





Harry S. Truman Presidential Library & Museum, Independence

Following an extensive \$29 million renovation, the museum's expanded galleries and interactive exhibits chronicle the life and work of our nation's 33rd president. Gain a better understanding of Truman's famous motto, "the buck stops here," from the challenges he faced during World War II to his contributions to the civil rights movement.

St. Louis Kaplan Feldman Holocaust Museum

A \$21 million renovation will more than triple the size of the museum. Through heart-wrenching photography, personal belongings and stories shared by survivors, visitors will be able to explore the causes of the Holocaust and its tragic impact. The museum's goal remains the same: to "empower visitors to make the world a more tolerant place by rejecting all forms of hate, racism and bigotry." Opens summer 2022.

The Rabbit hOle, Kansas City

Step into a world of make-believe where children's books come to life at this one-of-a-kind "Explor-a-Storium." The immersive museum features re-creations of beloved characters and illustrations found in favorite books, such as "Good Night Moon," "No, David!" and "Where the Wild Things Are." The attraction also includes a letterpress print shop, writing lab, reading room and bookstore.

Primate Canopy Trails at Saint Louis Zoo

Traverse the canopy with lemurs and Old World and New World monkeys at this new exhibit. The \$11.5 million, 35,000-square-foot outdoor habitat offers treetop views of the resident wildlife in their natural environment. With plenty of room to roam, the exhibit offers ever-changing views of primates hopping from tree to tree, climbing mesh netting and scampering above your head.

American Tractor Museum, Perryville

Experience the evolution of one of America's most influential machines: the tractor. With a focus on preserving the heartland's agricultural heritage, the museum includes rare antique models no longer in production from manufacturers such as Waterloo Boy, Indiana, Avery and Rumely.

Unwind at a new 15-acre entertainment district located in the Midtown area. Sample a variety of cuisines at 20 restaurants in the Food Hall, sip brews at the authentic German Beer Hall and enjoy live entertainment. The complex is also home to a number of retail shops to browse.

Kansas City Museum

An intricate restoration of the Corinthian Hall mansion creates the perfect setting for a museum that preserves local and regional history through more than 100,000 artifacts. Exhibits highlight cultural heritage — from the American Indians who first settled the land, through Lewis & Clark's expedition, to the Kansas City jazz that thrived during Prohibition and beyond. The museum also houses a cafe, soda fountain, retail store and theater for special programs.

Aquarium at the Boardwalk, Branson

An under-the-sea adventure awaits. Surround yourself with sharks, schools of fish and other sea creatures. Watch in fascination as jellyfish are illuminated in different colors in the Jelly Infinity Room. Be sure to keep an eye out for Aquarius, the octopus mascot — you'll find him hiding throughout the aquarium.

CENTURY-LONG LEGACY

The National Park Service was created in 1916 to save the nation's best wild places. Missouri promptly followed that example by creating its state park system the following year. Missouri State Parks celebrated their centennial in 2017. With 92 parks and historic sites, the system protects the state's most special places, from lakes and

streams to covered bridges and battlefields.

The park system is a testimony to the importance Missourians place on preserving the state's treasures and providing outdoor recreation opportunities. Through the years, the public has shown its support by renewing the Parks, Soil and Water Sales Tax, which funds the parks and enables them to be open to all, with no admission fees.

Three of Missouri's crown jewels - Big Spring, Alley

Spring and Round Spring—were once state parks. Recognized as nationally significant, they were transferred by the state to the National Park Service in the 1960s to serve as cornerstones of the Ozark National Scenic Riverways, which protects the Current and Jacks Fork rivers.

Echo Bluff State Park serves as a base camp for exploring the region. Billed as the "Gateway to the Ozarks," the park offers luxurious lodging and fine dining as well as RV and tent camping, making it popular with campers, hikers, paddlers and other outdoor adventurers. I call it my happy place.

Beyond Echo Bluff, you can float the rivers, hike the Ozark Trail in the Roger Pryor Pioneer Backcountry, fish for trout and tour the mill at Montauk State Park, look for elk at Peck Ranch Conservation Area, and maybe catch a glimpse of the wild horses that roam Shannon County.

















TRAILS GALORE

Missouri is known as a great trails state for good reason. Our state park system offers more than 1,000 miles of trails for hiking, backpacking, bicycling, horseback riding and paddling. At 240 miles, Katy Trail State Park is the longest developed rail-to-trail conversion in the country. The Rock Island Trail, a rail-trail that connects with the Katy, will add 144

miles when it's complete, for a whopping 384 miles total.

The Ozark Trail meanders through several state parks as it travels from the Arkansas border to Onondaga Cave State Park and beyond, giving hikers access to some of the most scenic spots in the state. And don't forget the water trails! Paddle your way along trails at Lake of the Ozarks,

Finger Lakes and Stockton state parks, to name a few.

The Current River Challenge is a three-part hike-paddle combo that includes hiking from Echo Bluff to Current River State Park, then paddling to Round Spring, and hiking back to Echo Bluff. I'm proud to say I have earned one of the coveted bandannas given to those who complete the challenge.

