

toward Cabo San Lucas' trademark site: El Arco. The awe-inspiring natural feature juts out where the currents of the Pacific Ocean collide with the Sea of Cortés.

On your way back, you'll be invigorated but

ready for a real meal, so head to SUR Beach House. The open-air restaurant's chic, easygoing vibe comes complete with delicious, internationally inspired dishes — from sushi to tacos. If you spend a few hours lounging, you can take a dip in the surf and watch as Médano Beach comes alive. It's people watching at it's best.

Dining in Los Cabos is a major attraction.

Head downtown, where the options are vast and the menus impressive. A heady mix of internationally recognized chefs and cuisines mingle with traditional Mexican fare, all supported by the fresh-as-the-day seafood.

Find a spot in Marina Cabo San Lucas with clear views of the sunset, and order any local specialty like smoked marlin, grilled clams, shrimp tacos or the catch of the day.

As the sun goes down, the night begins to sizzle. From funky, hole-in-the-wall joints and local hangouts to dance clubs and live music venues, there is no lack of nightlife options.



To start the day off right, grab a fresh fruit smoothie, or a *café*, and a pastry at the Coffee Shop & Juice Bar at Bahia Hotel & Beach Club. After breakfast, take a leisurely stroll down to Médano Beach.

To get the blood flowing early, book a guided paddleboard tour. Pushing off the sand you'll paddle right into turquoise waters and feel your heart rate surge as you head

After a big night in Cabo San Lucas, you'll need something a little more substantial than fruit juice to get started. A stop at French Riviera Bakery in San José del Cabo is in order. Try a freshly made croissant with eggs — prepared to your liking — and a warm cup of coffee. Then grab your swimsuit again. It's time to go to Dolphin Discovery.

Located in a 75,000-square-foot natural ocean cove within San José del Cabo's Marina Puerto Los Cabos, Dolphin Discovery is a popular family friendly attraction that offers a menu of immersive programs that will allow you to design your experience. Depending on your comfort level, you can begin with a shallow water platform meet-and-greet, which will place you nose to bottlenose for a gentle kiss, sweet hug, tender handshake then hard-target — a dolphin high-five. The options get increasingly interactive from there.

After a few hours at the park, you'll be

hankering for lunch. As their logo states, a revolution begins with an idea, and the idea at La Revolución Comedor de Baja California is to create a menu that is based on the products made in the region. What you get is a selection that is equal parts seafood, pork and produce and altogether mouthwatering.





Try the *Taco de Pulpo con Chicharrón* (Octopus taco with pork rinds) to get a full sense of place. Wash it all down with one of the craft cocktails, which are also made using locally sourced ingredients.

This is the part where you get to leisurely walk-off your meal while checking out the art in San José del Cabo's Gallery District.

The restaurant is right in the district, so you can begin an afternoon exploring history, local culture, provocative pieces, handicrafts and gallery installations as soon as you walk out the door. Breathe in the spirit of creativity as you enjoy this picturesque and charming, pedestrian-friendly neighborhood lined with restaurants, small shops and galleries that carry paintings, sculptures, photography and jewelry. This is a place of hidden restaurants, shaded courtyards and rooftop bars that make up the cultural epicenter of Los Cabos, and it is well worth the trip.

But don't leave before experiencing San José del Cabo's burgeoning culinary and nightlife scenes, which all come together between November and June, when the city hosts its weekly Art Walk on Thursdays. Every week during the season, galleries open their doors and entice guests to stroll through the district with wine and light bites. Restaurants promote specials to keep the art walkers satisfied, and street musicians do what they do best: Keep the mood alive. Stop at Baja Brewing Co.'s original outpost and enjoy the artsy vibe at the outdoor beer garden with a wood-fired pizza.

DAY 3

It may seem like the road that links Cabo San Lucas to San José del Cabo is little more than a highway lined with high-end resorts, but stop to get a closer look, and you'll find many properties along The Corridor have some of the finest restaurants, spas and activities in the region. One of the most stunning in all of Mexico is One&Only Palmilla.

