PETE DYE — Four of the nine courses at La Quinta Resort & Club and PGA WEST along with layouts at Mission Hills Country Club and The Westin Mission Hills Golf Resort & Spa showcase this prolific designer's signature elements.

NICK FALDO — Faldo's Marriott's Shadow Ridge in Palm Desert has been recognized by Golfweek as the nation's 75th "Best Resort Course."

JOHN FOUGHT — Fought took the City of Indian Wells' former East Course and crafted The Players Course into what Golfweek regards as the nation's No. 7 "Best Municipal."

JACK NICKLAUS — From clubhouse to green, the Nicklaus Design Team course at Escena Golf Club pulses with the vibe of Palm Springs cool, as do the Toscana Country Club in Indian Wells and the PGA WEST Jack Nicklaus Private and Jack Nicklaus Tournament courses in La Quinta.

GREG NORMAN — The Norman Course at PGA WEST offers 60 acres of tight fairways that taper toward the greens with nine ponds, challenging players of all levels.

TOURNAMENT COURSES

The storied history of pro golf in the Coachella Valley dates back to the 11th Ryder Cup played at the Thunderbird Country Club in 1955. The worldwide allure of desert (and celebrity) golf brought various tournaments to Greater Palm Springs including the Skin's Game and Battle at Bighorn. The play continues today at PGA Tour's Desert Classic, the LPGA's ANA Inspiration and the PGA Tour's Qualifying School.



ARNOLD PALMER — The golf legend has designed numerous courses in the area, including Mountain View Country Club, Tradition Golf Club, SilverRock Resort and the PGA WEST Palmer Course in La Quinta; The Classic Club and Indian Ridge Country Club's Arroyo and Grove Courses in Palm Desert; and Mission Hills Country Club in Rancho Mirage.

TED ROBINSON — "The King of Waterscape" has immortalized his trademark water features at Rancho Las Palmas Country Club and JW Marriott Desert Springs.

LEE SCHMIDT AND BRIAN CURLEY — The team designed the dual North and South courses at Indio's Golf Club at Terra Lago.

GARY PLAYER — The Westin Mission Hills Golf Resort & Spa's Gary Player Signature Course is one of two championship courses at the resort, each a completely different experience to challenge the golf enthusiast.

TOM WEISKOPF — The Tom Weiskopf Private Course at PGA WEST is Weiskopf's only venture into golf design in Greater Palm Springs but is considered a favorite among those who love the game.


JOSHUA TREE NATIONAL PARK

A scenic drive up Highway 62 to Twentynine Palms leads to the north entrance of Joshua Tree National Park. Compromising of high-desert wilderness and hosting "forests" of namesake Joshua trees, desert wildlife, inspiring vistas and a colorful history, the nearby park is a natural treasure for visitors from all over the world. Any time of the year, plan to hike, camp, rock climb or take a guided tour. In the spring, view colorful spring blooms or spy a desert tortoise emerging from hibernation.

Geographically, the park encompasses rugged mountains of twisted rock, granite monoliths, arroyos, playas and alluvial fans. In addition to fascinating geography, wildlife and plant life, Joshua Tree National Park is distinctively marked by the reminders of the early Pinto Man, who inhabited the area and the abandoned mines of 1800s gold seekers waiting to be discovered along the many hiking trails.



The high desert mecca for rock climbers attracts aficionados from all over the world. Joshua Tree's gigantic boulders and its famous traditional-style crack, slab and steep-face climbing opportunities tempt even the most experienced climber. With more than 400 climbing formations and 8,000 climbing routes, there is something for any experience level.

01 AMBOY CRATER

Recognized for its visual and geological significance, Amboy Crater is an excellent example of a very symmetrical volcanic cinder



GALLETA MEADOWS (BORREGO SPRINGS)

MAIN STREET MURALS

The only limestone caves in the California State Park system, the caverns were reopened for public tours in November 2017, allowing visitors to once again view the intricate stalagmite and stalactite formations, as well as prehistoric fossils, in this remote area of the eastern Mojave.

Old West mining town has been around since 1881; during the largest silver strike in California. With its 500 mines, over \$20 million in silver ore was produced over a 12-year span.



JOSHUA TREE NATIONAL PARK

With nearly 800,000 acres of mystical beauty, Joshua Tree National Park is undoubtedly one of the world's most incredible natural desert treasures. Sweeping, grand in scale and populated by granite monoliths and voluptuous rock and boulder formations, the park offers wonder to eco-travelers, outdoor adventurists and naturalists. Two large ecosystems come together to form this quiet land, conducive to meditation and roaming, that have been carved by extremes in climate from wind to rain to an ever-present, relentless sun.



BADWATER BASIN

Nearly 200 square miles of stark white salt flats line the bottommost point of Death Valley. At Badwater Basin you can walk out on top of a large patch of the flats that seem almost lunar in their vastness and desolation. The crunch under your feet is composed of crystals constantly breaking and reforming along to the climatic changes in this harsh environment. The enclosed basin is considered the valley's drainage system.

SAN ANDREAS FAULT

The San Andreas Fault: It's a seam in the ground that snakes 800 miles through California and extends to depths of 10 miles within the Earth. It's the geological feature responsible for plenty of earthquakes capable of producing the Big One. This master fault line runs the length of the Coachella Valley. It protrudes from the earth in spectacular form, producing tangible geology that anyone can experience.



ANZA - DARK SKY COMMUNITY

Visitors can enjoy unmatched stargazing opportunities in Greater Palm Springs and its surrounding deserts. Borrego Springs, less than an hour's drive south of Greater Palm Springs, is one of only 15 Dark Sky Communities in the world and the only Dark Sky Community in California. Part of the International Dark Sky Places Program, Borrego Springs offer unparalleled night skies illuminated only by the millions of stars above.






