MORNING

Walk the pier with the kids, watching the surfers and looking for dolphins. Breakfast at the **Hyatt Regency Huntington Beach Resort & Spa's Watertable** (the kids love the chocolate chip pancakes). If we can carve out some alone time, have a couple's massage at **Pacific Waters Spa** at the Hyatt. Hike the 1,300-acre **Bolsa Chica Ecological Reserve** (home to 200 bird species).

LUNCH

solita Huntington Beach in the Bella Terra retail center for lunch. The Grande Casa Noble Margarita is a must. The Vampiro tacos are our favorite, and the kids can't get enough duros. Walk off lunch downtown, stop by Zero Zero 39 Pizzaria for an espresso shot and share pistachio ricotta pie and then stroll to Shellie's favorite store, Free People in Pacific City.

AFTERNOON

Stop by the **Huntington Beach Central Library** before the kids' soccer practice at the **Huntington Beach Sports Complex** or take the kids to one of our great city parks.

EVENING

Order pizza from **Johnny's Saloon and Pizzeria** on Beach Boulevard or maybe pick up from **Sushi on Fire** on Main Street. Cap off the night by going to a movie at Bella Terra with the kids.



LYNETTE ROMERO

A longtime reporter and weekend anchor for KTLA 5 Morning News, Lynette is also a Huntington Beach restaurateur, having opened Jimboy's Tacos on 5th Street last year with her husband.



MORNING

A sunrise walk on the pier and beach. "Put one toe in the sand and you're in paradise," Lynette says. Then a delicious breakfast at the unassuming **HB Corner Market** on 11th Street. A visit to downtown's **Huntington Beach International Surfing Museum** and a stroll down Main Street.

LUNCH

Grab an ocean-view table at **Duke's** at the pier, enjoy the great menu and watch the surfers in the water and volleyball players on the sand. "This is my favorite Huntington Beach restaurant (next to Jimboy's Tacos)," Lynette says.

AFTERNOON

Let the family's two rescue dogs, Lulu and Benny, run wild at world-famous **Huntington Dog Beach**, just north of the pier. Window shop and get a bite to eat at trendy **Pacific City** retail and dining center, just south of the pier.

EVENING

Drinks at Pacific Hideaway in the Kimpton Shorebreak
Resort or, especially at sunset, the Offshore 9 Rooftop
Lounge overlooking the Pacific on the 9th floor of The Twin
Dolphin Tower at The Waterfront Beach Resort, a Hilton
Hotel. Early dinner at Ways & Means Oyster House in Pacific
City (Lynette wakes up at 2 a.m. for her morning news job).

"There's no other community like Huntington Beach," Lynette says. "It's heaven."









JASMINE ROTH

A Huntington Beach resident,
Jasmine has her own hit show on
HGTV called "Hidden Potential,"
where she transforms homes
from cookie-cutter to custom
through clever design tailored to
the homeowners' specific needs.

"Everyone I know is on the #lovewhereyoulive bandwagon, but let's be honest: Huntington Beach really is the best,"

Jasmine says. "Every day here is pretty great, but here's what my ultimate, most perfect, unicorn-of-a-Huntington Beach day would look like."

MORNING

Wake up EARLY, throw leashes on my dogs, and jog across Pacific Coast Highway to the walking path that spans the entire length of Huntington Beach. Heading north, I find myself at **Huntington Dog Beach**, where my English bulldog (who loves to swim) and my rescue chihuahua (who loves anything stinky) can play to their heart's content. Then it's straight back to Main Street for an açaí bowl from **Banzai Bowls**, and a much-needed stop into **The Dirty Dog Wash**. Here I bathe my pups in vintage clawfoot tubs and dry them with fluffy towels.

MIDDAY

WalkBack home, my husband and I jump on our bikes and head to our friend's brewery, **Riip Beer Co.**, to taste their newest IPA. Then we head to **Pacific City** to get in a little shopping (think **Urban Outfitters**, **H&M**, and lots of cute local shops).

EVENING

Walk to the end of the pier (a quarter mile to the end) and see the sun dip below the horizon. Afterward, a quick stop to see what's new at **Main Street Wine Company**, and it's off to dinner with friends at **Cucina Alessa**. Did somebody say meatballs? Eat good food. Walk home. Fall asleep to the sound of the waves. And there you have it. Best. Day. Ever.

MORNING

Early morning walk at **Bolsa Chica State Beach** near **SeaLegs at the Beach** gourmet concession stand to watch our kids catch a few waves. Then take our sweet dog, JJ, to **Park Bench Café** in **Central Park** for an amazing breakfast, complete with peanut butter puppies for JJ. After breakfast, take JJ for a nice long walk in the park.

LUNCH

Getting ready for some fun in **Huntington Harbour**, we have a yummy lunch at **Fish Camp** in Sunset Beach followed by stand-up paddle boarding in the stunning and peaceful harbor. "In our business, we cruise around Huntington Harbour hundreds of times each year and never tire of it," Doug says. "In fact, we often spend our days out there."

AFTERNOON

Take a walk down Main Street for some family ice cream time at **The Funnel House** and head to the beach near the pier for some relaxing fun in the sand and surf.

DINNER

WalkSit at a window table at one of our favorite restaurants, **Bluegold** in **Pacific City** to watch the sunset over the Pacific, sip one of their specialty drinks (try The Sand Lot) and enjoy an amazing meal (the wild salmon can't be beat).

"We are lucky to live in one of our favorite vacation spots!" Donna says.

A 42-year resident of Huntington Beach, Meg is the North America regional manager of the World Surf League (WSL).

MORNING

A 7 a.m. breakfast at **Bread Crumb Ohana Cafe** on Beach Boulevard. The Hawaiian bread French toast with a side of fruit and fresh-brewed coffee is the perfect way to start the morning. Afterward, straight to **Huntington Central Park** to walk off the delicious breakfast. Twice around the path is three miles! Then a quick run next door through **Armstrong Garden Centers** to pick up a few flowering plants to brighten up my garden.

LUNCH

Relax at a sidewalk table at Jan's Health Bar on Main Street. The Surf Shop Special, a half tuna sandwich, salad, and chips, with a raspberry date smoothie has been my favorite since high school. Stroll down Main Street and pick up my mail at the historic Beach Center Station Post Office on the corner of Olive Street. Grab a cup of coffee at Java Point just inside Huntington Surf & Sport, and continue across Pacific Coast Highway to walk the Huntington Beach Pier and watch the locals catch some afternoon surf.