Start the day by booking a fitness class at the resort. An extensive menu of options is available through the fitness center's daily activity program, including yoga and Pilates.

Keep the sense of wellness going with an al fresco breakfast at Breeze, which overlooks the property's crown jewel: Palmilla Beach. One of the first swimmable beaches in Los Cabos recognized with a Blue Flag certification, Palmilla is a white-sand beauty that's ideal for splashing about, snorkeling and catching a glimpse of migrating whales during the season.

After such a relaxing start, you probably want a challenge. Just a short ride inland is the resort's Troon-managed Palmilla Golf Club. One of the oldest and finest courses in Los Cabos, the 27-hole Jack Nicklaus showpiece remains one the most highly-rated courses in Latin America year after year and is affectionately known as the Grand Dame of Los Cabos Golf.

In the evening, head back to Marina Cabo San Lucas for dinner and a show. Aboard Caborey's three-deck catamaran you will get a front-row view of the rock formations at sunset, as you dine and enjoy the open bar.



>> Cabo del Sol – The Ocean Course

Measuring 7,091 yards from the tips, the Ocean Course stretches more than a mile along a coastline of craggy rock outcroppings and sun-washed shores. >> Cabo San Lucas Country Club

One of the first golf courses developed in the region, Cabo San Lucas Country Club offers spectacular views of El Arco at Land's End. One of the club's main draws is its "drinking and driving" offering, courtesy of a lighted driving range that's open until 11 p.m. most nights. cabocountry.com

>> Chileno Bay Golf & Beach Club

Designed by Tom Fazio, the 18-hole, par-72

Right in the heart of the course is Lake Chileno, a desalinated lake with a stunning blue hue. >> Club Campestre San José

>> Diamante Cabo San Lucas – El Cardonal

Tiger Woods' architectural debut, the 18hole, championship El Cardonal visually complements Diamante's famed Dunes Course. It features a long front nine that meanders through rippling dunes, while its back nine gradually ascends the higher ground. diamantecabosanlucas.com

>> Diamante Cabo San Lucas The Dunes Course

Reminiscent of Ireland's Island Golf Club, the par-72, 7,300-yard Dunes Course at Diamante Cabo San Lucas was designed by 21-time PGA Tour winner Davis Love III. This beachfront course boasts 18 holes with emerald fairways and dramatic views of the Pacific Ocean. Critically acclaimed, it was a Top New International Golf Course in 2010. >> El Dorado Golf & Beach Club

Stretching to 7,322 yards, this par-72 Jack Nicklaus–designed course is ranked as one of the top courses in the world. >> Palmilla Golf Club

With views of the Pacific Ocean from all 18 holes, Quivira offers more oceanfront exposure than any other course in Los Cabos. >> Vidanta Golf

One of the most enjoyable golf outings in Los Cabos has to be the nine-hole, par-35 Vidanta Golf in San José del Cabo. The course measures 3,153 yards and is semiflat, but don't be fooled by the modest measurements, as it presents quite a few challenging holes that include both water and bunkers. Built for soft play in 1987, it was originally proposed in order to attract more tourists to the region. Though it is the oldest course in Los Cabos, Vidanta is widely considered one of its best values. vidantagolf.com

WAYS TO GET HOOKED

WHAT USED TO BE A SLEEPY COASTAL VILLAGE, AN AQUATIC GEM AT THE END OF A LONG DESERT HIGHWAY IS NOW AN EASILY ACCESSIBLE PLAYGROUND FOR ANGLERS OF ALL STRIPES.

Imagine this: A fisherman trolling 20 miles off the Los Cabos waters, strapped to a fighting chair, backs down on a 1,000-pound blue marlin. Waves break over the stern as the fisherman sweats bullets. He winches the reel in crank after crank to battle the beast until it is boat-side, glimmering with Technicolor blue and purple hues as it thrashes its monstrous sword bill through the water. No, this is not an excerpt from Hemingway's Old Man and the Sea, it is in fact, Ernest Hemingway himself. Papa — as he was often called — spent many of his days fishing the Baja California peninsula. And Hemingway fishing these shores is pretty much a seal of approval for Los Cabos as world-class fishing grounds.

