Home to nearly two million acres of national forest offering every recreational activity you can think of and then some, Mammoth Lakes has everything you need to easily access this amazing playground. Come explore! Spectacular spaces and landscapes will inspire you to join in caring for this pristine alpine environment. Here are some tips for a terrific, stress-free visit from the instant you arrive. A few simple guidelines will also empower you to enjoy and protect this incredible setting.

Stewardship

Being good stewards of public lands is paramount. While you're here, please keep a few things in mind. No one wants to see litter or pet waste out on the trail or by a beautiful lake. If you pack it in, pack it out. Go a step further and bring along a small bag to pick up trash others have left behind. Never approach or feed wildlife — enjoy observing them from a respectful distance in their natural habitat, but keep them wild! Secure all food in bear boxes or bear-proof containers, never in your vehicle. Latch dumpsters. Stay on designated trails (do not cut switchbacks) and be aware of fire and camping restrictions. Above all, be considerate of others.

Transportation

Mammoth Lakes provides a convenient, complimentary transportation system throughout the town, so sit back and enjoy the scenery! Using the Eastern Sierra Transit Authority (ESTA) shuttle system reduces greenhouse gas emissions while eliminating the hassles of parking and driving during inclement weather conditions. Altitude can also exacerbate the effects of alcohol, so be safe and take the shuttle if you plan to imbibe. See pages 146-154 for schedules and maps.

Mammoth Lakes is a great place to try out something new, such as mountain biking, climbing, fishing, snowboarding, alpine and cross country skiing and more. latest equipment (pages 40, 55 and 64-66), you won't even need to haul a lot of gear with you.

Your Guide to Great Tours in and around MAMMOTH LAKES

Whether you're looking for a laid-back brewery tour, an interpretive sightseeing experience, a dazzling helicopter flight or an introduction to an outdoor activity suitable for the entire family, Mammoth Lakes tour guides will get you out there, regardless of your experience level. Reserve your tours in advance and notify the operator of any special needs or restrictions. Be aware, weather conditions may impact your tour.

Land Tours

MAWS Transportation (page 27) offers three guided sightseeing tours departing from Mammoth Lakes. Choose from the Yosemite National Park tour (10 hours), June Lake, Mono Lake and Bodie State Historic Park tour (7 hours) or Mammoth Lakes tour (4 hours). Times are door to door. Additional options may be available.

Explore the Mammoth Lakes Basin on horseback with the **Mammoth** Lakes Pack Outfit (page 49). Wrangler-led group trail rides run on a fixed schedule, while a popular walk-and-lead option is offered for young children to ride while a parent leads their horse. All-inclusive overnight pack trips are also available. Experienced riders may join a working trail drive to relocate the horses at the beginning and end of each season.

Snow Tours

Mammoth Snowmobile Adventures (page 82) offers guided snowmobile tours over thousands of acres of trails, forests and meadows. Riders of all abilities will love exploring these incredible landscapes.

Take a ride in a snowcat for one of the most unique excursions in the Eastern Sierra with **Minaret Vista Snowcat Tours** (page 82). Experience the sights and sounds of the backcountry in the heated comfort of a luxury snowcat. Each snowcat holds up to 12 people.

Water Tours


Take a guided, natural history kayak tour of Mono Lake with Caldera Kayaks (page 55) and learn about the rich ecology of one of the oldest lakes in North America. Morning half-day tours are available, with longer tours offered for intermediate and advanced paddlers. A two-day combination lesson/tour package is also available with instruction on Crowley Lake the first day, followed by a Mono Lake tour on the second day.

Year-round Tours

The Mammoth Lakes Welcome Center, a designated California Welcome Center (pages 36, 43, 45, 49, 80, 82, 83 and 91) offers free interpretive programs throughout the year, including on-snow programs in the winter, campfire and hiking programs in summer and special activities for children.

Immerse yourself in the local craft beer scene with **Eastern Sierra Brewery Tours** (page 97). These all-inclusive tours (4 hours) transport you to three local breweries, offering a thorough overview of the brewing process. Two tours daily (except Tuesdays), groups of 8+ welcome. Tastings and lunch/appetizers are included.

Take to the air with **Skytime Helicopter Tours** (page 30) and see Mammoth Lakes from a unique vantage point. Several options for scenic tours and charter flights are available.

FROM THE BIRTH OF THE SIERRA NEVADA MOUNTAINS TO THE TOWN'S ORIGINAL DAYS OF ROUGH-AND-TUMBLE MINERS AND EARLY 20TH CENTURY MOTORISTS SEEKING ADVENTURE, THE STORY OF MAMMOTH LAKES HAS IT ALL.

THE FORMATION OF MAMMOTH LAKES

ocated in the heart of the legendary Sierra Nevada Mountains, Mammoth Lakes is a gateway to some of the most majestic and awe-inspiring arrays of landforms in North America. From the stately basalt pillars of the Devils Postpile National Monument to the bubbling hydrothermal springs of Hot Creek Gorge and dizzying heights of the Mammoth Mountain Ski Area, visitors are deeply immersed into an exciting record of Earth's most awesome processes.