EVENING

WalkDrinks and dinner at **BLK Earth Sea Spirits** at sunset. Love the view and the brussels sprouts appetizer. Quick stop at **Lucci's Deli** to pick up a decadent dessert for late-night munching. Finish off the night at **Fitzgerald's Irish Pub** for live music, drinks, and pool.

"If want to immerse yourself in surf culture, Huntington Beach truly is Surf City USA" Meg says. "But dig a little deeper, and you'll find something for everyone to experience and enjoy."






10 SURPRISING THINGS

About Huntington Beach

Huntington Beach is chock full of hidden gems, from speakeasies to nature nooks and a beach dedicated to dogs. Here are some of our favorite unexpected experiences that both visitors and locals love.

1. Hidden Hotspots

Everyone knows Ruby's at the end of our iconic Huntington Beach Pier, but did you know that a quick climb to the second floor will put you inside a bamboo beach hut? Complete with authentic tiki-inspired decor and tropical cocktails, Jan & Dean's Tiki Lounge—yes, that's Jan Berry and Dean Torrence, the pioneering music duo behind "Surf City"-opened last year and offers Ruby's standard menu, on-theme appetizers like huli-huli wings, mini ahi tacos, and Dole whip for dessert-not to mention stunning views of the Pacific Ocean and Huntington Beach shoreline. Behind a bookshelf inside Saint Marc at Pacific City, Blind Pig, aka The Speakeasy, serves up the restaurant's menu plus cocktails by their skilled mixologist. Visitors are limited to 90 minutes inside this cozy clandestine watering hole, with options to extend. Also at Pacific City, LSXO, a sophisticated hideaway inside Bluegold, transports diners to colonial Saigon, plating a French Vietnamese menu and hosting afternoon tea.

2. Bonfire Butlers



Three of Huntington Beach's distinct beaches house fire pits, and three of our luxury oceanfront resorts offer bonfire packages that make the quintessential Southern California experience effortless. Paséa Hotel & Spa's hour-long bonfire nights experience includes a chauffeured round trip ride between the hotel and the beach—courtesy of a Paséa beach butler and pedicab—a private fire pit, and a sweet s'mores kit bundle for four. The Waterfront Beach Resort, a Hilton Hotel boasts a comprehensive menu of bonfire packages, from several poolside options at its new Driftwood Beach Club to the standard beach adventure. The Hyatt Regency Huntington Beach Resort & Spa's beach bonfire packages include a personal fire pit, firewood, chairs, blankets, hot chocolate, and, of course, s'mores.









3. Huntington Dog Beach

Day meetups in the spring and fall.



4. Bolsa Chica Ecological Reserve

Huntington Beach is home to the largest saltwater marsh between the Monterey Bay and the Tijuana River Estuary, Birders flock here to explore the 1,400-acre reserve, where more than 300 bird species have been spotted. Visit the Bolsa Chica Wetlands Interpretive Center off Warner Avenue and Pacific Coast Highway, then head out to hike the five miles of trails. Free tours are available on select weekends. A stroll, jog, or cycle along the trails affords visitors sightings of feathered friends like hawks and herons, furry inhabitants including coyotes and rabbits, scaly residents such as snakes and lizards, and marine life like fish, sharks, and rays.

5. Old World Village

Settled inside this Bavarian utopia is a mishmash of international eateries and shops—and one of Orange County's best Oktoberfests. A stroll through the village sees visitors stocking up on traditional German bites at the newly remodeled Euro Market, Bakery & Deli, sipping traditional Turkish coffee at The Coffee Tale, perusing Turkish trinkets at Anatolian Gift Shop, relaxing with a cup of Pacific Islands kava at boho-fabulous Mystic Water Kava Bar, learning healthy living at The Living Temple, nibbling on authentic French crêpes and quiche at Crème de la Crêpe, rooting for their favorite Dachshund from the beer garden during monthly Running of the Wieners races, and so much more. Uptown Nights launches in Spring 2019, bringing a weekly Thursday night market with live entertainment to the streets of Old World.

6. Happy City USA

Huntington Beach ranks among the 10 happiest cities in the United States, according to WalletHub, which looked at 28 key indicators of happiness that ranged from the local climate, to residents' emotional health and satisfaction, to average leisure time spent per day. So when in Huntington Beach - don't worry, be happy!









7. Secret Garden

Inside the 350-acre Huntington Beach Central Park behind the library awaits this "secret" oasis, home to drought-tolerant plants, blooming flowers, and fluttering butterflies. Hundreds of volunteers have worked to revitalize the lush xeriscape—a landscape requiring little or no irrigation—creating sustainable picture-perfect worlds like the dry stream bed, storybook area, and butterfly garden.

8. Historic Walking Tours

History buffs rejoice! A little-known fact about Huntington Beach and its northern pocket Sunset Beach: There's a lot of history here! Self-guided walking tours of Historic Downtown Huntington Beach (1.5-mile loop) and Sunset Beach (1.2 miles) lead through more than a century of beach-town nostalgia. Grab free foldable maps from one of three locations—the Visitor Information Kiosk at the foot of the Huntington Beach Pier, the welcome center at the Huntington Beach International Surfing Museum, or the Visit Huntington Beach office—and immerse yourself in our fascinating local lore.

9. SeaLegs at the Beach

California's "first and only" live music venue on the sand entertains right here at Bolsa Chica State Beach. An eclectic lineup rocks the salty sea air every summer, paired with the upscale beach concession's wine, beer, and savory bites. Look for regular weekly beats like Reggae Sundays, plus new movie nights come Summer 2019.

10. The Tombstone Behind the Gas Station

One of Surf City's strangest monuments, a 500-pound faux tombstone sits behind the Arco gas station at Warner Avenue and Springdale Street. A developer had proposed a 94-foot Frank Lloyd Wright Jr.-designed sign tower (which would resemble an oil derrick as a tribute to Huntington Beach's black gold history) on that spot in the 1960s, but local citizens revolted and the project was shot down. In 1970, the bitter developer planted the tombstone, which bitterly read, in part, "Its defeat is symbolic of the democratic process in which we live."

In addition to the world's best surfers, the nine-day event includes world-class skateboarding and BMX competitions, movie premieres, retail and art exhibitions, and product demos and samples from your favorite action sports brands. Celebrating 60 years!

Surf City Surf Dog Competition

(Saturday, Sept. 28, 2019) Dog surFURs—some from as far away as Australia—ride the waves at this fun-filled event that runs from 8:30 a.m. to 2:30 p.m. Plus, tons of family-friendly activities.





SURFLINE: A SURF CITY USA ORIGINAL

One reason Huntington Beach is Surf City USA: it's the hometown of Surfline. Founded in 1985 as a call-in surf and weather report service (a hit from the start, it received over 6,000 calls in its first month), the company evolved into the world's premier surf forecasting service.