Opportunity abounds for the salt water angler, as numerous species inhabit the Sea of Cortés and Pacific Ocean. There are at least three different ways you can hook the catch of your life while you're in Los Cabos.

GO BIG

The waters off Los Cabos are known as legendary billfish grounds, exemplified by the world-class striped marlin fishery. But other big-game beasts — including blue marlin, black marlin, wahoo, yellowfin tuna and dorado — abound. It's easy to reach the offshore grounds. Luxury 30- to 60-foot sportfishing yachts offered by Pisces Fleet, which has been doing this for 40 years, are equipped with large size 50- to 80-class conventional reels matched with stand-up heavy-duty rods and spooled with 80-pound line to do battle with the biggest of them. The run for big game usually means a ride from 10 to 50 miles offshore, and the preferred method to raise billfish and tuna mainly revolves around trolling a pattern of lures and baits to incite a strike. Generally, trolling encompasses dragging a spread of rubber and plastic lures consisting of daisy chains, ballyhoo rigged on islander lures, squid spreader bars, chuggers and jets.



A spread can contain up to 10 rods out as the lures crashing across the surface, triggering a reaction from the pelagic species. Trolling is fairly easy, as once the spread is set, rods are placed in the rod holders in the gunwales and the boat just cruises at a six- to eight-knot pace dragging the lures, which makes them resemble a fleeing school of baitfish. It's a waiting game, as anglers anticipate the snap of the outriggers tripping and the tell-tale zing of a line off the reel, signifying the game is on.

Striped marlin and blue marlin, anywhere between 200 to 1,000 pounds, will attack a spread relentlessly, with their three-foot sword bills coming out of the water, smacking the trolled baits. Dorado — aka mahimahi and dolphinfish — can push the 40- to 50-pound mark in these waters and perform acrobatic jumps and line-ripping runs. Yellowfin tuna provide a knee-buckling battle, but they're well worth the fight, as they can be enjoyed as soon as you are back at the dock as the freshest sashimi. Wahoo offer up blistering runs that truly test the limits of rod and reel.

Another offshore tactic to target big game is jigging. If the captain marks species such as tuna or mahimahi on the fish-finder screen, he will take the engines out of gear and proceed to get the jigging rods out. Jigging is done with medium to large metal lures such as butterfly and tady jigs. The jig is dropped to the depth where the fish are marking, and the angler either reels the jig in as fast as he can, or the lure is worked with a swing to mimic a fluttering injured baitfish. Tuna are the main species to jig, but other species such as amberjack, mahimahi, grouper and snapper will also pounce on the offering.

Live-baiting is another offshore tactic to get the billfish biting. Baits such as live sardines can be obtained in the harbor off the local panga boats for a nominal fee and are used for tempting mahimahi, tuna and wahoo. Larger baits such as skipjack tuna and false albacore can be caught while trolling, then bridled to a hook with dental floss and sent back mainly in an attempt to trick the biggest of billfish, which can exceed 1,000 pounds. Offshore fishing is usually an all-day affair — 6 a.m. to 4 p.m. — as time is needed to run 40 to 50 miles offshore to get to the grounds where the billfish are feeding.



HUNGRY FOR MORE

Naturally formed submarine rockpiles line the coast of the Baja California peninsula, and bottom dwelling species hunker down within these rocks. Main targets when bottom fishing include grouper, jacks, roosterfish, cabrilla, snapper and triggerfish. Most times, bottom fishing can be done just beyond the breaking waves, but it can also extend for miles off the coastline. It all depends on where the rockpiles exist. Captains will anchor up or drift over submarine structure piles that include rocks and reefs in 50- to 200-foot depths. Generally, bottom fishing consists of bait fishing, as anglers drop cut-chunk baits of sardinas on bottom-fishing rigs equipped with an appropriate sinker weight of three to 10 ounces; long, 36-inch, 50-pound fluorocarbon leader: and a size 8/0 circle hook. Bottom fishing is guite easy, as the sinker weight bounces along the bottom, and the fish, keving in on the smell of fresh bait, pounce on the offering. Fishing can be fast and furious with plenty of action, as bottom fish species

usually hang in packs of hundreds at a time. Variety is a key component when bottom fishing, as you never quite know what will bite.