Mammoth Lakes sits on the edge of the impressive Long Valley Caldera, a 20-mile wide extinct supervolcano that erupted around 750,000 years ago. This eruption released 500 times more volcanic material than Mount St. Helens did in 1980, and volcanic ash traveled as far as Nebraska and Kansas! Present day Crowley Lake, located eight miles south of Mammoth Lakes, sits roughly in the southeastern limit of the ancient crater.

Around 100,000 years ago, a series of volcanic eruptions thrust the peak of Mammoth Mountain into the sky. Much later, degassing explosions and smaller eruptions formed the Inyo and Mono craters, leaving a sea of light pumice. The nearby Obsidian Dome, literally a huge mountain of volcanic glass, formed around 800 years ago and provided a source of cutlery and projectile points for native tribes.

On the outskirts of town, the legendary basalt columns of Devils Postpile National Monument rise from the headwaters of the San Joaquin River. This peculiar body of rock formed just under 100,000 years ago, when lava rich in iron and magnesium poured forth from a fissure in the Earth's crust. The picturesque black basalt of Devils Postpile National Monument has endured glacial ice, moving water and earthquakes. The base of the outcrop is littered with massive columns that have succumbed to

the powers of nature and gravity. From around 200,000 years ago to 14,000 years ago, expansive alpine glacial sheets flanked the sides of the Sierra Nevada Mountains. These glaciers deeply carved into the rocky mountainsides as they advanced and retreated, shaping the configuration of the landscape. Upon retreat, over a dozen serene mountain lakes

remained in the Mammoth Lakes Basin. At one time, glaciers even extended into the heart of town! Geology is also responsible for bringing the first settlers into the area. Miners discovered gold and silver in the volcanic rocks above present day Mammoth Lakes and the course of the region's history was changed forever.

MAMMOTH MINING: LAYING THE FOUNDATION FOR THE FUTURE OF MAMMOTH LAKES

s with many western mountain towns, the first Europeans to settle in the vicinity of Mammoth Lakes were drawn by wealth locked deep within the mountains. In 1877, four prospectors, whose search for precious metals brought them from the depleted gold fields of California's western slope, stumbled upon gold- and silver-bearing quartz veins just west of the present-day town. Within less than a year, General G. Dodge of San Francisco purchased a majority of the mining claims and consolidated them under the Mammoth Mining Company. This clever name was used in reference of purported vast mineral

wealth, which brought investors and businessmen to the district, and had no relation to prehistoric remains of extinct mastodons.

Word of the discovery reached far and wide, and within a year, over 1,000 miners flocked to the region in the hopes of striking it rich. Defying the ferocious mountain elements and climate, the industrious early residents quickly established a main street, post office, motel and several saloons at the base of Red Mountain. Today, a masonry marker and a few stone foundations line the top of Old Mammoth Road and are all that remain of the original, albeit short-lived, town.

General Dodge's Mammoth Mining Company lasted only two years, when excessive spending combined with the harsh elements and an overall weak mineral deposit forced the company into Sheriff's sale in 1880. Many of the miners migrated to the nearby gold town of Bodie to the north, which had over 10,000 residents and a Wild West reputation throughout the late 19th century. The mine's massive mill, a water-powered engineering marvel, was scavenged for parts and eventually burned many years later. Today, the mill's impressive 20-foot diameter cast iron flywheel leans idly against its masonry base on the bluff above town.

Small-scale mining continued sporadically until the Great Depression, when a small mine camp, complete with a diesel-powered mill, was built by the Mammoth Consolidated

Mining Company. The operation was abandoned and today the easily accessible ruins are preserved in a state of arrested decay on U.S. Forest Service land near the Coldwater Creek Campground.

Overall, mining around Mammoth Lakes was short-lived and relatively unprofitable, although it did set the stage for development in the meadows below Red Mountain. Word spread of the area's unbelievable natural beauty and by the end of the first quarter of the 20th century, tourism became the region's number-one industry.

ADVENTUROUS MOTORISTS OF THE EARLY 20TH CENTURY: THE BIRTH OF MAMMOTH LAKES TOURISM

y the end of the 1910s, the mining boom had played out and a new, long-lasting industry emerged. Tourists, arriving by automobiles and charged with a sense of adventure and freedom, began discovering the solitude, beauty and recreational opportunities of the Sierra Nevada Mountains. These early visitors would make the grueling two-day drive from Los Angeles to reach the pine forests and grassy meadows around Mammoth Lakes. It may have been gold that put the town on the map, but it was fishing, hunting, camping, hiking, boating

and mountaineering that made the region famous.