Then-owner Sean Collins—a surfer, sailor, and self-taught surfing meteorologist—predicted marine conditions so accurately that lifeguards, the National Weather Service, and multiple domestic and international governmental agencies began using them.

In 1995, during the internet's infancy, the company went online, and a year later it used the Huntington Beach Pier to set up the first live surf camera. Surfline now has more than 200 surf cams worldwide (including 12 that cover Huntington Beach), providing surfers the ability to check the surf before heading to the beach. 5 WAYS TO MAKE THE MOST OUT OF SURF CITY'S WATER AND WEATHER FIND WHAT'S SUP!The ocean can be too rough for stand-up paddleboard (SUP) novices, but placid Huntington Harbour offers smooth sailing even for first-timers. Choose from several SUP rental outfits serving Huntington Harbour, including OEX Sunset Beach, Sunset Kayak Rentals, and Huntington Harbour Boat Rentals. Local tip: Make sure you wear a leash to easily retrieve your board if you fall off.

2 HIT THE SURF. As the name implies, Surf City USA is a great place to learn how to surf. Huntington Beach has eight surf schools: Clint Carroll Surf School, HB Surf School, Surf Academy Collective, Toes on the Nose, Zack's Surf School, all within walking distance of the pier; plus Banzai Surf School at Huntington State Beach and Corky Carroll's Surf School and Salty Grom Surf Camp at Bolsa Chica State Beach. Local tip: Surfing takes many forms. Beginners may have more fun renting a bodyboard and jumping into the waves.







3 BE YOUR OWN CAPTAIN. Take the helm by renting an electric Duffy boat at Huntington Harbour Boat Rentals.

These vessels seat up to a dozen people and take no experience to drive. Set sail and enjoy a unique view of picturesque Huntington Harbour. Local tip: If you want a captain for your ship, book a private charter on a classic wooden boat (seats up to 12) or a luxury vintage yacht (up to 30) from Prince Charters to tour Huntington Harbour and enjoy local craft beer and wine.

4 PADDLE THROUGH PARADISE.

Piloting a kayak from OEX Sunset Beachor Sunset Kayak Rentals in Huntington Harbour gives you waterfront access to one of Southern California's most picturesque neighborhoods, where stunning homes and boats of all sizes line the canals. Local tip: Huntington Harbour, built in the mid-1960s, is home to five manmade islands, which feature more than 500 bayfront homes.

GO FISH. Huntington Beach is a saltwater fisherman's dream, with 10 miles of coast, a quarter-mile-long pier (rentals available at Let's Go Fishing on the pier), deep-sea fishing options (Breakaway Sportfishing Charters, Golden State Sportfishing, and Belle Charters), two fresh-water fishing holes (Huntington and Talbert lakes in Central Park) and beach grunion runs on some spring and summer nights (check www.wildlife.ca.gov for dates of expected runs). Local tip: California has many rules regulating fishing, including required licenses. Check out www.wildlife. ca.gov for details.

THEY'LL INSPIRE YOU TO DREAM AND DO IN HUNTINGTON BEACH

MEAH COLLINS, Surfer

Meah Collins, the 19-yearold daughter of a former professional surfer, honed her wave-riding skills at the Huntington Beach pier starting at age 8.

"I have been surfing the pier since I was little," she says, "and I know most all the older locals out there, so it feels like home."

Now as a professional ranked in the top 50 in the world, Collins surfs exotic locales around the globe, providing her with the perfect job.

"I get to see new places, eat new foods, meet new people, experience different cultures, and do what I love to do as a career," she says.

Still, Surf City remains a special place for her.

"My favorite thing about Huntington Beach is that it actually pays attention to surfing and makes it a big part of its community," she says. "I always feel welcomed as a surfer."

COURTNEY CONLOGUE, Surfer

One of Surf City's most successful pro surfers, Courtney Conlogue won the biggest surf contest in the world—the U.S. Open of Surfing—at her home break, the Huntington Beach pier, in 2009. She was all of 17.

Nearly a decade later, in 2018, she again captured first place at the Van's U.S. Open of Surfing in Huntington Beach. This was hardly a surprise for one of the top women surfers in the world. In 2015 and 2016, Conlogue surfed herself to a No. 2 international ranking.

Conlogue's connection to Surf City started at six years of age when her father took her for a walk on the pier to check out the surfers.

"Everything looked so grand," she says. "I was in awe. I couldn't wait to be out there surfing with the guys."

As a role model, Conlogue has some hard-earned advice to younger surfers who now look up to her: "Never give up. Sometimes it's not always easy to believe anything is possible, but you need to keep working to achieve your goal. Strive to be that best version of yourself all the time."

KERRI WALSH JENNINGS, Beach Volleyball Player

For Kerri Walsh Jennings, arguably the greatest beach volleyball player—man or woman—of all-time, Huntington Beach holds a special place in her heart, beginning at 10 years of age when the Northern California native and her brother went through the city's world-renowned junior lifeguard program, despite being intimated by the size of the waves.

"They were huge to us!" Kerri says.

After graduating from Stanford University in 2001, she moved to Surf City, where one magical day she tried out for volleyball legend Misty May (they would go on to form a dream team that would dominate the sport for more than a decade and win three Olympic gold medals) and met her future husband, pro beach volleyball player Casey Jennings.

"Huntington Beach represents the start of my adult life and







of my life and dreams on the beach volleyball court," Kerri Walsh Jennings says. "The community, the lifestyle, the love of all things fun, surf, wellness and beach life are forever in my heart. It is a bit of a homecoming every time I return."

Today at 40, Jennings is still one of the top players in the world. In 2016, she and April Ross captured the bronze medal at the Rio Olympics, and now she's training with a new partner for the 2020 Olympics.

And last year, Jennings and her husband launched the p1440 series, a lifestyle and fitness festival, which had a stop in Huntington Beach—the latest way she serves as a role model.

"I hope people are reminded of the inherent strength and capabilities they hold within," Jennings says. "I hope that people are inspired to be curious about their potential and about their ability to create the life of their dreams."

JERICHO POPPLER, Surfer

Jericho Poppler's legacy as an action sports champion is enshrined in Huntington Beach's Surfing Walk of Fame on Main Street. The sport of surfing owes much to this female professional water sports pioneer, who continues to inspire young athletes today.

Now 69, she raised the profile of women's surfing through a decade of championship titles in the 70s, including the U.S. Surfing Championships in Huntington Beach and a signature Jericho Poppler surfboard made by legendary shaper Robert August. And her tireless advocacy to raise the status of women surfers

resulted in the co-founding of the Women's International Surfing Assn. in 1974, codirecting the first Women's International Professional Surfing Championships and developing the Women's Professional Surfing Coalition.

