanders along a bluff overlooking the Little Red River and provides picnic tables and two vista points for hikers.

The Upland Trail, located at the Dale Bumpers White River National Wildlife Refuge in St. Charles, is a 1-mile, paved loop trail. The refuge, designated as a Wetland of International Importance, is one of the most important areas for wintering waterfowl in North America, as well as the home to the only population of native black bear in The Natural State.

Many of the 52 **Arkansas State Parks** feature accessible hiking trails as well as barrier-free fishing piers. Cabins and lodges located at the parks also offer accessible options. Located at Petit Jean State Park near Morrilton, Cedar Falls Overlook is a vantage point high above 95-foot Cedar Falls, one of the most photographed waterfalls in Arkansas. A barrier-free walkway with wayside exhibits leads down to the stunning overlook.

① UPPER DELTA

The Upper Arkansas Delta is bordered by the Mississippi River. It was once home to American icons Ernest Hemingway and Johnny Cash and still packs plenty of culture. Sports enthusiasts will enjoy golf courses, river fishing, gaming and greyhound racing. Craighead Forest Park offers outdoor recreation, and Jonesboro has dining and shopping galore.

② LOWER DELTA

Incredible blues music and awesome oxbow lakes are just the beginning of the Lower Delta. The area is rich in culture with artists of all types energizing the population and museums that perpetuate our storied history. Sportsmen will appreciate Arkansas's celebrated duck hunting scene. Outdoor enthusiasts can also spot waterfowl and other wildlife at the Delta Rivers Nature Center.

③ CENTRAL