In the early 1920s, the small town of Mammoth Camp was established along the meadows of Mammoth Creek in order to provide services to the steadily increasing number of summer visitors. Fish and game sportsmen, thrill-seeking alpinists and wilderness campers comprised many of the early vacationers. An automobile garage, hotel, rustic rental cabins, bakery, general store and post office were constructed near the banks of the creek. The waterwheel that originally powered



Mammoth Mining Company's mill was moved from upper Old Mammoth to the lower meadows to generate electricity for the blossoming Wildasinn Hotel mountain resort. This waterwheel and one of the original log cabins of the early resort remain today, photogenically nestled in a grove of quaking aspen along Old Mammoth Road.

Shady Rest Campground, located directly behind the Mammoth Lakes Welcome Center, acquired its name from the early tourism days. Weary and worn travelers would commonly park in the forested flat land and set up camp in the shadows of the mighty pines. It was a most welcome break, especially after multiple days of traversing the rocky and primitive desert roads of the Mojave and Owens Valley in the automobiles of the era.

During the winter months, the population drastically dropped and limited mail service was provided by dogsled. In 1941, this all changed when visionary Eastern Sierra local Dave McCoy altered the course of

Mammoth Lakes' history. McCoy, who recently celebrated his 103rd birthday, saw an opportunity and after several years of both successes and failures, Mammoth Mountain Ski Area was born. Today, the resort is one of the top ski and snowboard destinations in the world and brings hundreds of thousands of visitors to Mammoth Lakes annually. Mammoth Lakes welcomed the dreams of early prospectors, turn-of-the-century adventurers and avid skiers like Dave McCoy. No matter the dream, it can be fulfilled in Mammoth Lakes. What's your mountain town dream?





Rainbow Falls

The 101-foot waterfall is part of the Devils Postpile National Monument. It is known for the colorful rainbow that its mist creates. The best time to experience the rainbows is midday, when the sun is highest.

Take in the view from the Panorama Gondola as you ride to the top of Mammoth Mountain at 11.053 feet (3,368 m). At the summit, explore the Eleven53 Interpretive Center, with interactive displays of the area's geologic, hydrologic and volcanic history.

EARTHQUAKE FAULT

This sizeable fissure is not an earthquake fault caused by a single quake, as the name implies. Geologists now believe it is a system of fractures formed during a series of strong quakes when the Invo Craters and Inyo Domes erupted centuries ago.

INYO CRATERS

Six hundred years ago, a massive explosion heated rock and ground water, causing a large blast zone. Three craters were formed. Today, snow melt and rainwater create emerald green pools in the craters.

MAMMOTH CONSOLIDATED GOLD MINE

In 1877, miners discovered silver and gold deposits on the northern slope of Red Mountain in Mammoth Lakes. Ruins of the Mammoth Consolidated Gold Mine, operated circa 1927-1933, include mining offices, assay office, a cabin, mill, bunkhouses, a schoolhouse, mining equipment and mine shafts. Follow an easy dirt trail for a self-guided tour or see the site by horseback with Mammoth Lakes Pack Outfit (page 49).

- Directions: Main Street turns into Lake Mary Road, which winds throughout the Mammoth Lakes Basin. Turn left at the sign for Coldwater Campground/Lake Mary Marina. Turn left again for Coldwater Campground. Drive to the end of the campground loop where you will see signs for Mammoth Consolidated Gold Mine on your right. If you re-enter the campground, you have gone too far.

MAMMOTH LAKES BASIN

Glacier-carved lakes form the Mammoth Lakes Basin. Twin Lakes, Lake Mary, Lake Mamie, Lake George and Horseshoe Lake are nestled below jagged peaks and pine forests. Easily accessible by public transportation, the basin provides hiking, biking, fishing, boating, kayaking, stand-up paddleboarding, camping, picnicking and sightseeing.

Mammoth Museum, located in the Hayden Cabin along Mammoth Creek, exhibits mining implements, photos, art, intriguing memorabilia and glimpses into the lives of the people and industries that shaped Mammoth Lakes.

MINARET VISTA

The vista offers a breathtaking view of Mammoth Lakes' signature skyline, the Minarets, which are part of the Ritter Range. The sharp, jutting spires of the Minarets are dramatic and unworldly. Also visible are Mount Ritter at 13,157 feet (4,010 m) and Banner Peak at 12,945 feet (3,945 m), the two tallest peaks in the range. The vista is also a popular spot for stargazing.



Once notorious as the wildest town in the West — with its saloons, bordellos, gambling houses and opium dens — the town is now preserved as a California State Historic Park, with beautifully weathered buildings, a museum and visitor center.

The photography focal point is the oddshaped tufa towers, which have grown to heights of over 30 feet (9.1 m). These tufa towers were formed by fresh water springs percolating up from the bottom of the lake and interacting with the lake's salt water.



Enjoy views galore while walking, running or biking on this in-town paved path. Access points are located throughout town in such areas as Mammoth Creek Park, Shady Rest Park and campgrounds, Trails End Park and Horseshoe Lake.