Out of the water, the Surfing Hall of Famer stood at the forefront of the environmental movement to protect the world's oceans, serving on the board of the Surfrider Foundation and creating the "Jericho's Kids for Clean Waves" surf contest for children under 16 years of age.

SARAH THOMPSON, Skateboarder

Sarah Thompson first came to Surf City as a kid to surf and enjoy the fiery magic of beach bonfires. And when she moved to Huntington Beach at 15, she found her adopted hometown to be the perfect setting to chase her dreams of becoming a professional skateboarder.

"Huntington Beach is so accepting of non-traditional dreams," she says. "Where I lived [previously] in Anaheim, teachers and my peers thought I was a joke to pursue skating. There are more opportunities here."

The 21-year-old has reached her goal of becoming a professional skateboarder and now serves as a role for younger skaters. She practices daily her mantra of hard work by balancing studies, work and skating—even as she recovered from serious concussions.

"You're going to have to work harder than everyone else," she says, "but you're going to appreciate your wins so much more."

JUST BEACHY

Huntington Beach's main attraction is courtesy of Mother Nature: five sandy beaches and world-class surf stretched out along 10 miles of coastline







HERE ARE 5 PRICELESS SURF CITY ACTIVITIES FOR THE FAMILY

1) ARRR! PLAY LIKE A PIRATE

Of course, Surf City beaches are the No. 1 free for families, and can your kids imagine anything better than playing on a pirate ship with the Pacific Ocean behind you? Huntington Beach's new All-Inclusive Beach Playground, located on the sand at 9th Street just north of the Huntington Beach Pier, offers the ultimate pirate experience for children of all abilities, including those in wheelchairs.

2) SKATE LIKE A PRO

Vans opened its free Off the Wall Skatepark in 2014, featuring a 42,500-squarefoot concrete paradise for skateboarders. Renovation completed in Spring 2019 that allows it to host pro events. Afterward, hit up neighboring, skate-themed Grinderz for tasty burgers, fries, and beer.

3) BUILD A BONFIRE

Huntington Beach may be the beach bonfire capital of the world. You can find concrete fire rings at Huntington
State Beach, Huntington
City Beach, and Bolsa Chica
State Beach. Bring your own firewood (available at beach concessions and nearby stores), blanket, and chairs—oh, and s'mores.

4) SING (AND DANCE) TO LIVE MUSIC AT THE BEACH

On Sundays from July through September, the Huntington Beach International Surfing Museum hosts live surf music and rock 'n' roll from 11 a.m. to 5:30 p.m. at Pier Plaza's amphitheater on the beach (just north of the pier). Also, Pacific City features free summer concerts, and the Central Park bandstand is the site of the summer Huntington Beach Concert Band Series on Sunday evenings.









5) GET BACK TO NATURE

The Huntington Beach Wetlands Conservancy's Interpretive Center on the corner of Pacific Coast Highway and Newland Street includes a large wetlands diorama, educational displays on the ecological role of coastal wetlands, and a interactive display on diagnosing and caring for sick and injured wildlife. A few miles south, guided tours of the Bolsa Chica Ecological Reserve take place the first Saturday of the month (9 to 10:30 a.m.). Check out the Bolsa Chica Interpretive Center (9 a.m. to 4 p.m. daily) to learn more about one of California's largest coastal wetlands.

OTHER WALLET-FRIENDLY, FAMILY-FRIENDLY ACTIVITIES

Bounce over to **Get Air Surf City** for indoor trampoline fun. Kids can also jump on the fun at **Pump It Up**, a bounce-house paradise. **GlowZone** shines with bowling, arcade games, minigolf, a laser maze, and a ninja course. For movies under the summer stars, **Beachfront Cinema** screens box-office hits on the sand at Huntington State Beach, and **Pacific City** shows free outdoor movies on its upper deck on Wednesdays at 7 p.m. And for the simplest form of fun in Surf City USA, buy a kite at **Kite Connection** on Main Street, walk to the beach, and let it fly.



8 WAYS to explore California's CENTRAL PARK

ADVENTURES OF ALL KINDS AWAIT WITHIN THE SPRAWLING 350 ACRES IN THE HEART OF HUNTINGTON BEACH

LET YOUR KID BE A KID. During summer months, Adventure Playground provides children, ages 5 to 12, with old-fashioned fun: build forts, pay in mud, raft in a small pond, hang out in a treehouse. Fun fact: This is one of only two Adventure Playgrounds in Orange County.

2 LET YOUR DOG BE A DOG. Central Park's Dog Park is something to bark about: two separate areas for big and small dogs, toys, water, snacks, and benches for owners. Fun fact: This bark park has a Dog Walk of Fame.

3 GET BACK TO NATURE. The 18-acre Shipley Nature Center provides a natural oasis within Central Park: walking trails, butterfly and hummingbird gardens, redwood trees, meadows, a freshwater wetland, and a lot more. Fun fact: More than 20 animal species have been spotted at the center.

4 TAKE A STROLL BY THE LAKE. Central Park's two main bodies of water—Huntington and Talbert lakes—are encircled by exercise trails and benches at water's edge. Take the helm of a model boat or go fishing (license needed if 16 years of age or older). Fun fact: The lakes are stocked with catfish in the summer and rainbow trout in the winter.

5 FUEL UP. Central Park boasts three restaurants that are local favorites: Kathy May's Lakeview Cafe (breakfast and lunch spot on the shore of Huntington Lake), Park Bench Cafe (breakfast and lunch, mostly outdoor seating), and HB Outdoor BBQ & Snacks. Fun fact: Park Bench Cafe is pet-friendly and offers 'canine cuisine' - a special menu for pets.

6 CHECK OUT A BOOK (OR TWO). The hundreds of thousands of books at Huntington Beach Central Library are only the start. Among other things, the library hosts authors' festivals, children's storytime, and a genealogy collection. Fun fact: Cardholders can pick up three free packets of seeds each month.

THROW OUT A DISC. Central Park offers the Pebble Beach of disc golf courses with an 18-hole layout designed in 1977. It's fun for the whole family in a picturesque setting. Rentals and lessons are available. Fun fact: Bring your best friend on this dog-friendly course.

3 GET PHYSICAL. Central Park's **World Trail** exercise course provides a challenging workout with 18 exercise stations spaced over a 1.2-mile loop. Each station provides suggested exercises to improve strength and cardiovascular fitness. Fun fact: The loop begins and ends at the Park Bench Cafe—the perfect pre- or post-workout meal.

