ONLY IN MISSOURI

Some of my favorite state parks are the one-of-a-kind gems that you really have to see to believe part of that Show-Me sensibility. Take Johnson's Shut-Ins State Park, sometimes called Mother Nature's water park. Jumbled boulders form the chutes and



slides of the shut-ins, where water sprites of all ages wade, splash, slip and glide in the clear, cool water of the East Fork of the Black River as it weaves its way through the rocks.

Grand Gulf State Park is home to Missouri's "Little Grand Canyon," which varies depending on recent rainfall; sometimes the canyon is full of water, other times you can walk along the canyon bottom and explore. If you prefer heights, head to Taum Sauk Mountain State Park and hike to the top

of the state's highest point. Beautiful any time of year, the view is eye-popping at the peak of colorful fall foliage.

"Oh, give me a home, where the buffalo roam" always comes to mind at **Prairie State Park**, where the reintroduced bison herd grazes on a remnant of the tallgrass prairie that once covered more than a third of the state. It's a great place for hiking, birdwatching and viewing wildflowers.

Photos of Ha Ha Tonka State Park often feature the

impressive ruins of the turnof-the-century stone castle atop a bluff, but to me the true attractions are at the base of the wooden stairway that connects the two levels of the park. Hike through the karst natural area to see a huge natural bridge, sinkholes, caves and a spring.

There's so much to see and do in the great outdoors at Missouri's state parks, it's hard to know where to begin. Take the Show-Me approach and just plunge in! Maybe I'll see you at one of the kayak clinics at Current River State Park this summer—be sure to say hello.

OUR OUTINGS to Missouri state parks started by chance. Traveling in southwest Missouri, my husband suggested that we visit Roaring River State Park since we don't often get to that part of the state.


Elephant Rocks State Park—with its amazing landscape—is one of my

Staying the Night

WE FORGOT THE RAIN FLY.

Of course, our kids didn't care. It was a warm spring weekend at Harry S Truman State Park, and they were excited to be sleeping in their own tent for the very first time. Without the rain fly covering the mesh at the top of their tent, they could see the stars shining in the night sky. As my husband and I drifted off to sleep in our tent nearby, we could hear them discussing the Big Dipper.

A couple hours later, the rain came, and three damp campers slipped through our door and under the covers. Soon enough, we were back asleep—thankful to have one "roof" over our heads.

The story's been retold countless times—a family tale forever intertwined with the memories we've made at state parks across Missouri. We've hiked through forests and fields, climbed rocks and crossed natural bridges, explored caves, kayaked rivers and spotted baby eagles in their nest.

It's easy to fill a day with fun, but spending the night is a whole new adventure. The best part is you don't have to leave when the sun goes down. We've learned a few things along the way. There's an art to building a campfire. Always bring extra socks. Sometimes it's fine to have s'mores for supper. And be sure to pack the rain fly.


Many state parks offer lodging options. In addition to campgrounds for tents and RVs, there are yurts, cabins and lodges—from rustic to fully furnished. You're sure to find a place that's perfect for an overnight stay, so at the end of

the day you don't have to go home.











My introduction to fishing came at age 5, when my family owned a fishing resort on Table Rock Lake. I spent many afternoons on the dock with a string-equipped with a hook and a worm-tied around my finger. As soon as I lowered my line into the water, I'd catch a little sunfish. It didn't take long to fill a bucket-enough for my dad to bait his trotlines.

The Show-Me State has long been a favorite destination for anglers of all ages. More than 40 state parks-including Lake of the Ozarks, Harry S Truman, Pomme de Terre, Lake Wappapello and Table Rock-provide an opportunity to reel in a variety of freshwater game fish at rivers and lakes throughout the state. Crappie and bass are two of my favorites.

Casting a Line

The cool, clear streams at Roaring River, Montauk and Bennett Spring state parks offer some of the best trout fishing in the country-and are stocked nightly by the Missouri Department of Conservation during the catch-and-keep season. I have fond memories of weekend trips to Bennett Spring where my family stayed in a cabin alongside the stream where Dad was fishing.

You can find a range of amenities, including fishing lessons and equipment rentals, at many state parks. A number of parks also have wheelchair-accessible fishing piers and docks to make it easier to reach the water.

With so many locations to cast a line, Missouri has a prime fishing spot for every angler. Be sure to visit the Department of Conservation website (mdc.mo.gov) for information about permits and Kate Renfrow regulations.



An Explorer's Story

Imagining the Past

MY MOM OFTEN TOOK ME TO MUSEUMS and historic sites as a kid—those were our vacations. Years later, I still seek out places that let me walk back in time and engage my imagination to "experience" other cultures. It's one of the things I love most about Missouri—history is still so alive here.