TOWN LOOP AND CONNECTORS

Whether you're looking for a casual stroll around town or heading out for dining, shopping or recreation, the Town Loop and connecting multiuse paths are a family-friendly way to access many of Mammoth Lakes' amenities, including the Mammoth Lakes Welcome Center, Mammoth Lakes Library, Edison Theatre, Volcom Brothers Skatepark and a number of in-town parks, by bike or on foot.

MAMMOTH LAKES BASIN

Explore the Lakes Basin using 5.3 miles (8.5 km) of paved multi-use paths that run from The Village at Mammoth to Horseshoe Lake. The path, which

follows a similar route as the Lakes Basin Trolley, connects to Lakes Basin favorites, including Lake Mamie, Twin Lakes Vista, Tamarack Lodge and more.

Lakes Basin Trolley Hikes

The Lakes Basin Trolley travels along Main Street as it turns into Lake Mary Road and winds through the Mammoth Lakes Basin. A map of the area and trolley schedules can be found on pages 149-154.

All trail distances are listed as round-trip.

PANORAMA DOME Trolley Stop 94

Trails: 0.6 miles (1 km) to 1.8 miles (2.9 km)

Rating: Easy to moderate

Getting there: From the Lower Twin Lakes Trolley stop, cross the street to catch the Lake Basin Path. Turn right toward the Tamarack Lodge. In 400 feet (121.9 m), the trailhead will be on your left.

What you can see: A gradual yet steady climb on the trails surrounding Panorama Dome will lead you through a forest of pines before emerging into an elevated field. There, the trail lives up to its name, offering panoramic views of the Lakes Basin. Combine some of the shorter trails to explore more of the area on a longer hike. Hikers are allowed on the mountain bike trails.

TWIN LAKES Trolley Stop 96

Trails: 2.9 miles (4.7 km) to 6 miles (9.7 km)

Rating: Strenuous to very strenuous

Getting there: From the Twin Lakes Marina Trolley stop, walk to the Twin Lakes Campground. After crossing a bridge, follow signs to campsite 31.

The trailhead is behind the campsite.

What you can see: If a challenging hike with spectacular views is what you're looking for, the trails accessible from this trailhead are for you.

LAND ADVENTURES

A steep 0.8-mile (1.3 km) climb leads to a number of other trailhead options. Hike to Seven Lakes Point for a stunning view of six Mammoth Lakes Basin lakes, plus Crowley Lake. Then continue on to see the Bottomless Pit and Hole in the Wall lava tubes and the Mammoth Crest. Ambitious hikers can even reach the top of Mammoth Mountain along what is the shortest but steepest trail to the summit.

MAMMOTH ROCK & MILL CITY Trolley Stop 97

Trails: 0.4 miles (0.6 km) to 5.2 miles (8.4 km)

Rating: Easy to strenuous

Getting there: From the Old Mammoth Road Trolley stop, walk 0.7 miles (1.1 km) on Old Mammoth Road to the Mammoth Rock Trailhead on the right. The Mill City Trailhead is a bit further up on the left.

What you can see: Beginning at the edge of the Lakes Basin area and winding into Sherwin Meadows, these trails wind past Mammoth Lakes' historic mining district, where you can see traces of the Gold-Rush-era life left behind. As you climb along the Sherwin Range, enjoy views of Snowcreek Meadow and the jutting limestone and marble peak of Mammoth Rock.



COLDWATER CREEK Trolley Stop 100

Trails: 2.2 miles (3.5 km) to 11 miles (17.7 km)

Rating: Moderate to very strenuous

Getting there: From the Lake Mary Marina Trolley stop, walk 0.6 miles (1 km) through the Coldwater Campground. In the parking area at the back of the campground, you'll find Emerald Lake Trailhead to your right and Duck Lake Pass Trailhead straight ahead and the Heart Lake Trailhead to the left.

What you can see: Explore the Ansel Adams Wilderness and John Muir Wilderness along a number of trails that begin at the trailheads found at Coldwater Campground. If you're up for a challenge, choose a strenuous hike that leads to scenic views of Barney Lake, Blue Crag and Arrowhead Lake. Cutoffs along the way loop through Gentian and Sky meadows and past Woods Lakes. Or, take a more moderate trail, where Depression-era ruins and a Mammoth Consolidated Gold Mine shaft are points of interest en route to Heart Lake.

LAKE GEORGE Trolley Stop 101

Trails: 0.5 miles (0.8 km) to 14.4 miles (23.1 km)

Rating: Easy to strenuous

Getting there: From the Lake George Road Trolley stop, turn onto Lake George Road and walk 0.3 miles (0.5 km) to the end of the road. The Crystal Lake Trailhead will be immediately to your right. Continue along the road to the opposite side of the loop to find the Lake George Trailhead.