1) **Huntington Beach's oldest building**—now called the Newland Museum House—was built in 1889 as a Queen Annestyle home by pioneers William and May Newland, farmers who settled here on 500 acres.

over the past two centuries: Rancho Los Nietos, Shell Beach, Smeltzer, Gospel Swamp (for the revival meetings held in the late 1800s), Fairview, and, in 1901, Pacific City — a resort that developers boasted would rival Atlantic City — before finally becoming Huntington Beach.

3) In 1909, Huntington Beach was incorporated with 215 residents. Its namesake was railroad mogul Henry Huntington, who brought the Pacific Electric Railway through the city.


4) In 1914, Hawaiian George Freeth, who helped introduced surfing to California, road the waves at the opening of the new Huntington Beach Pier, planting the first seeds for Surf City USA. Eleven years later, Olympic gold medalist and Hawaiian legend Duke Kahanamoku hit the Huntington Beach surf on his redwood surfboard.


5) Land in Huntington Beach was so cheap in

the 1910s that an encyclopedia company gave away free lots with a purchase of a complete set of the research books. Those encyclopedia-lot owners struck it rich when oil was discovered on their property.

6) Huntington Beach turned into a boomtown in 1920 when California's largest oil deposit at the time was

found. In less than a month, the city's population jumped from 1,500 to 5,000 and oil rigs lined the coastline.









7) Gordie Duane laid claim to the city's first surf shop, Gordie's Surf Boards, in 1956, but a year later, Jack's Surfboards opened and today remains a major surf retailer at the corner of Pacific Coast Highway and Main Street.

8) The first West Coast Surfing Championships

were held in Huntington Beach in 1959. The next year, the first televised championships cemented the city's reputation as a surfer's paradise. Now called the U.S. Open of Surfing, it celebrates its 60th anniversary in 2019.

9) In 1963, Jan & Dean recorded the classic surf tune, "Surf City." In 1991, Dean Torrence, a local resident, was

one of the advocates who successfully lobbied for what's now Huntington Beach's official nickname, Surf City USA.

10) In 1970, Huntington Beach was the fastest growing city in the U.S., fueled by families with baby boomers drawn to the locale, weather, and nearby jobs.

11) In 1992, more than a half-million people

attended the opening of the rebuilt pier destroyed years earlier by winter storms.

12) In 2000, the Surf City Marathon (then called the Pacific Shoreline Marathon) had a modest debut with less than 600 finishers. Today, the race along the coast on Super Bowl Sunday covers a variety of distances and attracts more than 17,000 runners from all 50 states and 30 countries.

13) Huntington Beach's retail and entertainment landscape gets a boost in 2006 with the

opening of the outdoor Bella Terra shopping center (on the site of the 1960s-vintage Huntington Center) and again in 2015 with the debut of the cutting-edge Pacific City center in downtown.

Take the self-guided walking tour of Historic Downtown Huntington Beach. It will lead you through more than a century of beach town nostalgia. Stop by the Visitor Information Kiosk or visit www.SurfCityUSA/history for the tour.







In Huntington Beach, op-paw-tunities for dogs are plentiful. Here's how they can experience a little slice of doggy heaven on their Surf City USA vacation.

HIT THE BEACH. Unique to Orange County, Dog Beach (off Pacific Coast Highway between Seapoint and 21st streets) allows your best friend to play off the leash in the sand and surf.

PARK IT. Central Park's **Best Friend Dog Park** provides separate areas for dogs of all sizes.

CHOW DOWN. The Park Bench Cafe in Central Park caters to the canine crowd (in addition to their owners) with such tongue-wagging favorites as Peanut Butter Bone. Your dog will naturally love Local Pet Market, stocked with organic pet food along with toys. In addition to breakfast and lunch sandwiches, the Sit Stay Cafe serves up organic dog biscuits with a bowl of water on the side. For dessert, follow the scent to Top Dog Barkery for a variety of treats (plus barkday parties, muttrimonial ceremonies for those in puppy love, doggy daycare, and grooming).

SPRUCE UP. The luxurious Paws
Chateau features a cage-free doggie day
camp with shuttle service, penthouse
suites for overnight stays, and a complete
spa for pampered pooches. Plus, you can
watch your dog via a live webcam. Looking
for something simpler? You can wash your
dog yourself (shampoo and conditioner



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


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IF YOU'RE IN THE NEIGHBORHOOD...

From sunrise to way past sunset, these seven unique corners of Huntington Beach provide visitors with memorable Surf City USA experiences. Here are neighborly ways to get the most out of your day.

DOWNTOWN

In the heart of Surf City USA, stroll on the iconic Huntington Beach Pier or choose from exciting dining and shopping options on Main Street, 5th and PCH, and Pacific City.

A.M. Dine like the locals and grab a bite at Sugar Shack Café. Enjoy the vibe, check out the surf photos on the wall and maybe even meet some surfers coming in for breakfast. Sugar Shack is a family-owned restaurant founded in 1967. **Brothers Ryan and Timmy** Turner, who you can catch at the restaurant, are featured in downtown's Surfers' Hall of Fame. After breakfast, walk over to the Huntington **Beach International Surfing** Museum to soak in a little (or a lot) of history.

MIDDAY Shop and dine at Pacific City. Grab some food at restaurants like Ways and Means, Simmzy's, or Lemonade. Or hit the food hall, Lot 579, so that family members can eat whatever they want from Burnt Crumbs to Pie Not to II Barone or get a view of the ocean from Bear Flag Fish Co. or The American Dream. Don't

forget dessert. Choose from Hans' Homemade Ice Cream, Popbar, or Frosted Cupcakery. Get some retail therapy with clothes shopping at H&M, Urban Outfitters, or any of the unique boutiques. Play giant chess, corn hole, or ping pong upstairs by Saint Marc's.

P.M. Head out to the beach before sunset and secure a fire pit. Sit back and watch Mother Nature's show.

AFTERHOURS What could be better than ending the night in Surf City USA with a refreshing cocktail and great view? At Pacific City, the Bungalow offers a rooftop chic vibe and multiple bars. For a more lounge-like feel, check out Offshore 9 Rooftop Bar at the newly constructed Twin Dolphin Tower at The Waterfront Beach Resort, a Hilton Hotel or Tanner's Treehouse at the Paséa Hotel & Spa.











BFACH BOULFVARD

In Huntington Beach, Beach Boulevard, also known as Route 39, runs from the 405 Freeway to the beach on the southern end of town and is a jumping-off point for visitors and locals looking for hidden—and not-so-hidden—gems.