I'm a little bit German—married into a very German family—so a visit to Deutchheim State Historic Site in Hermann was like visiting a version of my own family history, highlighting the daily life of hard-working Germans making their way in a new world. I even spotted a basket at the Pommer–Gentner house and a *springerle* cookie rolling pin in the gift shop that were nearly identical to ones I have in my home.

I'm less familiar with my French heritage, so Felix-Vallé House State Historic Site in Ste. Genevieve really appealed to me. The architecture, museum and tours showcase the area's French Colonial past. But my favorite thing is events, such as La Veille, an 1830s style candlelight evening in the garden, complete with French folktales. They're like candy to my imagination.

My family mostly city-hopped west, so Arrow Rock State Historic Site gave me a peek into two cultures that aren't my own—the original American Indian tribes of the region and the westward-bound pioneers who frequented the thriving frontier stop. I especially enjoyed J. Huston

Tavern, welcoming hungry travelers since 1834. Their fried chicken is the best!

Thomas Hart Benton

Everyday people living their lives inspired the work of Missouri artist Thomas Hart Benton, who became a leader in the Regionalist art movement.

BENTON WAS BORN in Neosho in 1889. From the time he was a young child, he loved to draw, and the years his family spent in Washington, D.C. — after his father was elected to Congress — gave him access to the city's art. He

particularly liked the murals at the Library of Congress.

Benton went on to study art in Chicago and Paris. He was living in New York City when a trip to visit his father sparked a change in the way he viewed the Midwest. Benton painted ordinary people — working in steel mills, coal mines and cotton fields. His work also called attention to problems he saw in America, and he spoke out against the Ku Klux Klan, lynching and fascism.

One of his most famous pieces is the mural, "A Social History of Missouri," which wraps around the walls of the House Lounge in the Missouri State Capitol in Jefferson City. The mural sparked controversy because it included negative images from the state's history,

including slavery, the expulsion of Mormons from Missouri in 1838 and notorious political boss Tom Pendergast. You can also see Benton murals at the Inman E. Page Library on the campus of Lincoln University in Jefferson City and at Joplin City Hall.

The artist moved to Kansas City in 1935, where he lived and painted until his death 40 years later. Learn more about his life at the Thomas Hart Benton Home and Studio State Historic Site.













Laura Ingalls Wilder

An 1894 advertisement describing Missouri as "The Land of Big Red Apples" lured Laura Ingalls Wilder and her husband Almanzo to Rocky Ridge Farm long before Wilder wrote her first book.

GENERATIONS OF CHILDREN grew up reading Wilder's "Little House" books and watching "Little House on the Prairie," the television show inspired by her family's adventures.

Wilder was born in Wisconsin in 1867. When she was still a baby, the family lived on a farm in north central Missouri before a series of moves to homestead in other states.

She met and married her husband Almanzo in De Smet, South Dakota, where they lived for several years before moving to Minnesota, Florida and back to De Smet. That's when the "Big Apple" advertisement caught their attention.

Missouri was the right fit for the family, and they settled into their life at a place they named Rocky Ridge Farm, located near Mansfield. Their success at farming led Wilder to her start as a writer—she penned several articles about their farm for the "Missouri Ruralist."

After many years in Mansfield, she began chronicling her life on the frontier. Those stories became the books that paint a picture of how many pioneer families lived as the country began its westward expansion.

The Laura Ingalls Wilder Historic Home and Museum transports visitors into the world of the "Little House" books. Artifacts include tools, needlework and Pa's fiddle. Every fan should visit at least once.

Molly Brown

A woman from Hannibal was among the 712 people who survived the Titanic disaster. Known as "The Unsinkable Molly Brown," she devoted much time to improving the lives of others.

BROWN WAS BORN in Hannibal in 1867 and attended her aunt's private school until she was 13 and began working long days at a local factory. When her sister and brother moved to Colorado, she followed.

She married a man who was superintendent at a mining company that eventually discovered veins of gold and silver in its Little Johnny Mine. The Browns' newfound wealth allowed them to move to Denver, where Molly became active in social causes, supported charities and worked to help women and children in need.

A love of travel undoubtedly led to her fame. Brown was in France in 1912 when she learned that her grandson was ill. She booked a trip home on the inaugural voyage of the RMS Titanic. When the

ship hit an iceberg and began to sink, she helped other passengers into a lifeboat and worked to maintain their morale until they were rescued.

Brown continued to live a life filled with civic engagement. When the Colorado National Guard clashed with striking coal miners, she brought worldwide attention to the "Ludlow Massacre." During World War I, she donated her summer home in Rhode Island to the Red Cross to support the war effort and later traveled to France to work on relief issues.

Accounts vary on whether or not she actually called herself "unsinkable," but the term stuck and was used in a Broadway production, a movie and many books.

John William "Blind" Boone

Faced with blindness, poverty and discrimination, John William Boone overcame many challenges to become an accomplished pianist and composer of ragtime music.

BORN IN CENTRAL Missouri in 1864 to a young enslaved woman, Boone lost his eyesight as an infant, following treatment for cerebral meningitis.

