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## BEYOND THE CITY

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### **OREGON TRAIL & INDEPENDENCE, MISSOURI**

Step into the pages of frontier history with a quick drive twenty-five minutes east to Independence, Missouri, once the official starting point of the Oregon Trail. Explore interactive exhibits and preserved wagon ruts at the National Frontier Trails Museum, or hop aboard a horse-drawn wagon ride through historic streets. The town square offers charming antique shops, pioneer-era buildings, and warm, welcoming cafés. At nearby Independence Landing, you can follow the riverbanks where early explorers once camped. Wind down with homestyle comfort food and a drink at a cozy local tavern where stories of westward adventure still echo.

### **ROUTE 66, JOPLIN & CARTHAGE, MISSOURI**

Head just over two hours southwest and discover the nostalgic spirit of the Mother Road. In Joplin, enjoy murals, historic downtown walks, and the natural beauty of Grand Falls. Continue to Carthage for classic Americana, from the historic courthouse to the outdoor exhibits at Red Oak II, a recreated small town full of whimsical charm. Don't miss a chance to catch a movie at the 66 Drive-In Theatre if timing permits. Whether you're savoring saucy barbecue or exploring quirky roadside stops, Route 66 in this region offers a laid-back, story-filled ride into yesteryear.

### **LAKE OF THE OZARKS, MISSOURI**

Drive two and a half hours southeast through scenic hills to Missouri's favorite lakeside escape. At Lake of the Ozarks, you can dip your toes in the water, rent a boat, or stretch your legs on hiking trails that wind through forests and bluffs. At Ha Ha Tonka State Park, discover castle ruins perched above dramatic cliffs, a hidden gem for both history buffs and nature lovers. Dockside eateries serve up relaxed meals with lake views, while beach bars and tiki huts bring the nightlife to the water. This is a perfect blend of sunshine, serenity, and mid-Missouri adventure.

### **ST. LOUIS, MISSOURI**

Though just outside the usual day-trip range, three and a half hours south, St. Louis is a fantastic choice for a bold overnight escape. From the soaring Gateway Arch to riverboat rides and blues clubs, this city blends classic Americana with vibrant creativity. Stroll through Forest Park, explore museums, or grab lunch in The Hill, famous for old-school Italian cuisine. In the evening, enjoy rooftop cocktails, a Cardinals game, or live jazz in historic Soulard. For those who don't mind the extra drive, St. Louis makes the distance worth it with its unforgettable energy.



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