A.M. Near the 405 Freeway, you can stop at Edinger Avenue and Beach Boulevard to grab a bite or go shopping at the expansive Bella Terra shopping, dining, and entertainment center. Or you could try the one-of-a-kind Old World Village. Best known for their Oktoberfest celebrations, it also has a European market, deli, and bakery. If you need a caffeine fix, try Coffee Tale, a quaint coffee shop offering fresh-brewed organic coffee, tea, and pastries. Next door to Old World, you can skate to your heart's content-for free-at the Vans Off the Wall Skatepark. Down the road at the Newland Center, you can find super-healthy provisions Mother's Market, a best-inclass health-food store and restaurant. Feeling nostalgic? Visit the Newland House Museum, the oldest residence in Huntington Beach, built in 1898.

MIDDAY Rent an electric bike from Fat Bike Rentals or Pedego Electric Bikes and cruise to end of Beach Boulevard. The lunch at the beach is easy with many beach concessions to choose from.

P.M. Relax with a glass of vino and appetizers at Sealegs
Wine Bar just blocks from the beach. Also, try neighboring
Mama's on 39. Alternatively, you can head back to Newland
Center and catch Raw Bar's daily Beat the Clock Happy
Hour, offered daily. Beers, oysters, and champagne are only \$1 at 3 p.m., and then increase 50 cents every half hour.

AFTERHOURS After the sun goes down, warm up and cook s'mores at the beach fire rings that dot the sand.







BOLSA CHICA

If you want a walk on the wild side of Huntington Beach, this neighborhood is home to the 1,300-acre **Bolsa Chica Ecological Reserve** and 3-mile-long **Bolsa Chica State Beach**.

A.M. Start the day off with an early morning hike at the Bolsa Chica Ecological Reserve, when bird watching (you can spot more than 200 species, including the American bald eagle) is at its best. Enjoy a breakfast among locals at Green Street Cafe, which specializes in American comfort food (go for the chicken and waffles with the jalapeno kick). Work off that breakfast with a visit to Bolsa Chica State Beach, which features (mostly) gentle surf for beginners who want to attend Corky Carroll's Surf School or Salty Grom Surf Camp.

NOON Pick a lunch spot between one of four seasonal gourmet concessionaires run by one of Huntington Beach's most accomplished restaurateur, Alicia Whitney: SeaLegs at the Beach (fresh seafood dishes such as poke nachos, Baja shrimp and Baja ceviche); SeaSalt Beachside Burger, which pairs Santa Maria-style barbecue burgers with a craft beer garden; **Beach City Provisions** (comfort food, craft beer garden and a small general store); and Pacific Kitchen, known for its sustainably sourced fish and acai bowls.

P.M. Tour the eclectic

Wavesliders Gallery, where
local artist and waterman
Dave C. Reynolds displays
30 years of his art, including
handcrafted surf trophies for
international contests. If you're
visiting Huntington Beach in

the fall, float on over to Norma Brandel Gibbs Butterfly
Park, where majestic Monarch butterflies come for some
R&R during their migration.
For dinner, you can downshift at Slowfish, an elevated sushi restaurant designed for diners to eat at a leisurely pace (though it's hard not to wolf down the Jalatuna--fried jalapeno peppers stuffed with cream cheese and spicy tuna).

AFTERHOURS Starting each March, SeaLegs Live holds a weekend concert series featuring bands from every musical genre, including country, hip-hop, rock, indie, and pop. There may be no better way to end the day: toes in the sand, beer in your hand, listening to live music, and watching the sun disappear into the Pacific.

















GOLDENWEST

Goldenwest centers around Huntington Beach's must-see, 350-acre Central Park.

A.M. Start the day at
Huntington Beach Central
Park, a sprawling and lush
350-acre green oasis in the
middle of Surf City USA.
Within the park, marvel at an
architectural gem, the Neutradesigned Huntington Beach
Central Library; check out
the equestrian center (where
you rent horses or do yoga
with them!); and discover
the Secret Garden, home to
drought-tolerant plants, lovely
flowers, and butterflies.

MIDDAY Challenge yourself on the park's 18 exercise stations positioned along a 1.2-mile fitness loop, and then fuel up at the dog-friendly **Park Bench Café**. They even have a doggie menu!

P.M. Continue your Central Park experience at **Shipley**

Nature Center near the Park Bench Café. Or you can play some disc golf at Huntington Central Park's famed Disc Golf Course. Where Goldenwest Street dead ends into Pacific Coast Highway, you will find Huntington Dog Beach, one of the only stretches of beach in Southern California where dogs are allowed to play off-leash. At Seacliff Plaza on Yorktown Avenue and Goldenwest Street, you can dine at a fast-casual restaurant or for a more fine dining experience, visit The **Black Trumpet Bistro Tapas** & Wine Bar.

AFTERHOURS Indulge in ice cream, milkshakes, and cupcakes at The Moo Gelato. Before eating, don't forget to capture your Instagramworthy shot.

AOSA COFFEE





SUNSET BEACH AND HUNTINGTON HARBOUR

Away from bustling downtown, the Sunset Beach and Huntington Harbour neighborhoods provide a quaint seaside feel and picturesque scenery.

A.M. Start your day with a healthy breakfast at Fit Bar Superfood Café at the base of the iconic Sunset Beach Water Tower house on Pacific Coast Highway. Prefer a good cup of joe and some avocado toast? Try the new family-owned and operated Surf Cafea, where the coffee beans are freshly roasted. Or try Aosa Coffee for their famous lattes and plenty of vegan options. On the inland side of Pacific Coast Highway, you can rent a kayak or standup paddleboard at either Sunset Kayak Rentals or OEX Sunset Beach to navigate the calm waters of Huntington Harbour (and get in a workout). OEX also offers kayak fishing and SUP lessons.

MIDDAY For lunch, head over to the newly renovated Peter's Landing. You can access it from Pacific Coast Highway or via the harbor. How cool would it be to kayak right up to Pelican Isle restaurant, dock there, and enjoy American fare and waterside views. If you have more adventurous taste buds, give Himalayan Grill a

try. They serve delicious Indian, Nepalese, and Tibetan cuisine.

P.M. Do some shopping on Pacific Coast Highway in Sunset. For the ultimate boho chic look, try the charming Cleobella boutique, housed inside a 1920s cottage (spot the eye-catching crochet Balinese sun umbrellas, and you know you're there). For one-of-akind nautical collectibles, visit Antiques of the Sea shop, the one with a pirate statue on the roof (open only on weekends and by appointment). Take a cruise on one of Prince Charters' vintage yachts in Huntington Harbour. Then head to the beach to chill. Unlike Huntington City and State beaches, Sunset Beach is far more mellow. For dinner, visit Huntington Harbour Mall for dining options. including Red Table with its eclectic gastropub menu and Tabu Shabu with traditional Japanese hot-pot cuisine.