More adept anglers can try jigging when anchored or drifting, dropping metal jigs down and either bouncing them off the seafloor or reeling them up through the water column at a fast pace where fish see the fluttering flashy bait and assume it's a fleeing baitfish. Jigging triggers some vicious strikes from bottom fish.

BY THE SHORE

Easy to access and not as time-consuming, charter companies offer up shoreline trolling charters and drop lines right off the coastline around El Arco. Many submarine rockpiles and deep-water ledges rest only a few hundred feet from the beaches, and that provides enough cover for a variety of species to hang, including roosterfish, mackerel, rainbow runners, grouper and snapper. Most charters will troll deep diving plugs or live sardines, running parallel to the coastline up to the lighthouse and back. Shoreline trolling is the easiest way to experience Los Cabos fishing, as many small boating and panga charters operate off the marina, and fishing starts as soon as you leave the harbor.

Exciting visuals of the coxcombed fin of roosterfish breaking the water surface and chasing after the plugs can get the juices of even the most seasoned angler flowing. Huge red snapper and cabrilla come off the bottom and whack at the trolled plugs, bending rods and zipping lines off reels.

As a bonus, trolling the shoreline within sights of the rock formations at Land's End is enough to make the entire experience.

EXHILARATING ESCAPES

Cactus-lined mountainous backdrops, teeming aquamarine seas and hardscrabble arroyo pits — the Baja California peninsula beckons adventurists with a veritable playground of rugged beauty. In a split instant, visitors can immerse themselves in the revving of 4x4 engines, excited screams of zipliners or tranquil bubbling of scuba tanks. This part of the world seems custom-built for pushing limits. Water lovers descend upon the 45.75-square-mile Cabo Pulmo Marine Park — the only living coral reef in western North America — while land lovers trek far into Desert Park, the gateway to the 50,000-acre Cabo Real Ecological Preserve. No matter where you go or what you prefer, adventure abounds in Los Cabos.

Go Under. With exceptional underwater scenery, you'd be foolish not to don some fins and strap a mask to better explore the region's crown jewel: Cabo Pulmo National Marine Park. The depth here ranges from 25 to 70 feet, but visibility is incredibly clear, especially in the fall. This unique ecosystem supports more than 300 different species of tropical fish and over 2,000 marine invertebrates.

The shallow, protected waters of Santa María Bay and Chileno Bay can have you experiencing close encounters with schools of thousands of brilliant butterflyfish, and Land's End — where the Pacific Ocean converges







with the Sea of Cortés — exposes adventurers to friendly brushes with damselfish, pufferfish and queen angelfish, which often curiously inspect swimmers in their realm.

Get Deep. Dedicated scuba enthusiasts can hit any of the 14 dive sites located within Cabo Pulmo, as well as the surrounding dive spots in Cabo San Lucas Bay. Beginners can explore the 25- to 100-foot depths off Sand Falls, which offers the incomparable illusion of a waterfall beneath the waves — but this one is made of sand. With depths of 25 to 100 feet, Pelican Rock is dotted with curious blennies poking their heads out as tranquil hawksbill sea turtles glide past. Neptune's Finger, a rocky substrate teeming with cornet fish and banded guitarfish is also a great spot to explore.

More advanced divers should head to the Pinnacle and El Bajo. With their 50- to 80foot depths, they offer a greater possibility of encountering more offshore species, such as hammerhead sharks, mackerel and even tuna. Wreck enthusiasts should travel 28 miles to the site of *El Venecedor*, where memories are made while swimming among sharks and possibly even spying a marlin while exploring the shipwreck. Generally, water temperatures range from 75 to 85 degrees, and visibility at any of these dive sites can be as great as 30 to 50 feet, providing both a comfortable experience as well as an unobstructed view of aquatic life.