Boone's talent for music emerged at an early age. When he was 9 years old, community members came together to send him to the Missouri School for the Blind. He traveled to St. Louis to begin his education—which included music. John played "by ear," and could perform anything he heard. On school breaks he played at church and for gatherings to earn money to help his family.

A new superintendent arrived at the school and no longer allowed Black students to play the piano. When John began skipping classes to perform in saloons, he was expelled from school. At the age of 15, he met John Lange Jr.,

who received permission from Boone's parents to take over John's career and ensure his training and care.

Boone initially performed as "Blind John" throughout the Midwest. He and Lange eventually formed the Blind Boone Touring Company and adopted the motto, "Merit, Not Sympathy, Wins." Boone's proficiency in combining many genres—classical, folk, Negro spirituals and popular music—contributed to a new sound that came to be known as ragtime.

He later married and eventually purchased a home in Columbia but continued to travel and perform. His retirement in 1927 capped nearly 50 seasons on tour.

Explore the musician's rich history at the **Blind Boone Home**, listed in the National Register of Historic Places.





















George Washington Carver

Renowned scientist, educator and humanitarian, George Washington Carver was born enslaved but rose from humble beginnings to revolutionize agriculture.

CARVER WAS BORN in 1864 on a farm near Diamond that belonged to a man named Moses Carver. As an infant, George was kidnapped, along with his mother and sister (his father had died before George was born). Moses hired a neighbor to retrieve them, but only George was found. Moses and his wife raised the young

boy — who eventually took the last name of Carver — and taught him to read and write.

Frail and sickly as a child, George could not do much physical labor on the farm, so he learned to cook, garden and perform other household chores. He also became keenly interested in plants. He studied botany at the Iowa State Agricultural School, where he earned Bachelor of Science and Master of Agriculture degrees. He quickly received an offer from Booker T. Washington to join the faculty at Tuskegee Institute in Alabama.

Carver established the agricultural curriculum at Tuskegee and conducted research that dramatically changed farming. His ideas for improving soil, including crop rotation, were especially beneficial to poor farmers who couldn't afford to purchase

fertilizer. His best-known work was developing hundreds of products from peanuts, sweet potatoes and soybeans.

President Franklin D. Roosevelt signed legislation in 1943 creating a monument to George Washington Carver—up to that time an honor reserved for presidents Washington and Lincoln. Today, you can visit the George Washington Carver National Monument, a 210-acre complex that includes a museum, nature trail and the site of the cabin where Carver was born.

Harry S. Truman

Less than three months after Harry S. Truman became vice president of the United States, he rose to the most powerful political office in the world.

TRUMAN WAS BORN in Lamar in 1884. As a young boy, he moved with his family to Independence.

Truman was considered a good student, but couldn't afford to attend college. Instead, he worked on the family's farm in Grandview and joined the National Guard. When the U.S. entered World War I, Truman served in an artillery unit in France. Upon returning home from the war, he married his childhood sweetheart, Bess Wallace, and held several jobs before being elected to an administrative judgeship in Jackson County and eventually to the U.S. Senate.

When President Franklin D. Roosevelt decided to seek reelection for a fourth term, he replaced his current vice president with Truman. After FDR's death, Truman was flummoxed. He had only met with the president sporadically. He knew little about the atomic bomb but was called upon to make the controversial decision to use it to end World War II.

Truman's significant policies included the Marshall Plan, which provided aid to Europe after the war. He also issued an executive order that desegregated the U.S. Armed Forces.

Learn more about America's 33rd president at the Harry S. Truman Library & Museum, which recently underwent a major renovation. Visit additional sites significant to Truman's life including the Harry S Truman Birthplace State Historic Site in Lamar and the Harry S Truman National Historic Site, which includes the Truman Home and Noland Home in Independence and the Truman Farm Home in Grandview.









Four Seasons of Fun — and Then Some

Fill your calendar with adventure all year long

When it comes to seasons, Missouri has them all—a distinct winter, spring, summer and fall. It's one of the things people love about the Show-Me State. But in reality, you'll find far more than four. We've got lake season, floating season and fishing season. Harvest season and holiday season are popular, too. And our professional football, baseball and hockey seasons will have you cheering in the stands. So pick a season and plan a trip. There's a lot to see and do.

Winter in Missouri offers unexpected beauty. Set out on a hike and you'll be rewarded with views of towering bluffs, rock formations and sparkling streams - often hidden by leafy trees other times of the year. A cabin in the woods is a cozy spot to relax in front of a fireplace. Big Cedar Lodge near Branson, Echo Bluff State Park near Eminence and the River of Life Farm near Dora provide an unforgettable setting for a romantic trip for two or a family getaway.

When the weather gets too cold for comfort, head to one of Missouri's metro areas to explore indoors at museums focused on art, history, music and more. Step back in time in Kansas City with a stay at the Crossroads Hotel and a visit to the Negro Leagues Baseball Museum, Arabia Steamboat Museum and National WWI Museum and Memorial. In St. Louis, immerse yourself in creativity at the Angad Arts Hotel, National Blues

Museum and the whimsical City Museum. You'll find a vintage industrial vibe at Hotel Vandivort and a glimpse of the past at the History Museum on the Square in downtown Springfield.