What you can see: A hike from the Lake George Campground offers plenty of opportunities to explore the many lakes in the Lakes Basin. Take a moderate hike to Crystal Lake, where you'll have options to continue along the Mammoth Crest for views of the towering, granite Crystal Crag. Connect to other trails that skirt the John Muir Wilderness and Ansel Adams Wilderness. Or, wander along the shores of TJ Lake, Barrett Lake and Lake George for an afternoon of lakeside alpine serenity.

HORSESHOE LAKE Trolley Stop 104

Trails: 1 mile (1.6 km) to 8.2 miles (13.2 km)

Rating: Easy to moderate

Getting there: From the Horseshoe Lake Trolley stop, the trailhead splits, leading up the hill to McLeod Lake or around Horseshoe Lake.

What you can see: Two easy, family-friendly trails wind through lodgepole pine forest around Horseshoe and McLeod lakes with views of the back of Mammoth Mountain and the Mammoth Crest. Stop at one of the lakes to picnic, fish or swim. Or, continue on one of the longer, more strenuous trails to parts of the Ansel Adams Wilderness, Crater Valley and Reds Meadow Valley.

Trails: 0.6 miles (1 km) to 37.8 miles (60.8 km)

Rating: Easy to strenuous

Getting there: Take the scenic shuttle (tickets can be purchased at the Mammoth Adventure Center using any method of payment or on the bus with cash only) from either The Village at Mammoth on the Canyon Boulevard side or the Mammoth Adventure Center. The scenic shuttle stops at a number of trailheads throughout Reds Meadow.

What you can see: Reds Meadow is the perfect place for a full day of exploration. A variety of trails lead to the region's many iconic view points and breathtaking landscapes. From easy hikes to Rainbow Falls, the wildflower-covered Agnew Meadows and Devils Postpile National Monument to more strenuous trails that wind through the

John Muir and Ansel Adams Wilderness areas past stunning alpine lakes and connect to parts of the Pacific Crest Trail, Reds Meadow offers something for hikers of all levels.

MAMMOTH MOUNTAIN

Trails: 2.4 miles (3.9 km) to 7.8 miles (12.6 km)

Rating: Easy to strenuous

Getting there: From the Main Lodge Trolley stop, take the trailhead behind Mammoth Mountain Inn to reach Minaret Summit. The trailhead by the Main Lodge leads to the summit of Mammoth Mountain.

What you can see: These trails provide access to the summit of Mammoth Mountain and the Minarets. Climb the western side of Mammoth Mountain for sweeping views of Reds Meadow Valley, the Ansel Adams Wilderness, the Ritter Range, the Minarets, Balloon Dome, the Central Valley and more. At the summit, spend some time learning about the area's geology at the Eleven53 Interpretive Center. Choose a more moderate hike for an up-close look at the Minarets, with views of San Joaquin Ridge, the Junction Bluffs and the Ritter Range. Or, take the Panorama Gondola ride to the trailheads at the top of Mammoth Mountain and hike down back to the Main Lodge or to the Twin Lakes Campground.

SHERWIN CREEK

Trails: 6 miles (9.7 km) to 9.2 miles (14.8 km)

Rating: Moderate to strenuous

Getting there: From Old Mammoth Road, turn onto Sherwin Creek Road, which is a dirt road. Drive 2 miles (3.2 km), until you see a sign to turn toward the trailhead.

What you can see: In spring to early summer, hike past meadows of wildflowers and through groves of aspen and Jeffrey pine for a beautiful climb beneath the peaks of the Sherwin Range. Take in views of the town of Mammoth Lakes when you reach the Sherwin Lakes. For a more challenging hike, head toward Valentine Lake and the John Muir Wilderness. Along the way, you'll find sweeping views of Mammoth Creek and environs.

CONVICT CANYON

Trails: 3.5 miles (5.6 km) to 14.2 miles (22.8 km)

Rating: Easy to very strenuous

Getting there: Take US 395 south to Convict Lake Road. The trailhead sign will be on your right.

What you can see: Enjoy hiking an easy, scenic trail around Convict Lake. Or, venture further on a more strenuous trail along the base of Laurel Mountain's Sevehah Cliff. Pass Mildred Lake, before continuing upward to Lake Dorothy, Lake Genevieve and Edith Lake.



McGEE CREEK

Trails: 11.6 miles (18.7 km) to 28.6 miles (46.0 km)

Rating: Moderate to very strenuous

Getting there: Take US 395 south to the McGee Creek Road turnoff. The paved road will turn into a dirt road. The trailhead is at the end of the road.

What you can see: Hike out to Steelhead Lake, which is surrounded by granite peaks. Continue through the valley, following signs for McGee Pass, past mountain hemlocks, until you reach Big McGee Lake. From the shore, you'll have the perfect vantage point to view the Red and White mountains. Alternatively, hike along the creek, which is especially beautiful in the fall. Ambitious hikers can continue on to the McGee Pass crest at 11,895 feet (3,626 m), and then descend into the Mammoth Lakes Basin past Purple and Duck lakes.