AFTERHOURS Play pool while watching sporting games at the Harbour Rackhouse.





MAIN STREET

The historic heart of Surf City USA at Main Street and Pacific Coast Highway offers must-see surf shops and boutiques.

Two iconic surf stores-Jack's **Surfboards and Huntington** Surf and Sport-stand as sentries at the entrance of Main Street, setting the tone for the authentic Surf City USA retail experience. Other local finds include a crazy-large selection of one- and twopieces at Diane's Beachwear and the cute souvenirs and beachwear at Beach Island. The popular American Vintage, a go-to spot for anyone searching for classic boots, jeans, jackets, and rock

'n' roll tees. Also, check out the stylish clothing at Model Citizen. M.E. Helme Antiques, located in a 1904 nationally registered historic building, sells artwork, glassware, china, furniture, currency, vintage costumes, and jewelry. Something different: Let's Go Fishing on the Huntington Beach Pier provides rentals for everything an angler would need to catch the big one.

5TH & PCH

Fifth Street, between Pacific Coast Highway and Walnut Avenue, provides a relaxing complement to its busy nearby neighbor, Main Street. 5thandPCH.com Drop in at the Rip Curl Surf Center for surfboard sales and rentals, skateboards, apparel, and accessories-plus some amazing surf videos on big screens. You can get ready to hit the beach at Merrilee's Swimwear (handmade swimsuits, casual wear, and accessories), Jolyn Clothing (women's swim and sportswear), and Chilli Beans Accessories (sunglasses and watches). If you're looking to get pampered, try L'Oreal-certified Kenneth Brown Salon for blowouts, trendy hairstyles and skin care. Something different: Get pumped at F45 Training with cardio, endurance, and strength workouts.

PACIFIC CITY

On the oceanfront just south of the Huntington Beach Pier, Pacific City is Huntington Beach newest retail and entertainment center, filled with a cutting-edge mix of stores and restaurants overlooking the ocean.







SURF CITY'S RED-HOT CULINARY SCENE SERVES UP A NEW BATCH OF CHEF-DRIVEN RESTAURANTS

Yes, Huntington Beach has 10 miles of uninterrupted coastline and an iconic pier. Yes, it boasts one of the best action-sports scenes in the world. And yes, you can't forget about the stunning waterfront hotels.

But in recent years, Surf City USA has earned another well-deserved reputation: as a Southern California dining destination. While a plethora of casual eateries dot the walkable and bikeable downtown area, a growing number of upscale, yet approachable, chef-driven restaurants have caught the attention of foodies and those looking for the next great meal.

Here is a tasting of Huntington Beach's culinary kings.

DOUBLE DELICIOUS AT BLUEGOLD AND LSXO

Your first impression of **Bluegold** is "WOW!" as you catch sight of the sweeping panoramic view of the Pacific. Then comes the jaw-dropping array of menu choices. Bluegold features nearly every culinary technique that a restaurant can offer: hot bar, raw bar, wood and charcoal grills, and even steam kettles. Named for the flash of gold that lights the ocean when the sun sets, Bluegold delights the senses with a creative, constantly evolving menu focusing on flavor





and Orange County's vast array of fresh ingredients from the land and sea.

Bluegold offers exceptional service to all guests, including a knowledgeable sommelier to assist with wine selections. They also host monthly wine pairing dinners with respected winemakers, seasonal menu changes, daily happy hour, and of course LSXO—the true star here!

Wait, what? Yes, behind a secret door within Bluegold is the exotic LSXO (Little Sister Extraordinary). The intimate, 28-seat dining room boasts an exciting speakeasy vibe, an uncensored rap soundtrack, and cutting-edge homestyle southeastern Vietnamese cuisine which reflects Chef Tin Vuong's upbringing. Think nem lui—grilled lemongrass pork and beef skewers with a heap of herbs and greens for wrapping the tender meat and vermicelli; pho banh cuon—a tantalizing deconstructed pho appetizer; and the extravagant salt & pepper lobster are just a few of many unforgettable dishes on LSXO's intriguing menu.

As the chief operator and chef-partner of Blackhouse Hospitality Group, Chef

Vuong showcases the rich collision of food and culture borne out of the European colonization of Southeast Asia. LSXO has garnered significant praise from notable food critics including Pulitzer Prize-winning writer Jonathan Gold who named it one of his "101 Best Restaurants" (2014-2018).

SURFER COOL MEETS COASTAL CHIC

From its second floor perch overlooking the landmark Huntington Beach Pier, Pacific Hideaway is the epitome of sexy, surfer chic and creative cool at the hip Kimpton Shorebreak Resort on 5th Street.

"Pacific Hideaway is known for its unique approach to both cocktails and cuisine," said Blake Mathias, director of food and beverage at Shorebreak Resort. "We are striving to provide a culinary and beverage experience unlike anywhere else in Huntington Beach."

Pacific Hideaway's culinary and design inspiration comes from popular global surf

destinations around the Pacific Rim. Chef Wyatt Lash helms the scratch kitchen where everything—from condiments to bread—is made in-house. The menu is a fusion of Latin American and Asian flavors with guest favorites such as the mussels with shrimp chorizo, lao sausage lettuce wraps, duck carnitas, and whole crispy thai snapper.

Creativity extends to the bar where lead bartender Casey Lyons' libations are making waves downtown and garnering attention from cocktail enthusiasts throughout the Southland. His bright, herbaceous Active Wear (Hendrick's gin, St. Germaine elderflower liqueur, sparkling sake, lime and cucumber juices, and ginger syrup) was featured in Liquor.com's "13 Healthy Cocktails To Drink in Bars Now." Refreshing and eye-catching, Active Wear is a play on a London Mule, but served in a ceramic sake mug, garnished with chopsticks and a cucumber skin evoking a sushi roll.

Pro Tip: Pacific Hideaway's farm-fresh fare is best enjoyed on the pier-view patio accompanied by one of Lyon's creative cocktails.





GOURMET MEXICAN WITH A KILLER VIEW

When you crave Mexican food in finer environs than your typical taco stand, Ola Mexican Kitchen at Pacific City has you covered. Ola is in a category of its own for its unique south of the border twists on authentic Mexican comfort food and jaw-dropping ocean view. Ola's relaxed vibe and menu of upscale Mexican cuisine is inspired by owner Toby Reece's and business partner Tony Andrews' surfing adventures south of the border ("ola" means "wave" in Spanish).