Destination management companies like Mexico Planners can make all the necessary arrangements — including transportation to and from your hotel — connecting you with reputable and service-oriented outfitters that know all the best dive spots and can provide all the equipment and guidance you need, as well as a meal or light snacks.

BETWEEN THE BURRITO SAFARIS, CAMEL RIDES AND HORSEBACK EXPEDITIONS, THERE IS NO SHORTAGE OF OPTIONS FOR EXPLORING LOS CABOS ON A MOUNT.

Surf's Up. Acapulquito — known to locals as Gringos or Old Man's break — offers a satisfying longboard wave for beginners, who can rent a board and also get some instruction at the Mike Doyle Surf School located at the Cabo Surf Hotel, right on the beach. Shipwrecks is an off-the-beaten-path break best accessed by four-wheel-drive vehicles, so it remains a local secret. Playa Cabo Real at km. 20 and Playa Cabo Bello between km. 5-6 are thoroughly satisfying destinations, too. Other fun breaks can be found along the East Cape, especially along the Costa Azúl corridor, including Zippers at km. 28-29, which has easy waist- to head-high sets.

The Pacific side of the Baja California peninsula is just as fresh. Car rental companies like Ten Car Rental open up options for exploring on your own. Don't miss out on the break at Los Cerritos, which lies in a scenic protected cove that generally pushes four- to six-foot waves.

Biking Along. For the ultimate workout, rent a mountain bike and set off for the Baja California Sur outback. Offering a complete sensory immersion, the trails will take you past rushing waterfalls, dusty arroyos and baked tracks with the absolute solitude and tranquility broken only by birdsong. Spy roadrunners as they scurry about the arid landscape, shy foxes trying to land their next meal and lazy lizards sunning themselves on wide boulders. Keep in mind that the best time to be on these trails is early in the morning — between 6 and 10 a.m. It is a desert after all. Beach Rides. Between the burrito safaris, camel rides and horseback expeditions you can arrange during your vacation in Los Cabos, there is no shortage of options for exploring the area on a mount. Select outfitters and destination management companies, such as Terramar Travel offer a varied roster of experiences that can be scheduled ahead of time via their booking site, BookCabo.com. While it comes as no surprise that you can go on a burrito tour through the Baja California Sur outback or that horseback tours on the beach can be combined with ATV tours through the saguaro cactus-lined arroyo pit trails, learning there are camels in this part of the world may come as a bit of a surprise. Stories abound as to how the camels came to live in the area, but given that the desert here is at about the same latitude as the Sahara Desert in Africa, and that there are other ecological similarities between the two places, the camels have taken to the region guite nicely.

Ply the Waters. Put in a little elbow grease and kayak through the placid waters at Twin Dolphin Beach, Santa María Bay or Chileno Bay. From your vantage point, you can peer down at the tropical habitats brimming with king angelfish, parrotfish and coral reefs. "Los Chopitos" is a locally known kayak spot, where you can explore a vibrant coral ecosystem. If you don't want to stray too far from the center of town, kayaks can be rented right in Médano Beach, at Marina Cabo San Lucas or from Mango Deck, where the excursions can be as simple as paddling around the harbor.

DISCOVER THE MAGIC OF TODOS SANTOS

ONE OF ONLY THREE MAGICAL TOWNS IN THE BAJA CALIFORNIA PENINSULA, TODOS SANTOS EXUDES A VITALITY THAT IS DOWNRIGHT ENCHANTING.

An hour outside Los Cabos, the coastal town of Todos Santos is a haven for artists, dreamers and those who live to create. Upon arrival, you'll find a Colonial city overlooking the Pacific that moves to a much slower rhythm than neighboring Los Cabos. Park beside the picturesque, yellow church downtown, and set out to explore the city's galleries, restaurants and shopping, all of which are infused with a hefty dose of creative expression.