ROCK CREEK CANYON

Trails: 6.9 miles (11.1 km) to 13 miles (20.9 km)

Rating: Moderate

Getting there: Take US 395 south to Tom's Place/ Rock Creek Road. At Rock Creek Lake, continue on Rock Creek Road to reach the Hilton Creek Lakes Trailhead. The Little Lakes Valley Trailhead is a bit further up the road. Please note that the road is narrow past Rock Creek Lake to Little Lakes Valley. Or, turn right onto Rock Creek Campground road to access the Tamarack Trailhead.

What you can see: The scenic trails in Rock Creek Canyon are popular among hikers and anglers. The trails are moderate for the most part, but take elevation into consideration — most of the trails are above 10,000 feet (3,048 m). Traverse Little Lakes Valley (also called Mosquito Flats), passing multiple lakes along the way to Morgan Pass. Or, hike through a forest of whitebark and lodgepole pines on the way to Hilton and Davis lakes.

TIOGA PASS outside Yosemite National Park

Trails: 3 miles (4.8 km) to 7.6 miles (12.2 km)

Rating: Moderate to strenuous

Getting there: Take US 395 north toward Lee Vining. Turn left onto CA-120 west (the CA-158 south turn off). Follow CA-158/Tioga Road (closed in winter). Drive 7.5 miles (12.1 km) to the Warren Fork Trailhead on the right. In another 2.3 miles (3.7 km), you'll come across Saddlebag Road on the right, which leads to Saddlebag Lake Trailhead. Or, travel another 1.3 miles (2.1 km) down Tioga Road, where you'll find Glacier Canyon Trailhead on the left, just before the entrance to Yosemite.

What you can see: From the Warren Fork Trailhead, you'll enter the Hoover Wilderness and walk along Warren Creek with Tioga and Lee Vining peaks rising up on either side of the trail. From Saddlebag Lake, you can explore the 20 Lakes Basin. Take the trail around the lake or use the water taxi to reach the far side of the lake to connect to other trails. A hike beginning at Glacier Canyon Trailhead offers views of the glacial Mount Dana and Dana Lake before crossing through a meadow to Tioga Canyon.





Skiing and Snowboarding

World-famous Mammoth Mountain Ski Area truly lives up to its "Mammoth" name, with 28 chairlifts and two gondolas accessing 3,500 acres of skiable terrain. Boasting a summit elevation of 11,053 feet (3,369 m), Mammoth is the highest resort in California. One hundred fifty distinct runs offer something for everyone, from easy learning terrain to

wide-open bowls and expert chutes. It's not unusual here to share a chairlift ride with an Olympian or see a gold medalist soaring high above a massive terrain park. Mammoth Mountain is an official training mountain of the U.S. Olympic Team, annually hosting numerous events, featuring both professional and up-and-coming athletes.

Cross Country Skiing and Snowshoeing

Mammoth Lakes is surrounded by seemingly endless hectares of public lands, and a number of roads are transformed into trails for the winter so it's easy to get out and explore on foot. Don't miss the guided naturalist tours available both from the Mammoth Lakes Welcome Center and from Tamarack Cross Country Ski Center. They're a perfect way to learn about local wildlife, plants and history, and the guides are an excellent local resource.

One-of-a-Kind Experiences

A huge variety of activities are available here in the winter! Snowmobiling and snowcat tours are popular or try catchand-release fly fishing in the warm waters of Hot Creek.

Family Fun

Kids love playing outside in Mammoth Lakes, whether they are building a snowman, gliding down a snowy slope or carving figure eights on a smooth sheet of ice. Snow tubing at Woolly's Tube Park and Snow Play offers all the fun and excitement of sledding with the convenience of a rope tow to pull you to the top of the hill.

Stormy Days and Wintery Evenings

If it's stormy out or the sun has set, Mammoth Lakes offers plenty of indoor activities to keep you entertained, from fine dining and one-of-a-kind shopping experiences to an upscale bowling alley that also offers golf simulators. Mammoth Lakes averages 300 days of sunshine annually, so significant snow accumulations are generally followed by clear days under cloudless blue skies.

5 TIPS For Enjoying Your Snowy Trip (Even More!)

- **1. Prior to arrival,** make reservations or book lift tickets, lessons, tours, activities, restaurants and rentals. If you are renting gear, inquire about picking it up the evening before you plan to use it.
- **2. Start your day right.** Treat yourself to a big breakfast (helps your body stay warm and will help in adjusting to altitude), apply plenty of sunscreen one hour prior to exposure (70 SPF is recommended) and triple check to confirm you have everything you will need throughout the day. Layering clothing is key to being prepared for changing weather.
- **3. Time and gear management.** The amount of gear needed for winter sports can overwhelm a person, not to mention a family. Give yourself an extra hour to get ready at home and plan on arriving early at your activity. Take advantage of drop-off/pick-up zones at your destination to unload your family and gear. Skiing or snowboarding? Inquire about overnight storage at rental shops or rent a locker for overnight storage at Main and Canyon Lodges.
- **4. Keep your energy up.** Colder weather, altitude and high-energy activities translate to being more hungry, thirsty and tired than usual. Stay ahead of the game by having snacks and water readily accessible, and plan to take breaks throughout the day (then add one more planned break).
- **5.** Hop on the bus. Driving in snow takes longer than usual and can be stressful. Use the free transit system for ultimate flexibility and hassle-free transport around town. Buses are equipped to handle skis and snowboards, and all bus lines will take you to an access point for Mammoth Mountain. See page 148 for transit schedule. Winter Driving Tips

When conditions are snowy, stay on the road and in control with the help of these tips.