Southern California is famous for fish tacos that originated in the tiny Baja Mexico villages frequented by surfers, then, migrated to San Diego and spread north by popular demand. Ola's tacos stretch the imagination with blackened shrimp, salmon agave, lobster, and filet mignon. Of course, Ola also offers fried or grilled fish tacos that don't disappoint. Authentic dishes such as queso fundido, fresh ceviche, chile rellenos, and yucatan shrimp round out the menu. All pair perfectly with one of Ola's craft margaritas or take a walk

on the wild side and sip tequila from their extensive list.

Pro Tip: Happy Hour weekdays from 3-6 p.m., all day for Taco Tuesday (inside bar only).

IT'S ALL ABOUT THE TREEHOUSE



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HUNTINGTON BEACH OVERFLOWS WITH LOCAL BREWERIES, WINE BARS, AND A NEW DISTILLERY

Surf City USA could be called Suds City USA with its five breweries and other beer-forward offerings. Beachwood Brewing cooks up low-and-slow barbecue with craft beer good enough to win a dozen medals at the Great American Beer Festival. The Dudes' Brewing Co. at Pacific City's Lot 579 pours nearly 30 beers (try the Et Dude Brute Brut IPA). At the same locale, **The American Dream**'s burger bar is complemented with locally brewed beers on tap. Family-run Four Sons Brewing uses organic ingredients for the more than 15 beers on tap (and grab a six-pack of Surf City beer—infused with tropical fruit flavors—on your way out as a souvenir). Riip Beer Company in Sunset Beach offers small batch, handcrafted ales in a skatethemed tasting room (also, you can get beer delivered to your door in a repurposed Helms Bakery truck). Golden Road Brewing, scheduled to open in mid- to late-2019 on the bayfront at **Peter's Landing**, will feature its trademark beers along with a collection of rotating, seasonal, and limited-edition brews. The gastropub menu at The Public House pairs perfectly with craft beers from Evans Brewing Co. And the Kimpton Shorebreak Resort recently teamed up with Anaheim's Towne Park Brew to create the Shorebreak Mexican Lager that will whet your beer-longing whistle.





Also, Huntington Beach has gotten in the spirits with **Surf City Still Works**, the first distillery in town, known for its Shorebreak Vodka, Pierside Bourbon, California Gin, and Surfrider Rum. The Tasting Room—with a view of the distillery and wall of aging whiskey barrels—is open Fridays from 4 to 8 p.m. and Saturdays, 1 to 8 p.m. For craft cocktails, check out two of our favorite mixologists: **Pacific Hideaway**'s Casey Lyons and **Watertable**'s Tanner Johnson.

If you're looking to belly up to the wine bar, try **Main Street Wine Co.**, which specializes in boutique California vino. Another popular spot is **SeaLegs Wine Bar**, where you'll find a finely curated collection of California wines along with a seasonal small-plate menu inspired by the state's wine country.





BEACH BASICS

BEACH SAFETY TIPS

The Huntington Beach Marine Safety Division's lifeguards are dedicated to ensuring that Surf City USA's beaches remain accident-free. Here are safety tips developed by the lifeguards in conjunction with the U.S. Lifesaving Association. For more information, visit USLA.org

- Check on conditions. Before entering the water, ask lifeguards about water conditions.
- **Never swim alone.** Use the buddy system so someone will always know where you are.
- Swim sober. Alcohol is not allowed on the beaches in California and increases the potential for drowning by lowering body temperature, encouraging risky behavior, and impairing physical ability.
- Know your skill level. Don't overestimate your swimming ability, especially on rough days. Stay ashore if you're a non-swimmer.
- Don't panic in rip currents. Swim parallel to the shore until you're out of the current and then swim to the beach.
- Swim near staffed lifeguard towers. Our lifeguards are the best. You'll be much safer if they know where you are.
- Stay in designated areas. Portions of the beach are set aside for swimming or surfing. Keep a safe distance from jetties and the Huntington Beach Pier.
- **Do the stingray shuffle.** Shuffle your feet to scare away stingrays.
- Extend a hand out. Extend your hand in front of you in shallow breaking water when diving, body surfing, or wiping out on a surfboard.
- Don't dig deep holes. Deep holes can cave in and create hazards for small children. Please refill any holes you dig.
- Do not bring glass to the beach. Remember, people walk with bare feet at the beach.

GENERAL BEACH RULES

Alcohol It's not allowed on California beaches. **BBQ** Grills must be 18 inches off the sand and within 6 feet of fire rings.

Glass Glass containers and alcoholic beverages are not permitted on beaches.

Surfing For swimmer safety, surfing is not permitted in areas where a blackball flag is on display.

Dogs Other than at Dog Beach, dogs are not permitted on the pier, in Pier Plaza, or on other beaches.

RV camping It's allowed only at designated areas at Bolsa Chica and Huntington state beaches and between Oct. 1 and May 31 on portions of Huntington City Beach.

Tent camping Local ordinances prohibit overnight tent camping on the beach.

Bikes Riding bikes or skateboards is prohibited on the pier.

Smoking It's prohibited on beaches and on the pier.

HUNTINGTON CITY BEACH

1 Main Street along Pacific Coast Highway, between Seapoint Street and Beach Boulevard. Accessible to foot traffic, by car and by public transportation

Hours: 5 a.m.-10 p.m.; the pier is open 5 a.m. to midnight

Surfing: On crowded summer days, the beach north of the pier may be blackballed. Check with the lifeguards.

Parking: Metered parking spaces are available along Pacific Coast Highway from Goldenwest Street to Beach Boulevard. Parking lots are located along the beach with entrances at Beach Boulevard and Huntington Street. Pier parking is at 2nd and 6th streets.


Lifeguards play a starring role in Surf City, keeping 16 million beachgoers safe each year.

For the City of Huntington Beach, lifesaving training and ocean education start with our widely popular and internationally renowned Junior Lifeguard Program, which each summer attracts more than 1,100 boys and girls (ages 9 to 16) from around the U.S. and world.

Our regular lifeguards are the first-responders of the beach, whether in the middle of winter (when we have a staff of six) or in the peak of summer months (when we deploy up to 65 people). To get an idea of the seriousness of the job, Huntington Beach lifeguards make more than 5,400 rescues annually. In addition, they prevent thousands of additional rescues with proactive measures such as informing an inexperience swimmer of dangerous ocean conditions.

Marine Safety also provides the city's search and rescue dive team, swiftwater/flood rescue team, and coordinates offshore rescues with the police department, U.S. Coast Guard and Orange County Sheriff's Harbor Patrol. — By Michael Baumgartner, Marine Safety Division Chief, City of Huntington Beach