Spring brings lush green landscapes to the Show-Me State. Wildflowers and blooming trees fill forests and glades with shades of pink, purple, blue and white. Plant lovers will find paradise at Missouri Botanical Garden in St. Louis, Powell Gardens in Kingsville and Springfield Botanical Gardens.

Pack a picnic and spend the day at one of Missouri's state, national or regional parks. Spring is the best time to see the state's wet-weather waterfalls including Mina Sauk Falls at Taum Sauk Mountain State Park and the falls at Don Robinson State Park near Cedar Hill and Hickory Canyons Natural Area near Ste. Genevieve. Visit after a rain for the best views.

When things heat up, head underground to a cave where the temperature stays between 55 and 60 degrees year-round.

Summer's long days and warm weather are perfect for family fun. Thrill-seekers can get their adrenaline pumping on roller coasters at Worlds of Fun in Kansas City and Six Flags St. Louis. Take a spin high in the sky on The St. Louis Wheel or The Branson Ferris Wheel. When things heat up, head underground to a cave where the temperature stays between 55 and 60 degrees year-round. In Hannibal, follow the maze-like passageways in Mark Twain Cave, made famous in "The Adventures of Tom Sawyer" and other Twain novels. Onondaga Cave, near Leasburg, is known

for its colorful dripstones, flowstones and "lily pad" room.

For a bit of nostalgia, head to a drive-in. Missouri still has nine of the old-school outdoor movie theaters, including the 66 Drive-In, located on historic Route 66 in Carthage. Enjoy a live show under the stars at The Muny in St. Louis and Starlight Theatre in Kansas City. The outdoor theaters offer musicals and concerts all summer long.

Autumn arrives in Missouri as millions of acres of hardwood forests turn orange, gold and red. A fall drive deep into the Ozarks reveals vibrant views around every corner. Autumn is also one of the best times to travel the Katy Trail, the longest developed railto-trail in the nation. Pedal through wine country with stops in Defiance, Augusta, Hermann and Rocheport to sample award-winning wine. Make it a multiday trip with an overnight stay at a bed-and-breakfast inn or historic hotel.



LAKE

Spend time on, in or near the water from early spring through late fall. Boating is popular on many Missouri lakes, such as Table Rock Lake, Mark Twain Lake and Truman Lake. Bring your own boat or rent one at a marina. At Lake of the Ozarks, you'll find lake-side pools and live music at Backwater Jack's, Dog Days Bar & Grill and other water-front restaurants.

FLOATING SEASON

Summer is the most popular time to paddle your way down one of Missouri's pristine rivers—but a float trip in the spring or autumn offers more solitude along with the breathtaking views. Local outfitters near rivers, including the Current, Jacks Fork, Niangua, Meramec and others, offer canoe, kayak and raft rentals as well as transportation to and from the launch and takeout points.

FISHING SEASON

Dozens of Missouri lakes and rivers attract anglers in search of bass, crappie, catfish, walleye and more. Fishing season for many species extends all year long. The catch-and-keep season at the state's four trout parks—Bennett Spring State Park, Roaring River State Park, Montauk State Park and Maramec Spring Park—runs March 1 to October 31.

HARVEST SEASON

From July through September, farmers markets overflow with piles of fresh-from-the-garden produce. You can pick your own fruit at orchards throughout the Show-Me State, including Peters Orchards and Market in Waverly and Sunshine Valley Farm in Rogersville. In late summer and early fall, vineyards host festivals and events to celebrate the tradition of the annual grape harvest in Missouri wine country. When October rolls around, wind your way through a corn maze at Shryocks Callaway Farms near Columbia, Beggs Family Farm in Sikeston and many other farms across the state. Be sure to stop by a pumpkin patch before heading home.

HOLIDAY SEASON

Dazzling light displays and music shows make the season bright during November and December. Silver Dollar City features the sights, sounds and flavors of Christmas under the glow of more than six million lights. Branson's lineup of live shows highlights a mix of traditional and new holiday tunes. The historic Country Club Plaza has been lighting up Kansas City during the holidays for 90 years. Find another favorite ice skating-at Steinberg Skating Rink at Forest Park in St. Louis, Crown Center in Kansas City and Old Kinderhook Resort, Golf Club & Spa near Camdenton.







SPORTS SEASONS

Missouri's professional sports teams – the Chiefs and Royals in Kansas City, the Cardinals and Blues in St. Louis and the Cardinals AA team in Springfield – are steeped in tradition and team spirit. In the past decade, sports fans have been rewarded with Super Bowl, World Series and Stanley Cup wins.



can't remember a time when I didn't love the zoo. Every special occasion or free weekend, I'd try to wheedle my mother into taking me. Since she often responded with "we'll see," the zoo remained a treat. That hasn't changed. What has changed is the number and variety of attractions where you can enjoy the wildlife.