Before Your Trip

• Do a car safety check. Make sure that your car has ample antifreeze, the windshield is clean and you have plenty of windshield washer fluid. Check to make sure the headlights are clean and in working order. Verify that the tires have tread and are properly inflated.

Equip your car with a flashlight and extra batteries, a first aid kit, warm clothes, a blanket and extra water. Stash a pair of sunglasses in the car. The sun bouncing off the snow is much more intense in the winter than it is in the summer.

- Carry chains. Make sure you carry tire chains at all times in the mountains. Test your chains to ensure they fit properly on your tires and you know how to install them.
- Fill 'er up! Keep your gas tank full during snowy weather in case there are road delays.

CHAIN CONTROL RESTRICTION CATEGORIES:

Requirement One (R-1):

Chains, traction devices or snow tires are required on the drive axle of all vehicles except four-wheel/ all-wheel drive vehicles.

Requirement Two (R-2):

Chains or traction devices are required on all vehicles except four-wheel/all-wheel drive vehicles with snow-tread tires on all four wheels. (NOTE: Four-wheel/all-wheel drive vehicles must carry traction devices in chain control areas.)

Requirement Three (R-3):

Chains or traction devices are required on all vehicles, no exceptions.

Vehicles are required to carry tire chains or traction devices at all times.

Winter Driving Tips Countdown

- **5. Do not use cruise control.** If your car skids while using cruise control, it will accelerate and rapidly spin the wheels, and you will likely lose control.
- **4.** Avoid abrupt acceleration, braking and unnecessary lane changes. These maneuvers can cause your vehicle to lose traction and do not leave enough time for other drivers to react, which may cause an accident.
- **3.** Slow down and do not tailgate. Driving too quickly is the main cause of accidents in winter conditions. It takes a much longer distance to stop your vehicle in snow and ice due to reduced traction. Remember, the bigger the vehicle, the longer it takes to stop, regardless if it is 4WD.
- **2.** Be patient and allow extra time for travel. The speed limit is reduced to 25 mph in town and to 35 mph on the highway. Mentally prepare for this slower pace and give yourself 20 extra minutes to drive to your local destination, drop off passengers at the front door and park the car... without time crunch pressure. If you are traveling on the highway, double the amount of time you typically plan for travel.
- **1.** Nervous about driving in the snow? Park the car and ride the bus... for free! Buses leave at 15- to 30-minute intervals from more than 95 bus stops throughout town. See pages 146-148 for schedules and maps.



HISTORY OF MAMMOTH MOUNTAIN

In 1941, Dave McCoy began operating a rope tow at the base of Mammoth Mountain. It was a great location for snow, but a hard place for cars to access since the road wasn't plowed. McCoy solved this accessibility issue by buying several World War II surplus over-snow vehicles called Studebaker Weasels and driving people up the road, either inside the vehicles or towing them by rope.

By the late 1940s, the U.S. Forest Service was promoting development of ski resorts in California's Sierra Nevada Range. In 1952, they put Mammoth Mountain up for bid. After six months, they received exactly zero bids. Developers viewed Mammoth as being too risky —"Mammoth's elevation was too high, the mountain got too much snow and it was too far from a major population area." McCoy didn't have the money to make a bid. On the condition that he would develop a full-service ski resort, the Forest Service awarded the permit to Dave McCoy by default. He already had a thriving rope tow business and was hosting more skiers than any other California operation, including those with chairlifts. After building his first chairlift in 1955, McCoy went on to build one of the largest ski resorts in the country. He never imagined it would grow to be so large.



The ski area was purchased by Mammoth Mountain in 1986 and operations expanded with slope work and new lifts. June Mountain began allowing snowboarding in 1989 and hosted the original OP Pro (one of the first televised snowboarding competitions) in January of 1989.



ALTITUDE / WILDLIFE

ALTITUDE SICKNESS

Altitude sickness may be experienced at this altitude. In most cases, symptoms are mild but can become severe if not properly addressed. People over 60 and under 16 are more susceptible to altitude sickness.

To avoid altitude sickness acclimatize yourself prior to strenuous activities. Eat regularly, drink eight to ten glasses of water daily, and avoid drinking alcoholic beverages for the first 24 hours and get plenty of rest.

