DABBLE DOWNTOWN

ENJOY BATON ROUGE WALKING TOURS

Whatever your interest: Art, History, Nature, Politics, Architecture or Culture – enjoy Baton Rouge up close and personal through a walking tour guided by a true local. See the sites and neighborhoods, hear the stories, and embrace the experience.

CAPITOL PARK MUSEUM

Step onto a Mardi Gras float or stand toe-to-toe with Huey P. Long. The eclectic exhibits at the Capitol Park Museum immerse visitors in the adventure-filled history of the Bayou State.

POOR BOY LLOYD'S RESTAURANT

The quaint, country decor and hearty portion sizes of Baton Rouge's beloved Poor Boy Lloyd's Restaurant—a staple restaurant owned and operated by a local family for over 50 years—will have you feeling right at home.

LOUISIANA'S "NEW" STATE CAPITOL

Pay a free visit to the State Capitol to get a glimpse of the Senate chambers and ride the elevator up to the observation deck of the nation's tallest capitol building.

MANSHIP THEATRE

From classic movie showings to theatre and musical performances, the Manship Theatre provides an entertainment line-up worth exploring.

MEANDER THROUGH MID CITY

MID CITY CULTURAL DISTRICT

A drive through the heart of Mid City unveils a charming urban tapestry of wall murals, colorful shops and revitalized spaces, now cherished as places to gather, create and play. Take your time exploring the eclectic mix of vintage treasure and architectural salvage yard at The Market at Circa 1857 before heading next door to the equally offbeat brunch spot Leola's Café & Coffee House. Other spots prime for perusing include Pop Shop Records, Pink Elephant Antiques and Time Warp vintage clothing shop.

MID CITY BEER GARDEN

Nestled among cascading, lush greenery in Mid City is a beer garden offering more than 60 beers on tap. Sample local flavors with a flight, enjoy game day on one of their big screens, host a gathering in their private event space, or enjoy the Baton Rouge weather on their large plant-filled open air patio.

ELECTRIC DEPOT

Gather at Electric Depot for an allin-one entertainment experience. Anchored by Red Stick Social complete with bowling, live music, bars and cuisine. Electric Depot houses a local coffee shop, green spaces, eateries, shops and local makers.

WANDER THROUGH WONDERS

MAGNOLIA MOUND

This 1790's French Creole house of vernacular architecture and museum hosts a collection of furnishings and decorative arts including one of the foremost public groups of Louisianamade objects, in carefully restored and documented settings. The historic house and museum offers costumed guides, open-hearth cooking demos and other interactive programming.

BLUEBONNET SWAMP NATURE CENTER

Walk the paths of a 65-acre cypresstupelo swamp filled with birds, foxes, turtles and alligators. Be sure to stop at the wildlife ecology exhibit for the chance to pet and hold the very creatures and critters inhabiting the landscape around you. For an immersive airboat experience, Cajun Pride Swamp Tours is just outside the area.

RURAL LIFE MUSEUM & WINDRUSH GARDENS

Majestic live oaks and ancient crepe myrtles stretch over the property's 32 historic buildings, including old slave cabins and a blacksmith shop.

BATON ROUGE BLACK HISTORY TRAIL

Explore your way through Baton Rouge's rich history, and learn about African Americans who contributed to a movement for equal rights and sparked change nationwide.





U.S.S. KIDD VETERANS MUSEUM

Retired WWII Fletcher-class destroyer, preserved in its 1945 configuration.

LOUISIANA OLD STATE CAPITOL

Museum of Political History that waits beyond the cast iron staircase, beneath the beautiful stained-glass cathedral dome.



LSU MUSEUM OF ART

Museum presenting world-class touring exhibitions of regional, American and European fine art alongside its permanent collection of 6500 objects ranging from Chinese Jade to renowned Louisiana art.

LOUISIANA ART & SCIENCE MUSEUM

Curation of fine art—from local communities to cultures around the world—plus state-of-the-art planetarium and renowned mummy exhibit.

BATON ROUGE GALLERY

Contemporary art gallery that offers monthly exhibitions featuring the work of current Artist Members, an extensive slate of cultural programming and special performances.

RED STICK SPICE CO. COOKING CLASSES

Hands-on exploration of South Louisiana's complex cuisine where attendees learn to perfect a roux, master maque choux and cook like a Cajun and/or Creole.

WEEKLY CONCERT SERIES

From Live After Five to Sunday in the Park, see performances ranging from legendary blues musicians to up-andcoming artists.


CAMPUS CALL-OUTS