Today's zoos are definitely not your grandparents' zoos. The emphasis these days is on the well-being and comfort of the animals, with specialized habitats, diets and health care designed for each species. I view the zoo as a kind of ark—preserving animals through study and

selective breeding, often keeping extinction at bay. But at the same time, they're just as magical as they were when I was a child.

One of the coolest exhibits at the **Saint Louis Zoo** is also the oldest: the walkthrough flight cage, originally built for the

1904 World's Fair. The attraction is home to 20 species of North American birds, including egrets, herons and ibis. Last summer, the zoo expanded its primate house by adding the Primate Canopy Trails. Now we can see what life is like for lemurs, tamarinds, and Old and New







their adorable faces peeking through the branches. And if you don't suffer from a fear of heights, like I do, let the African Sky Safari carry you above zebras, giraffes, ostriches and rhinos, landing in just the right spot to enjoy the chimpanzees.

Dickerson Park Zoo in Springfield makes exploring the animals of the world easy-by dividing their exhibits by continent. A long-time favorite is the North America section that features critters you could-but often don't-see in the wild right here in Missouri, like cougars, black bears and comical river otters. View lots of exotic species, too-including giraffes, where for a small fee, your kids (or you why should they have all the fun?) can feed the tallest animal on earth.

If you want a great animal experience without the hike, check out Wild Animal Safari in Strafford. You can drive through on your own or take a guided bus tour. They also have a walkabout area where you can interact with the residents.

Maybe your focus is a little more specialized. You know what you like, and what you like is big cats. Crown Ridge Tiger Sanctuary in Ste. Genevieve is a nonprofit rescue and educational facility that provides permanent lifelong care for abused, neglected or unwanted big cats. You can even stay on-site in tiger country. And on the other side of the state, take a walking or driving tour of the nonprofit National Tiger Sanctuary in Saddlebrooke.

World monkeys up where they belong in the tree canopy. A series of walkways leads visitors into the primates' world to enjoy the activities at eye level.

Perhaps the best thing about the zoo is getting to meet critters you didn't even know existed. For me, kangaroos are fast-moving animals native to Australia who carry cute joeys in their pouches (and they are!). But there's another kangaroo family - equally cute - who lives in trees at the Kansas City

Zoo. A new habitat allows you to see

You'll find more than 40 species in oceans all over the world; some even live in the Show-Me State, at SEA LIFE Kansas City. And if that's not intriguing enough, check out the aquarium's rescued green sea turtles.

For a land-locked place like Missouri, it's amazing that you can explore ocean animals in every corner of the state.

Among all the aquatic creatures you can enjoy at **St. Louis Aquarium at Union Station**, there's a real star—and we're not talking starfish. Lord Stanley is a rare blue lobster, donated to the city when the St. Louis Blues won the Stanley Cup in 2019. And who doesn't love dragons? You'll find them here, too—real, live sea dragons that come from the deep.

Wonders of Wildlife National Museum & Aquarium in Springfield is the largest immersive wildlife attraction in the world. Explore a 1.5-million-gallon aquarium adventure showcasing 35,000 live fish, mammals, reptiles and birds plus a museum offering a tour of the wildest places on earth. The trails and exhibits span more than 1.5 miles.

The newest arrival on the scene is the Aquarium at the Boardwalk in Branson, and it's all about fish and fun. Take a 5D submarine ride to the bottom of the sea and visit a giant octopus. The Jelly Infinity Room introduces you to the beauty of jellyfish.

It's not just exotic animals and sea life that offer visitors a thrill. Wolves have captured the imagination since the dawn of time. Whether your perception is one of respect or fear, learn more about them at the **Endangered Wolf Center** in Eureka. If you have the chance, book yourself for a wolf howl—it's sure to raise the hair on the back of your neck.





World Bird Sanctuary in Valley Park preserves threatened bird species from around the world and supports its mission by offering fascinating tours and Amazing Animal Encounters. Watch birds of prey fly right over your head, snakes slither across the stage, macaws speak the English language and much more.

If your tastes run more to wild horses, they're a lot closer than you probably think. Just head south to Eminence, where the famous herd of wild horses living in the Ozark National Scenic Riverways area often makes an appearance.



The resorts also offer stay-and-play packages that include lodging, golf and other amenities. Check their websites for details.

So grab a driver, and your driver, and tee up a memorable getaway in Missouri.



While the Branson area has long been synonymous with live entertainment and outdoor beauty, its golf courses and resorts, including The Pointe, Thousand Hills, LedgeStone, Branson Hills and

Holiday Hills, are equally worthy attractions.

In recent years, Branson's stature as a golf destination has catapulted into "must-visit" territory with the addition of five courses that are amenities of **Big Cedar Lodge**.