Walking through Todos Santos is a joy in itself, with camera-worthy pastel buildings and historic façades around every corner. Still, the standout feature of the art scene is in the city's galleries, most of which line the cobblestone streets surrounding the downtown district. Some are housed in weathered, single-story, brick buildings, while others, such as in-home galleries where the artists live and work, offer more intimate settings. On any given day in Todos Santos, vou can visit a dozen or more studios where you're likely to meet the artists and hear a bit about their latest projects. You may even hear the story behind what brought them to town in the first place or why they never left.

The galleries feature a variety of artistic disciplines including painting, sculpture, photography, ceramics, mixed media and





glass art. A few notable galleries are the Galeria de Todos Santos, a beautiful, welllit space featuring the work of owner-artist Michael Cope, along with other handselected artists.

The Gabo Art Gallery — an appointment only establishment — features playful, colorful pieces that have traveled extensively across Mexico, the U.S. and Europe. Galeria Logan stars Jill Logan's dreamlike Baja California Sur-inspired works that feel alive with a wash of color, form and emotion. Finally, Galeria Arturo, home of long-time local artist Arturo Mendoza Elfeo, and Ezra Katz Gallery, home to the plein-air and studio impressionist painter, are requisite stops.

The galleries in Todos Santos aren't limited to paint and canvas. View astounding sculptures made of wood, bronze and stone at Benito Ortega's studio where he creates compelling, sea-inspired pieces.

If glass art is your thing, call ahead to visit Wendy Faith at Las Casitas for a chance to see her architectural-quality art glass, objects d'art and a line of kiln worked silverware. Finally, a short drive from downtown is Galeria N.E. Hayles, where you can take art classes on mosaics, abstracts and more.

Artistry in Todos Santos extends well beyond galleries. Bar and restaurant Jardin Alquimia treats guests to rotating art installations displayed upon the walls of its tunneled-entryway, in addition to serving delicious craft cocktails. Besame Mucho Bazaar — a sprawling, multi-room space carries unique jewelry, furniture and gifts.

A weekend stay in this wonderful town leads you to yet another well of creativity.

The legendary Hotel California, with its vibrant décor and festive scenery, treats guests to live music at the hotel's lively bar, and Guaycura Boutique Hotel Beach Club & Spa houses a private collection of contemporary art.

Nearly every street in Todos Santos offers something different. Down one road you'll find silversmiths, on another, a boutique selling small-batch mezcals. There are shops stacked with woven rugs, fashion stores with one-ofa-kind garments and coffee shops with beans from local Baja California Sur roasters.

As Hotel San Cristobal itself claims, some of the best destinations are actually found at the end of long dirt roads. If you want to take your artistic adventure off road — and take a turn away from the visual arts, too — the hotel hosts a series of cultural events.

Farther down the road, just south of Playa Los Cerritos — a beach frequented by surfers — is Art & Beer, a bar, restaurant, gallery and sculpture garden. Combined, it makes for one strangely delightful sensory experience. If you make this final pit stop, and I recommend you do, take a look at the outdoor sculptures among the towering cardon cacti as the bartender makes your drink; then head straight to the second-story patio to get a good seat for a view of the sunset.

Like one final painting, the sky puts on an incomparable show, glowing in shape-shifting shades of orange and red over the Pacific. Within that magic hour and the stillness of the surrounding desert, I hope you feel as inspired as many others who have traveled this same road.

INSIDER TIPS

GET A LITTLE BACKGROUND INFO

LOCATION: At the tip of Baja California Sur, Los Cabos is approximately 1,000 miles south of San Diego, just south of the Tropic of Cancer. Los Cabos actually refers to two towns: Cabo San Lucas and San José del Cabo.

POPULATION: Approximately 288,000 people live in Los Cabos.

CLIMATE: It's a subtropical desert. During the summer, the highs can reach 90° F with sporadic showers. Winter evenings may drop to 60° F, with daytime highs near 80° F. TIME ZONE: Los Cabos is on Mountain Time (MT), which is one hour later than Pacific Time.

LANGUAGE: Spanish is the official language of Mexico, but English is widely spoken by those in the hospitality industry in Los Cabos.