Mild-to-moderate symptoms include difficulty sleeping, light-headedness, fatigue, headache, loss of appetite, nausea, rapid heart rate and/or shortness of breath with exertion.

Severe symptoms include withdrawal from social interaction, inability to walk in a straight line or at all, shortness of breath at rest, discoloration of complexion, chest tightness, confusion, cough/coughing blood and/or decreased consciousness.

Experiencing severe symptoms? Call 911 for emergency medical care.

SUN EXPOSURE

At high altitudes, the sun intensity is 40-50 percent greater than at sea level. Use a minimum of 70 SPF on exposed skin and wear sunglasses or goggles to protect your eyes.

WEATHER

Mountain weather can be unpredictable, and it is not unusual to experience snow showers or thunderstorms in the late spring and early fall. Take heed when planning backcountry travel. When it snows, roads may close temporarily while they are being cleared.



KEEP WILDLIFE WILD

Wildlife is attracted to anything edible or smelly, including garbage, barbecues, compost piles, personal items (candles, makeup, etc.) and bird feeders.

We're in this together! Let's all do our part in keeping wildlife wild.

- Never feed any wildlife and do not leave pet food outside.
- Dispose of all garbage in bearresistant dumpsters and LOCK DUMPSTERS AT ALL TIMES.
- Remove all food, food containers, garbage, coolers and grocery bags (full or empty) from your car and truck bed.
- Keep ground windows and doors closed when away or at night.
- · Never leave food near a window.
- Keep barbecue grills and outdoor cooking areas clean and free of food remnants.
- Thoroughly clean your campsite before you go to bed or leave it unattended by storing any edible and "smelly" items (makeup, shampoo, deodorant, candles) in bear lockers provided and disposing of garbage in a dumpster (not your car).

Bears recognize items that represent food like grocery bags, coolers, packs and food containers. Empty or not, remove these items from cars when left unattended for any period of time. Even in the trunk of a car, wildlife can smell these items.

Coyotes may be seen roaming streets and parking lots. Do not feed them and keep your distance. Protect your pets by keeping them leashed.

TRAVELING WITH DOGS

THE FIDO FACTOR

Bringing the family dog on a vacation to the mountains can make your getaway feel complete. Everyone who owns a dog loves him, and may even consider him "one of the kids;" however, other visitors may not have the same feelings – and wildlife definitely doesn't share this point of view.

Here are six dog-etiquette tips to ensure that everyone enjoys this amazing mountain playground.

Manners count. Please don't impede on other travelers' experiences by bringing a noisy, aggressive or untrained dog. Only travel with well-behaved dogs and keep them close to you at all times.

Remember the leash! Leash rules can vary from one area to the next. As a rule of thumb, keep your dog leashed unless you've checked with the US Forest Service to see if the area where you are hiking is a leash-free zone.

Clean up. Keep trails and public spaces open to dogs by keeping them clear of dog feces. Always carry bags with you.

No pet food in the car. If camping,
you will need to secure dog food in food
lockers provided or in bear canisters. If staying in
a condo, bring the dog food inside to avoid "break-ins" by bears.

Don't chase that deer! Keep dogs close to you to avoid disturbing wildlife and do not let them chase wild animals.

Yield to horses. If encountering horses on the trail, you and your dog must yield. Leash dogs immediately and step to the downhill side of the trail.

CANNABIS "LEGALIZATION" in California FAQs for safety and usage

What does "legalization" mean?

The possession (up to one ounce of cannabis or eight grams of concentrated cannabis) and consumption of cannabis is legal for adults 21 or older within private residences or designated public spaces.

Where am I allowed to use cannabis?

Smoking or ingesting cannabis is only legal in private residences or designated public areas. The use of cannabis is prohibited on national public lands, so smoking or ingesting while hiking, biking, shing, snowboarding or camping on these lands is illegal.

Is my hotel or rented house or condo considered a private residence?

California has a no-smoking policy, which applies to the use of cannabis, for rented accommodations. Unless otherwise noted, you will be charged a cleaning fee if you smoke in a rented unit.

Can I possess cannabis on Mammoth Mountain?

No. Mammoth Mountain Ski Area is located on the Inyo National Forest. It is illegal to possess cannabis on National Forest land.

Where can I purchase cannabis?

As of January 2018, cannabis may be purchased at retail outlets licensed by the California Board of Cannabis Control. Green Mammoth (see page 90) is a licensed retailer for clients 21 years and older with valid government identification.

Can I take cannabis with me out of California?

No. Even if you are traveling to a state where cannabis is legal, crossing state lines while carrying cannabis is prohibited.

PROTECTING MINORS FROM CANNABIS USAGE

Anyone under 21 years of age is considered a minor under California cannabis legalization laws.

Children can feel the effects of cannabis more strongly than adults, and thus are at a higher risk of ingesting a toxic level of cannabis, especially from edibles.

The Food and Drug Administration and the State of California require edibles to be packaged and labeled as "cannabis-infused" and include the cannabis product symbol on the packaging.