In recent years, Branson's stature as a golf destination has catapulted into "mustvisit" territory. course designed by 82-time PGA TOUR winner Tiger Woods and his golf course design firm. The course stands out with an inviting layout, pristine water features, large fairways and greens, and a spectacular 19th hole. Features like these are hallmarks of the Big Cedar courses—celebrations of golf, nature and the Ozarks.

Golf is just the beginning at Big Cedar Lodge, which offers lodge rooms, cabins and cottages near the shores of Table Rock

Lake. The nongolfers in your group may be most excited by **Fun Mountain**. The entertainment complex, located on the resort property, has an arcade, restaurant, bowling alley, go-karts, laser tag and ropes course.

There's also a golf simulator, just in case you can't stand being away from the game for too long.

Those who prefer a quieter environment should visit **Cedar Creek Spa.** The Grotto Pool and Ice Room combine to provide a
memorable hot-and-cold experience that will reinvigorate your
body and maybe restore your patience (especially if you've been
in the car with kids or in-laws for a while).

Simply walking the grounds at Big Cedar can be a relaxing experience as well. On your trek, you might find **Bent Hook Marina**, which offers boat rentals on Table Rock Lake.

While lake outings are summertime staples, an autumn boat ride, just as the leaves are changing, is as memorable as it gets.

State Park Marina, located at Table Rock State Park about 15 minutes from Big Cedar by car, also offers boat rentals on Table Rock Lake. The park has several trails for hikers and cyclists. The paved Lakeshore Trail offers great views of the water and meanders from the marina to the Dewey Short Visitor Center, adjacent to Table Rock Dam.

Old Kinderhook Resort, Golf Club & Spa (left); Lake of the Ozarks (right) Talk of waterways in Missouri often conjures up images of Lake of the Ozarks. The 55,000acre lake in the state's central region is known for its wide channel, watersports, excellent fishing and family fun.

The area is a great place to hit the links. The Lodge of Four Seasons, Osage National and Margaritaville Resort (formerly Tan-Tar-A) have long been popular golfing destinations.

Less than five minutes west of Camdenton, near the lake's southwestern shores, is **Old Kinderhook Resort, Golf Club & Spa**, an ideal destination for golfers.

The par-71, Tom Weiskopf signature course plays more than 6,700 yards from the championship tees. Your driver is going to get a workout here, especially on No. 9, a par 5 that plays uphill for virtually all of its 500-plus yards.

No. 14, another par 5 — this one almost 560 yards — also plays uphill and has ample water waiting for shots that draw a little too far to the left. Fortunately, the course has opportunities to grip it and rip it from elevated tee boxes on Nos. 8 and 12.

When it comes to accommodations, multiple options await. If you're traveling with a family or larger group, you may want to look into the resort's golf cottages, patio homes, villas and estate homes.

The lodge itself has spacious guest rooms, indoor and outdoor pools, and is home to **Spa 54 at Old Kinderhook**, where massage and salon services are available.

During the winter months, the lodge's outdoor ice rink is a favorite spot for couples, families and groups. During the summer season, cue up the "Top Gun" soundtrack and reserve time on





The park has 14 hiking trails, a natural bridge and Missouri's 12th largest spring. The Visitor Center rents kayaks for paddling adventures on the lake.

Coffee and Dessert

Satisfy your cravings with rich and tantalizing flavors

Great coffee and decadent desserts are two of life's simple pleasures. You'll find plenty of both in the Show-Me State, where coffee roasters are ready to fill up your cup, and bakeries will tempt you with sugary treats.

WHERE COFFEE IS SUPREME

Missouri is home to dozens of coffee roasters—each one a little different from the next, offering not only a variety of coffee but a little neighborhood flavor as well. From small sidewalk cafes to sleek modern spaces, the roasters bring some of the world's finest coffee beans to the Show-Me State.

Head to the heart of Kansas City, where three small coffee companies joined forces to form Messenger Coffee. At Messenger Café, pair a cup of coffee with a pastry from the in-house Ibis Bakery. Take in the views from the rooftop patio — complete with an outdoor fireplace.

Savor a cup of brewed, espresso or pour-over coffee at **Upshot Coffee**, with locations in Cottleville and St. Charles. The shops also offer fresh juices from **Beets** & **Bones** and breakfast and brunch items that range from steak and egg sandwiches to vegan tacos.

Located in Columbia, Shortwave Coffee produces small-batch light roast coffee. Try a latte, espresso or cold brew in an intimate setting at the company's original location downtown in Alley A. The shop's second locale includes a bakery with local, organic and vegan offerings.

Brick and Mortar
Coffee in Springfield
focuses on the craftsmanship of coffee roasting and
connecting coffee lovers.
The tasting room showcases a rotating selection
of coffees served at a large
community table. The menu
offers hand-brewed, cold
brew and espresso-based
drinks.

Mokaska Coffee Company is a small-batch coffee roaster in downtown St. Joseph, where the original Mokaska Coffee opened its doors in 1884. Unable to survive the Great Depression, the company closed in the 1930s. Decades later, the new Mokaska Coffee Company is carrying on the city's coffee tradition that now includes a full-service coffee shop and community gathering spot.