ELECTRICITY: 120 volts/60 hertz. Electrical outlets are the same as those used in the U.S.

BANKS AND CURRENCY: The official unit of currency is the Mexican peso (MXN), but the U.S. dollar (USD) is widely accepted. All major Mexican national banks are represented here and are usually open weekdays from 8 a.m. to 4 p.m. Many locations have ATMs that accept U.S. bank cards the same way they do in the U.S. Transaction fees may be higher, and some ATMs can dispense both Mexican pesos and U.S. dollars. While you can exchange dollars for pesos at the airport, many hotels or at any bank, banks usually have the best rates. Credit cards are welcome at most major restaurants and hotels. When using your credit card, the statement total will appear in pesos at the exchange rate posted on that day.

EXCHANGE RATE: At press time, one Mexican peso equaled .049 U.S. dollar. This



rate changes regularly. Check what the rate is when you are ready to travel and once you arrive.

COMMUNICATION: Most major wireless carriers offer packages that provide messaging, calling and data services at reasonable rates. Check with your provider and ask about roaming rates in Mexico, international package options and other travel-related services prior to your trip. The Internet works quite well throughout Los Cabos, and Wi-Fi is a standard amenity at a number of businesses and most hotels and resorts, so Skype, FaceTime, Whatsapp and other Wi-Fi–enabled apps are a cost-effective way to stay connected.

To call the U.S. from your U.S. cell phone, dial 00 + 1 + area code + phone number. To

call locally to landlines, just dial the seven-digit phone number. To call locally to local cell phones (within the same area code), dial 044 + phone number. To call Mexico outside of Los Cabos, dial 01 + area code + phone number.

PUBLIC HOLIDAYS: Mexico celebrates a number of public holidays annually. Except for banks and government offices being closed, your vacation plans should not be disrupted because of them.

TAXIS: To get from one town to the other, you can expect to pay between \$50 and \$60. Red and yellow taxi vans operate in San José del Cabo; blue and green vans cruise Cabo San Lucas. They are available 24 hours a day and are never far. Those who like to do like the locals can hop on a public bus. They run between both towns regularly and cost \$2 to \$3, depending on the exchange rate. Accounting for stops at major hotels along The Corridor, the ride takes about an hour.

AIRPORT TRAVEL DETAILS: To enter Mexico, you will need a valid passport. All foreign travelers must pass through immigration and

customs. Once you have have been cleared by immigration officials, collect your luggage and proceed to customs where you will push a button on something that looks a lot like a traffic light; if the light turns red, your luggage has been selected for inspection. After getting through customs and immigration, you may be greeted by time-share sales people eager for your attention. Unless you've arranged pickup with your hotel, yellow and white mini shuttles are a good option. They are less expensive than taxis, but they won't depart unless full, so you may have to wait a few minutes.

Cab drivers and other pre-arranged transportation providers will be waiting outside the building to take you to your destination.

Just 20 minutes north of San José del Cabo, the Los Cabos International Airport (SJD), services more than 400 domestic, international and private flights weekly. At press time, the following airlines offered flights to Los Cabos: Aeroméxico, Air Canada, AirTransat, Alaska Airlines, American Airlines, Delta, Frontier, Interjet, Spirit Airlines, Southwest Airlines, Sun Country Airlines, Sunwing, United Airlines, Virgin America, VivaAerobús, Volaris and WestJet.

Nonstop flights and connections to Los Cabos are available from numerous cities across the U.S., including Atlanta; Charlotte; Chicago; Dallas/Fort Worth; Denver; Detroit; Houston; Kansas City, Mo.; Minneapolis; Newark; Phoenix; Salt Lake City and Seattle. From California, there are flights and connections available from Los Angeles, Orange County, San Diego, San Francisco and San Jose. From Canada, there are flights available from Calgary, Edmonton, Kelowna, Toronto, Vancouver and Winnipeg. The smaller, less frequented airport Cabo San Lucas International Airport (CSL) services mostly private aircraft. It is located just 10 minutes away from downtown Cabo San Lucas.