The roots of baking run deep in Missouri — from the days when water-powered mills ground wheat into flour that was then combined with homegrown fruit and generous amounts of cream and butter. Today, bakeries across the Show-Me State carry on the tradition with made-from-scratch pies, cakes and other sweets.


Blue Owl Restaurant and Bakery in Kimmswick is home of the famous Levee High Caramel Pecan Apple Pie—packed with 18 apples. You may think that's all you need to know, but the restaurant and bakery makes two dozen kinds of pie, a handful of cheesecakes, several layer cakes and a selection of other pastries, including "pie pops"—tiny treats on a stick.

Bring your appetite to A Slice of Pie in Rolla, because the pies here are big—some weigh in at more than five pounds. In addition to their regular selections, the shop offers a pie of the month—often something a little out of the ordinary such as the Mud Slide or Tahitian Cream.

In Cape Girardeau, a local college professor's daughter convinced him to bake a few of his homemade cheesecakes each week for the restaurant where she worked. She would often urge customers to try a slice of "my daddy's cheesecake." The cheesecake and the name caught on. More than three decades later, My Daddy's Cheesecake Bakery and Cafe makes more than 20 rich and creamy varieties.

Discover the flavors of Australia at Banksia, with two locations in Kansas City—downtown and just south of Country Club Plaza. The owners came to Missouri from Sydney a decade ago and opened their first cafe and bakery after retiring in 2017. They poured their passion for food into making pastries, tarts, cookies and other desserts, in addition to a full breakfast and lunch menu.

Sugar Leaf Bakery, Cafe and Espresso in Branson creates cakes for weddings, anniversaries, birthdays and other celebrations. Stop by the shop for a selection of cakes, cookies, pies and cobblers guaranteed to make any day of the week special.



Beneath stately black walnut and oak trees are a campground, a picnic area, hiking trails and a fishing lake FREE &

Arrow Rock State Historic Site ARROW ROCK 660-837-3330, 39521 Visitor Center Drive. The spirit of Missouri's frontier years lingers in this quiet, historic village. You can tour an old courthouse, a stone jail and the home of artist George Caleb Bingham, or dine at the old J. Huston Tavern. A visitor center, hiking trails and camping are available. FREE &

Battle of Lexington State Historic Site LEXINGTON 660-259-4654, 1101 Delaware. The Missouri State Guard defeated Union troops during the Sept. 18-20, 1861, Battle of Hemp Bales. Big Lake State Park CRAIG 660-771-6341, 204 Lake Shore Drive. The 625-acre natural oxbow Big Lake borders the park, which lies along a major migratory flyway. The park offers camping, premium camper cabins, a boat ramp and picnicking, FREE &

Boone's Lick State Historic Site BOONESBORO 660-837-3330, Highway 187. This is the site of the salt-manufacturing business once owned and operated by Daniel Boone's sons, Daniel M. and Nathan. 6 Confederate Memorial State Historic Site HIGGINSVILLE 660-584-2853, 211 W. Battle of Athens State Historic Site

battle fought west of the Mississippi River, during

**Q Governor Daniel Dunklin's Grave State Historic Site HERCULANEUM 636-464-2976, 104 Dunklin Drive. Gov. Daniel Dunklin, Missouri's fifthgovernor (1832–36), and members of his family are

buried here. The historic site interprets the role of Dunklin in Missouri's history, and provides a scenic overlook of the Mississippi River. FREE

Battle of Island Mound State Historic Site BUTLER 417-276-4259, 4837 NW County Road 1002. The Battle of Island Mound marked the first time that Black troops engaged in Civil War combat. This site encompasses Fort Africa, where the 1st Kansas Colored Volunteer Infantry camped in 1862 before a battle with pro-Confederate forces near a low hill named Island Mound, FREE &

 Big Sugar Creek State Park PINEVILLE 417-847-2539, 6727 Big Sugar Creek Road. This park features outstanding oak and oak-pine savannas in the rugged Elk Hills region of Southwest Missouri. These glades, woodlands and bluffs lie along Big Sugar Creek. A 3.3-mile hiking trail traverses these natural features. FREE

 Harry S Truman Birthplace State Historic Site LAMAR 417-682-2279, 1009 Truman St. Harry S. Truman, the only Missourian ever elected U.S. president, was born here on May 8, 1884. 3 Nathan and Olive Boone Homestead State Historic Site ASH GROVE 417-751-3266, 7850 N. State Highway V. This log house, built in 1837, was the home of Col. Nathan Boone and his wife, Olive. Nathan was the son of Daniel Boone and a military officer and early developer of Missouri. Olive was the caretaker of the homestead and the provider for the Boone children. The two lived in the house until their deaths in the 1850s. The site features tours, a small picnic area, a picnic shelter, a fishing pond and hiking trails. \$

Osage Village State Historic Site WALKER 417-682-2279, Highway C. This site was once a big Osage American Indian village occupied from 1700 to 1775.
